## "What have you done for me lately?"

There isn't a month goes by that I don't think about our recent initiatives and ask myself, do they focus on our aims and objectives. Do they forward the cause to enhance the art of philately? If you read about our work in the press and, for that matter our own *PhilaJournal*, there seems to be a preoccupation with STAMPEX, spreading the word about our efforts to revive it and the success the Alliance has generated in making it a great Show.

While the Board and its executive do spend a lot of time on this agenda, be assured that more time is spent on creating Alliance initiatives that focus on service, support and resource development for our member clubs. So what have we done lately to forward our goals as stated in the constitution? I would like to share with you, four such initiatives about which the Board is very excited:

• Several weeks ago we approached Harry Sutherland, chairman of the V. G. Greene Philatelic Research Foundation, to request the opportunity to have members of the Alliance clubs use the philatelic library of the Foundation. Most readers will not have had the opportunity to even visit Canada's finest philatelic library, let alone use it to do research into the history of Canada's postal system or to simply learn more about early Canadian stamps. An invitation to use the library was immediately given to the Alliance. We agreed to organize its usage and provide the necessary supervision that such a unique and valuable facility would require. We are now able to announce the results of our discussions at the Board, to the members of our seven clubs.

Initially, our members will be able to visit the library on the nights that the Board meets in the same offices. That would be the fourth Wednesday of each month, 7:00 to 9:30 p.m. John Laraway, an alternate Board member from the North Toronto Stamp Club and treasurer at West Toronto, has agreed to be our librarian, and will assist and supervise the member's use of the library resources. Arrangements can also be made through your club president, if any of our clubs wish to visit the library and have someone present a brief overview of the collection of resources available for you to use. You may know that the Foundation provides collectors with an expertizing service for the validation of Canadian philatelic and postal history items. Why not plan an evening at the Foundation to find out more about this specialized program. Depending on the response to this invitation, the hours of Alliance usage could be extended. We hope that in the months ahead, member clubs will be interested in visiting the library. You have a golden use a premier philatelic resource that very few Canadian opportunity to collectors are able to use first hand. We hope you will take advantage of this great opportunity.

• As many members are aware the *Grand River Valley Philatelic Association* has, for 10 years now, offered their clubs an opportunity to come together once a year, to share their sales circuit books.

SIP, composed of representatives of Canada Post Corporation, The Royal Philatelic Society of Canada, The Canadian Stamp Dealers Association, The Canadian Stamp News, The Postal History Society of Canada, The British North America Philatelic Society, The Grand River Valley Philatelic Association, and The Greater Toronto Area Philatelic Alliance, will meet six times a year including in the spring at the annual Royal Convention and Exhibition and in the fall at the annual STAMPEX in Toronto.

An invitation is being extended to representatives of Eastern and Western Canada as well as the Quebec regions to join SIP.

It was clear to all that Garfield's knowledge of this classic issue is extensive and he challenged us all to apply the concepts he presented to any definitive issue of any country. #### Canada Post Reaps Awards

Canadians can take pride in the fact that their postage stamps are recognized internationally. Three issues have been awarded top honours at international stamp design contests.



The Continental Cup for the most beautiful stamp in America, was awarded to the Lunar New Year stamp (Year of the Horse) issued on January 3, 2002. In addition to the Continental Cup, the stamp was also named the 3 rd place winner in the World's

Most Beautiful Stamp category. Namibia took he top honours followed by Singapore, Canada, Argentina and Luxembourg.



The 2002 St. <u>Gabriel</u> <u>International Award</u>, named after the saint nicknamed "the lord's postman", for *Best Religious Stamp* has been awarded to the World Youth Day stamp issued on July 23, 2002. The award, a sterling silver plaque depicting the Annunciation by sculptor Enrico Manfrini, is given to

postal authorities for stamp issues of intrinsic artistic value and great religious significance. For the first time ever, the 2002 award is being shared by two countries, Canada and Italy. The award was established in 1969 by the World Union of St. Gabriel, a worldwide association of collectors of religion on stamps.



Third place honours in the 2003 <u>Yehudi Menuhin Trophy</u> competition were awarded to Canada Post's stamp honouring the 100th anniversary of the Orchestre symphonique de

Québec, Canada's oldest active symphony orchestra. The stamp issued on November 7, 2002, shared the honour with a Finnish issue. First and second place honours were awarded to Brazil and Spain, respectively. The award is named in memory of Yehudi Menuhin, world famous violinist and conductor, who was Patron of the Philatelic Music Circle for 30 years.

#### Stakeholders in Philately (SIP)

Hosted by the GTAPA, the 4th SIP meeting took place on January 31, 2004 at 10 Summerhill, Toronto. The Group representing CPC, RPSC, CSDA, CSN, PHSC, BNAPS, GRVPA. GTAPA, and soon to be invited

regional representatives from the East, Quebec and West, has made a giant progress in promoting philately in Canada. The official committee structure is now in place who agreed on the mission "To ensure the health and well being of the hobby with emphasis on promotion, growth and development" and four primary goals:

- A To align all the stakeholders into an effective unit that works to achieve the mission.
- **B** To reach out to latent collectors who now have more time to pursue the hobby.
- **C** To introduce stamp collecting to new people.
- **D** To increase participation in clubs from collectors not currently active.

Based on these parameters, there are a number of projects underway. One of which is the SIP participation at the upcoming **Forever Young Show** to be held on April 30 and May 1, 2004 at the International Centre in Mississauga. There will be a staffed booth, philatelic displays and seminars on basic collecting, and a CPC autograph session. Don't miss it! It will be a great opportunity to convey and promote stamp collecting and ...we may attract some latent and future collectors to the hobby.

## **CLIPPINGS & COMMENTARY – 4**

#### No clippings this time.....just commentary from Peter Butler

In my last column, I closed with the promise that I would share with you the activities of two fine gentlemen, in my next C&C. The gentlemen's names are Garfield Portch and Jim Measures, and their stories of how they use commemorative stamps on all their outgoing mail is worthy of our emulation. Both of them are avid collectors, both of them ask there collector friends and colleagues, family members a neighbours, to always buy commemoratives, and both of them are unabashed Canadians, proud of their country and its history and culture. There is no better way to share their pride than to use large stamps on all their mail, not just to philatelists.

Garfield Portch by day, is an insurance broker. *PhilaJournal* readers know him as an Alliance Board member from the West Toronto club, who is responsible for the fine Club Challenge Award trophy that is awarded to the top club in the exhibitor's competition at *Stampex*. I know him as a great advocate for the hobby, whose infectious enthusiastic for everything philatelic is catching. He is also a valued friend and a collecting mentor to me.

Every day at the office, Garfield insists on doing the mail. He checks for good cancellations, unusual postal system markings and, of course, commemoratives. He also takes on the job of putting large stamps on most of the outgoing mail. Over the years, he had trained many of his clients. He uses commemoratives and so do they. For those who are philatelists, and there are a considerable number, he takes the envelopes to the post office personally and is allowed by the postal clerk, to cancel the stamps with a unique Etobicoke hand cancel. Garfield always has a shoebox full of covers to show any interested callers at the office, and he always has an envelope full of commemoratives ready to do the day's mail. His stories of the special covers that he has received from clients and sent to them in return, are heart-warming for they come from a man who truly loves his hobby, the people he shares it with, and the telling of the tales. Garfield Portch is the very best ambassador the hobby could have.

Jim Measures will be a name that very few in our organization will recognize. He is an outsider to the Alliance, but very much an insider for his practices as a

stamp collector and a club member. I have only spoken with him briefly on a few occasions, all around the ROYAL\*2003\*ROYALE show in Hanover. Plans were, at the national show last May, to have resource people from the United States who run Stamp Camp programs at most major shows across the USA, to come to Hanover to offer the same program for the youth of Hanover. You will recall the SARS scare well before the show, but the US authorities, at the last minute decided that their postal service employees, the ones to run the Stamp Camp, could not cross the border. The Saugeen Stamp Club, organizers of the show, was left in the lurch. Jim stepped up, agreed to take over the program, and created a great stamp camp program of his own. Few people knew of the switch in plans. Those who did, praised Jim's great work with the children. That tells a bundle of the kind of person Jim Measures is. Now for the work he does with his club and the reason why I was so pleased to make his acquaintance.

Jim is the editor of the Saugeen stamp Club's newsletter and he publishes it monthly. The newsletter is mailed out to all 55 members, always with the latest commemorative stamp. But that is not all. The post office from which he mails the newsletter is different each time. The post office must have a fancy or pictorial hand cancellation, and Jim literally goes to the ends of the earth to find the right post offices. To date, he has used post offices in 8 states south of the border, all Canadian provinces and territories and 12 other countries. To begin the new season last September, he sent off a bundle of newsletters to the oldest post office in the world, in Scotland. He had corresponded with the postmaster requesting the service and the postmaster was only too pleased to oblige. Jim obviously wears his love of philately on his sleeve for all to see. There is no more pleasure for him than serving his stamp collecting colleagues and friends, and that is why I wanted to share his story with our readers.



"If you have any envelopes in your truck, would you save the stamp for me?"

Let us all take heart from the practices of these two gentlemen of philately. Remember your responsibilities as a stamp collector. Use commemoratives always. Try as often as possible to create good postal covers. If you don't, who will? Just think. The cover you send tomorrow might just end up in a collector's exhibit 100 years from now, in a show called *Marsex 2104*, the very first philatelic show on the newly colonized planet.

#### Why Exhibit? Why Not!

**EXHIBITING** 

Why on earth would you want to do that?" seemed to be the universal cry of my stamp buddies when, back in the '70s, I announced my intentions of exhibiting one of my collections. I could not come up with a good answer to that question all those years ago, but I can now - because it is fun. In fact, it is so much fun that I keep expecting the government to make it illegal!

We exhibitors, I suppose, become tiresome in our enthusiasm for this "sport", but it is so enjoyable and enriching that we want everyone to experience it. Here are some reasons why.

#### **Exhibiting is creative**

I will not deny hinging stamps on pre-printed album pages is fun, but it is not terribly creative. Mounting stamps on pages you designed in a layout you composed to tell a story you wrote is considerably more satisfying. It is a great way to exercise your creativity - you get to be the master of your own little philatelic universe.

#### **Exhibiting builds skills**

Anyone who has put together an exhibit has learned organizational skills. In searching for pleasing arrangements of material on the pages, you develop basic design and layout techniques. By writing the description for each page in an exhibit, you sharpen writing and editing skills. In verifying facts, you hone research skills. Some exhibitors now using personal computers to prepare exhibits have become crackerjack hacks. All of these skills come almost effortlessly to you as you become more involved with exhibit-making.

#### Exhibiting helps build your collection

The exhibiting community as a whole is a most helpful group of people. When you show your treasures a few times, others begin to know what you collect. Your opportunities to acquire new material are multiplied as they, too, help look for items you need. Additionally, experienced exhibitors willingly share knowledge and advice with beginners.

#### Exhibiting makes you a better collector

You learn more about our wonderful hobby in your quest to build the best exhibit you can. You master the

techniques of selecting the best material possible, getting more "bang for your buck". You discover how to differentiate between genuine and fake. You unearth forgotten or unknown facts about stamps and postal history. The best part of all is that you share all this with people who appreciate it the most.

#### Exhibiting is a great way to give something back to the hobby

Exhibiting is an outlet for every stamp collector to become a teacher. This is your chance to explain visually complicated stamps and themes to other collectors. Whether you share your knowledge of a complex subject or simply your joy in what you collect, you are returning some of the pleasure you have gained from your involvement with philately.

#### Exhibiting affords opportunity for social interaction

Exhibitors are friendly folks. As a new exhibitor, you bump into fellow exhibitors at shows, critiques, and award banquets. In no time at all, you find you have developed lasting friendships. It is a great way to meet folks from all walks of life. Do not be misled by malcontents who cynically shriek that exhibiting is an "old-boy network". It is not true. Try it. You will be welcomed to the fold with open arms.

Have 1 convinced you? Why not begin by putting together your own exhibit? Start small. Enter your local show with a One-frame of your favourite material. Then, after you have given it your best shot and gained all the aforementioned benefits, should you happen to be fortunate to win an award, consider that icing on the cake.

## 50 YEARS AGO

by Garfield Portch

January 1954 was the first of the new monthly issue of the Canadian Philatelist. The lead article by F. Walker dealt with Canadian Coil Stamps with Faulty Alignment.

A full membership list was published and included a strong representation from the Toronto area including such names as Fred Jarrett, Les Davenport, Everett Drake, Harold Gosney, Murray Heifetz, Richard Lamb, Michael Madesker, Wm. Maresch, Harry Martin Jr, Douglas Patrick, Max Rosenthal, Jim Sissons, George Wegg, and many others.

In February, Hans Reiche announced the start of a new edition of Constant Plate Varieties.

The March issue featured an item by Robert Lyman in which he lamented the fact that very few Canadian collectors show an interest beyond the stamps of British North America. His argument was continued by Tom Morgan who wrote "It is about time this class distinction was cut out of stamp collecting. The backbone of the hobby is composed of those who collect modern stamps."

Included in the advertisements was one by J.N. Sissons offering the new 1954 Catalogue of BNA for  $10 \notin$  - refundable on an order of \$2 or more!

BNA Topics opened with the conclusion of Edward Whiting's series on Canadian Coil Stamps. Included is a

checklist of coil issues. The Postal History column presented a list of rarities in the 1840's (*wow!!*). The Perfin Study Group of BNAPS was announced with Dr. Jephcott as chairman. There was also a fascinating item on collecting stampless covers. (*The information is still* valid today).

February brought a continuation of the huge technical series about perforations on Newfoundland stamps. Max Rosenthal presented an essay "Philately in Canada in the 1890's." Some quotations (out of context) were: "The whole civilized world once looked upon stamp collecting as a crazy schoolboy whim."

"In October 1892, the 53rd edition of Scott's Catalogue had been announced. The price was advanced to 50 cents."

In March, Norman Hill wrote about the Canadian Royal Tour of 1951 complete with a schedule for the Train Post Office and drawings of the cancellations.

Wm. Jackson presented an interesting article on the economics of a stamp dealer. He discussed his cost of providing material in relation to the collectors' expectation of purchase price.

An examination of stamp production procedures explains how an attractive piece of art produced by Emanuel Hahn was made into an unattractive stamp.

Robert Lyman announced his new BNA List as "well illustrated and new treatment of classic issues,  $25\phi$ , deductible on the first \$2 order."



## **Philafacts**

#### **First Stamp Dealer**

M. Jeanne Baptiste Philippe Constant Moens (1833-1908) started collecting stamps at the age of fifteen commencing trading in stamps and became the world's first stamp dealer in 1852. He is known simply as J. B. Moens and traded under that name.

In 1862 he published the "Manuel du Collectionneur de timbre-poste", and followed this up in February 1863 with the philatelic journal, "Le Timbre-Poste", which ran without missing an issue for 38 years.

Moens died in Brussels on April 29, 1908 after a long illness.

#### **First Philatelic Journal**

The Monthly Advertiser, an eight page journal, made its first appearance on December 15, 1862. The second issue, it changed its name to The Stamp-Collectors' Monthly Advertiser when it appeared in January 1863.

The third month, it changed its name again to *The Stamp-Collectors' Review and Monthly Advertiser*. It ceased publication after its nineteenth number on June 15, 1864.


## **Clothesline - Not Just for Laundry**
