

Santa Claus Parade is 100 years old

We all know he's coming to town, but the question is how will he arrive? Driving a traditional sled, or conducting a vintage train? Or perhaps at the wheel of a flashy convertible?


The guest of honour has made his grand entrance in all these vehicles over the years at Toronto's venerable Santa Claus Parade. This year, as this well-loved event marks its 100th consecutive parade, Canada Post has issued its annual set of three Christmas stamps in honour of jolly old Saint Nick.

The man in red is the main attraction, after all, not only on these stamps but also in parades across the country each year. The Toronto event celebrates 100 consecutive years in 2004, which makes it the longest-running Santa Claus parade in the world.

In 1905, a few hundred people came to see Santa arrive by train at Toronto's Union Station, then make his way to the downtown Eaton's department store. This first parade was a success, and Eaton's, its sponsor, made it an annual event. Over the years, it grew ever larger and more elaborate. In 1913, Santa arrived in a sleigh drawn by four live reindeer from Labrador. By 1917, he was joined by the first floats, which were decorated in fairy tale and nursery rhyme themes. Beginning in 1925, the parade became a traveling show, with floats and costumes sent by train to Montreal for its parade a week later.

By the 1950s, Toronto had the largest Santa Claus parade in North America. It often stretched over a mile and a half in length, and was televised across Canada and in the United States. Eaton's continued to finance the entire production each year, making all the costumes and building the floats.

Given the ongoing costs, Eaton's finally withdrew its sponsorship of the parade in 1982. Since then, it has been successfully funded by private sponsors. One afternoon each November, floats, clowns, and marching bands parade along a six-kilometre route through the city. The show isn't over until Santa himself appears, but just how he'll arrive in this 100th parade is anyone's guess.



The STAMPEX Planning Committee gave a brief report to the Alliance Board at its October meeting. He said that all indications were that the show was another great success and financially, will end in the black. All Alliance clubs were represented in the workforce over the three days, and club presidents were given certificates to present to those members who helped out, at one of the club's November meetings. We believe the docent program is a very important part of our effort to help beginning collectors and exhibitors become knowledgeable about exhibiting.
- Our first attempt at an appraisal service met with limited success. There were 19 people who showed up at 1:00 p.m. to obtain information about what to do with collections in their possession. This service will need to be expanded in the future for it is an important service we should be providing members of the community.
- And finally... congratulations go out to the Bramalea Stamp Club who were this year's winners of the Club Challenge Award. Club members Bob Thorne, Ingo Nessel and Jerry Pietrowski were worthy winners indeed for their fine one-frame exhibits. The "Stamp Collector" trophy is theirs for the year, until the next competition at STAMPEX '05





Toronto Stamp Collectors Club Joins the Alliance



At the funeral service, Reverend Ravi Kalison asked the congregation for words of thanksgiving for Dorothy's life. Many spoke of her dedicated work in St Bede's Anglican Church. She possessed a wonderful mixture of forthrightness and kindness. "She was strict on principles and strong in love," one admirer said. Another suggested that once past the crusty side, she had a heart of gold. "And whatever the church needed at any social function. Dorothy always had it in the truck of her car!"

Reverend Kalison closed his address with the proclamation, "She had kept the church well maintained, she was a treasured chorister and she was deeply involved with the community. Well done thy good and faithful servant."

I sat with Doug Cockburn of the East Toronto Stamp Club who was a pallbearer, and we both agreed that next to her church, her stamp club was the other love of her life. Dorothy also proposed that the club's old trophies could be given to the Alliance, to be rejuvenated for STAMPEX use in at future exhibitions. 

clubs may try to have a go at it themselves. The purpose is to assemble a One-page exhibit to

encourage individual stamp collectors to show others what they collect and perhaps be an incentive to become regular exhibitors.

Basic guidelines

- Exhibits shall consist of One-page 8.5" x 11" size. The page should be white or light pastel colour to mount postage stamps and/or any other postal material.
- As an alternative, a collector may choose a combination of postal and non-postal material to create a One-page "Display" providing that the nonpostal items do not overwhelm the postal material.
- Choose one of your favourite subjects, a country, or a personality, etc. and arrange the material for presentation.

Basic rules

The One-page exhibit is to contain the following:

- 1. A Title A short one.
- 2. A Statement Provide a few words describing what you are attempting to do.
- 3. Selection of Material In addition to stamps the presence of other philatelic elements will enhance the exhibit.
- 5. Presentation The exhibit should be neat, clean and attract attention to the material
- Creativity An unusual approach in developing a subject or reflects a new or unusual subject.

Great News!!

As we go to press, we have the results of the West Toronto "Single Page Exhibition." The results were astounding and gratifying for the Study Group organizers.

• Attendance at the Study Group is normally 20 to 22. The Exhibition attracted 33 attendees (from a total membership of 67 = 50%).

• There were 21 exhibits (would have been 23 but the two judges did not enter any).

Awards were: 3 gold, 13 silver, and 5 bronze.
 George MacLean was judged the overall winner and

- Ernie French, while describing his entry, announced that this was the first time he had ever shown anything in 70 years of collecting stamps.
- A short judging critique/seminar filled the rest of the evening.

When all was said and done, the Exhibition proved to be a success. The numbers support the high level of participation. Members expressed their support of the event and declared that it was Fun, Informative, and Entertaining. We recommend that all clubs take a shot at similar events. This will likely be a formalized competition for all member clubs in the GTAPA. []

50 YEARS AGO

Garfield Portch

The new "Postage Stamps" book issued by the U.S.A. Post Office featured the following statement by A. E. Summerfield (PMG) in the forward:

"The postage stamps of a nation are a picture gallery of its glories. They depict in miniature its famous men, the great events of its history, its natural wonders.

Because of this, philately has a distinct educational value. No one can pursue this hobby intelligently without developing a greater knowledge of his national heritage."

In the November, 1954 issue of the Canadian Philatelist, the West Toronto Stamp Club was thanked for donating its entire library to the Canadian Philatelic Society.

Hurricane Hazel flooded the shop of the printer who was in the process of binding the Canadian Philatelist which needed to be reprinted due to the water damage.

For those interested in Canadian coil stamps, there is a technical explanation of the reason for faulty alignment of coil stamps. The article is reprinted elsewhere in this journal.

The last article published in The Canadian Philatelist in 1954 was a defense of Thematic Collecting. This item is also worthy of a reprint in view of the recent beginning of a thematic study group within the GTAPA.

Hans Reiche, in the July-August issue of BNA Topics presented his first attempt to classify the cancellations on the Admiral Issue. For anybody considering working that field, it is an article that should be visited.

The Perfin Study Group of BNAPS gives a recommendation for a collection with a real challenge – Canadian Perfins used on cover!

For the Air Mail collectors in our midst, the November Topics begins a series on the Trans Canada Air Lines by J.S. Gordon.

BACK TO THE PRESENT

Bob Thorne, President of the Bramalea Stamp Club deserves congratulations for the completion of his huge checklist of Canadian machine cancellations.

As I understand, only two copies of this work exist in a bound form -one is in Bob's possession while the other resides in the library of the Vincent Greene Foundation.

TED'S TUBS

Garfield Portch

Early this year I was asked to assist in the disposal of a large philatelic holding on behalf of Ted Allen, the last President of the Etobicoke Philatelic Society.

Included in the accumulation was an enormous holding of modern Canadian used stamps. In realizing that there was no significant commercial value to this material, I asked permission to put the stamps, unsorted, into plastic tubs to be taken to stamp shows. The idea was that anybody could take any stamps needed for beginning a collection or filling holes in an existing collection. The only form of payment was to be a donation to a fund to be used for the promotion of youth philately.

I took the tubs to the 50+ show, the GRVPA / GTAPA gathering in Bramalea and to STAMPEX. Additionally, the tubs have been "borrowed" by members of the West Toronto Club and other GTAPA associates.

The results have been astounding! At the end of October, the proceeds of the donations have passed \$250 and we still have 50 litres of stamps remaining.

The tubs have also been taken to an after school program where I have been invited to start a stamp club for kids. We have 14 new collectors, each of whom was encouraged to start a thematic collection rather than a traditional "country" collection.

Based on the outstanding (and unexpected) success of Ted's Tubs, I now challenge each club in the GTAPA to start a local chapter of Ted's Tubs. It is a great way to get rid of those piles of modern duplicates; it is a great way to get new collectors started; it is a great way to raise some funds; and it is a great tribute to the generosity of Ted Allen.

The GTAPA has awarded a Certificate of Merit to Ted Allen for his outstanding contribution to Philately in Toronto.






