Summertime Doesn't Mean We Aren't Trading Stamps!

This past week our Oshawa Stamp Enthusiasts hosted guests from both Cobourg and Trenton. Our group has been including 30 to 35 people regularly gathering to actively trade and or buy stamps. When **Larry Friend** and I began to promote an Oshawa group, a year ago last June, we set out to encourage active trading at very reasonable prices and our members regularly bring lots of stamps for trades at 5ϕ and 10ϕ each with only the most valuable stamps selling at higher prices — and even then mostly at a third to a maximum of half of the catalogue values.

It seems clear that our participants really are looking at both active trading and keeping this an inexpensive hobby. With lots of fellowship and enjoyable gatherings we are bringing people back regularly. Our numbers grew steadily from the very beginning and have never slackened off.

We are planning ahead for our second auction day to be held on Saturday October 27^{th.} Viewing 10am to 12:30 - Auction starting at 1pm. Cash Only – No fees or taxes to Members.

Our regular meetings and the auctions are held at Legends Community Centre Senior's Centre Section, in the extreme North East section of Oshawa – 1661 Harmony Rd North. Regular Meetings are Fridays from 10:15 to 12:15 for Aug then returning to 11am to 1pm in September. One advantage of the location is that the Oshawa Seniors Centre also has a lunchroom area immediately adjacent to our meeting area so we can enjoy coffee or tea breaks or have a full lunch while we are attending the Stamp Enthusiast group.

Starting the first week of September the Whitby Stamp Enthusiasts group will resume meeting at the Whitby Seniors Centre on Brock St. S. just North of Hwy 401.

Our second Oshawa group will resume meetings on Tuesdays at the Northview Community Centre 150 Beatrice St. E. Oshawa from 1:15 to 3:15 Members are asked to belong to the local Seniors Centre – Oshawa Seniors membership fee (55 & older) is \$10 regardless of residency. Whitby Senior's fee is \$16. for Whitby Residents and \$32. for non residents.

Since our Oshawa group still meets regularly every Friday morning there's still time this summer for other groups to make a visit and see what is working in our area at least. We always welcome visitors.





We are pleased to announce that the awards will be displayed in the library of the Vincent Graves Greene Foundation along with those of some of his friends – Vincent Greene, Harry Sutherland and Ken Rowe, to name a few.

Included in the scrapbooks were numerous certificates and ribbons earned by Mr. Dube at the North Toronto Stamp Club annual competitions.

Suffice to say, the presentation precipitated some very interesting trips down memory lane from some of our members who knew Herbert Dube.

In the short business meeting following, one of the PSS members, **Murray Heifetz** presented a copy of his latest publication on Canadian Airmail to the PSS as an addition to the Harry Sutherland Library. Coincidentally, Murray was awarded the Herbert Dube Award in 2004 for the first edition of this book.

The main course of the evening was the Show & Tell session. As is always the case, about a dozen presentations were made, each absolutely fascinating in its own way. Most of the displays were being shown not only to inform the group, but also to solicit information from the gathering. To my absolute amazement, almost every question asked by a presenter was answered from the floor. 



UKRAINPEX 2007, TORONTO

Fully five different commemorative covers were available during Ukrainpex 2007. Four being identical to the above pre-stamped cover in every way except for the stamp design itself, where the other three show other types of native Canadian flowers.

On the weekend of June 16, 2007, the Ukrainian Collectibles Society, Toronto (UCST) hosted a show that featured stamps, postal history, coins, documents, cards and other collectibles related to Ukraine and diaspora.

Taking place at the KUMF Ukrainian Art Gallery, the theme of the show featured the 90th anniversary of the "First All-Ukrainian Military Congress" held in May 1917in Kyiv and chaired by Symon Petliura. Thus, what you see on the cover above is Petliura along with his military medallion namesake.

With over fifty frames of exhibited material, the show was honoured by being officially opened by the Ukrainian Consul-General to Canada, **Mr. Oleksandr Danyleiko**.

Two prominent international philatelic judges – Frank Alusio and Andrew Cronin – undertook the evaluation and grading of the competitive exhibits on Saturday morning. The results of the judging are as follows:

Ukraine in Old Postcards; Borys Zayachivsky

BRONZE

- Chernobyl's Tragedy, 1986; Jaroslaw Zastawny

In addition to ten competitive exhibits, there were sixteen non-competitive presentations such as those of banknotes, coins, sports cards, posters and newspapers, medals and pins, and more, all of which demonstrated how diverse our heritage has been. An oft' heard comment was "I didn't' know just how much Ukraine produced for such a short

period of time" referring to the classic era of 1918 to 1920 and the modern era of 1992 and on.

Our guests and fellow UPNS participants from the USA were both gracious and wonderful. As a group effort, this show was an incredible learning experience for me on so many levels, and, in fact, I am quite proud of having been involved.

The most fascinating Ukrainpex-2007 exhibit for me included Kuzych's complete set of 'Fieldpost Issues' along with the lone surviving single overprinted 20-Hryven 'Hetmanate State' issue. Only fifteen were overprinted, but only one other is known on cover! Fortunately, Kuzych is quite certain that his unique set will never be broken up.

UPNS GENERAL MEETING

On Saturday afternoon, **Ingert Kuzych** convened a meeting for all those UPNS members in attendance. Following a roll call, Kuzych completed a review of the UPNS's achievements over the past year citing the following notables: -a publication by **Andrew Solczanyk** called *Chrisitanity in Ukraine: A Philatelic Survey*, as well as other notable publications. Awards for 2006

- Kotyk Award for the Best Article: The Stanyslaviv Issues Re-Examined, by Ingert Kuzych
- Maksymczuk Award for Services to Philately: the Ukrainian Collectibles Society, Toronto, accepted by President Jerry Kalyn
- -Narbut Prize for the Best Stamp or Souvenir Sheet: yet to be determined as the UPNS is still accepting nominations

Amongst other details was an announcement by Ingert Kuzych: "Since joining the UPNS in 1984, I have served as editor for eleven years, Executive VP for four years and President for eight years. I've done pretty much everything there is to do in Ukrainian philately, and am now eager to explore other fields, especially Austrian philately, since I am half Austrian." In this fashion, Kuzych announced his intention to relinquish his post at the end of the current four-year term.

Few have served our society with as much honour and distinction. It goes without question that Kuzych can already be placed right up there with all the greats of Ukrainian philately, if only for his work ethic, let alone the other reasons. The website he created, the myriad of well-researched and interesting articles he has authored (and, no doubt, will continue to author), sponsoring the

Narbut prize, and so on. All of these acts of contribution out of his personal time speaks volumes to his passion and ours – Austrian philatelic societies watch out, you're about to have a tiger on your hands!

FESTIVITIES

On Saturday evening, many of us attended the show's banquet at the Golden Lion Restaurant (very traditional), affording us all the opportunity to get to know each other outside of the formal setting. The truth be known though, and oddly enough, the festivities actually started Friday evening at the hotel reserved for out-of-town guests. The author ventured to the hotel and joined our guests for one or two cups of tea!



of the UNR's 'Vienna Definitive Set-of-14', the Symon-Petliura-40-Hyyven stamp.


The exhibition's show-cancel was applied upon all affixed stamps, and the envelope was then addressed and properly mailed.



A Vietnamese Refugee Cover from Ban Thad Camp

This piece of Thai postal history from 1988 helps tell a bit of the story of the Vietnamese living in Ban Thad Refugee Camp, along the Thai-Cambodian border. This pretty illustrated cover, addressed to Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam, features a sailing ship and 5 hearts and has some very interesting postal markings. These include a *Task Force 80 Thailand* hand stamp in red, another red hand stamp reading *Thu Lao Vu 100* and an Aranyaprathet (Thailand) cds dated 22/ 10/?? tying a 10 Baht King Bhumibol Adulyadej definitive (Scott #1090) and 5 Baht Centenary of the Sriraj Hospital featuring a painting of King Rama V, its founder (#1222). The back of the cover has a Ho Chi Minh City receiving mark dated 1/11/88.

A Vietnamese minority has lived in Thailand since at least the eighteenth century, according to Poole (1970) (1). For example, in the province of Chanthaburi, a Catholic congregation of Vietnamese was founded in 1707, and by the start of the nineteenth century, several thousand Vietnamese lived in Southeastern Thailand. Two huge influxes of Vietnamese refugees occurred between 1946 and 1948, during the French-Viet Minh War, and again from 1975 to 1980, following the fall of Saigon to the Communist North Vietnamese. The refugees in Ban Thad were part of the millions who fled Laos, Cambodia, and

Vietnam and came to be known, collectively, as the Boat People.

Most of the 72 refugee camps or refugee processing centres which operated at different times between 1975 and 1999 along the Thai-Cambodian border housed mainly Cambodians or Lao, but Ban Thad Camp was one of the few which housed Vietnamese refugees, and it was run under the auspices of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees and not the Thai government.

The refugees in Ban Thad Camp, again unlike most others, were not Boat People. Instead, as Vo (2005), writes:

The Vietnamese interned in these [border] areas came overland through Cambodia: they were known as "Platform Vietnamese." During their journey, they suffered a lot in the hands of the North Vietnamese patrols stationed in Cambodia, the Khmer Rouge, and the Cambodian soldiers and bandits who controlled part of the country. They had to walk through mined areas along the Cambodian border before arriving in Thailand. Only 10 percent survived the horrendous land trip. (p.156) (2)

In February, 1988, following an upsurge in the number of boat arrivals, the Vietnamese were

transferred from Khao I Dhang , North West 9, and Northwest 82 Camps to Ban Thad and Site two camps. The latter they shared with Cambodians. (Vo, 2005)

Even in the camps, however, refugees were not safe from violence. They were robbed, kidnapped, raped, and murdered by thieves and soldiers. In fact, Task Force 80, the paramilitary security patrol whose hand stamp graces the cover, which was charged with protecting civilians Indochinese camps, was withdrawn from the border area by the Thai government in August 1988, after the Task Force was accused of human rights violations by the refugees (3). (This leads me to wonder whether this cover, cds October 22, 1988, had been sold pre-stamped, or whether the hand stamp was applied after-the-fact, for philatelic reasons.)

The *Thu Lao Vu 100* hand stamp also offers an interesting sidebar of information. It, as well as another hand stamp reading *Phat Namh 10* [or *100*] was applied to covers entering Vietnam. A rough translation of both is "Delivery Fee" and these fees varied from 10 to 100 Dong. Joe Cartafalsa, an expert on Vietnamese philately and a columnist for *Global Stamp News*, was kind enough to send me some information about these hand stamps, via Ellen Peachey, the hardworking and absolutely reliable Library Services Coordinator of the American Philatelic Society. Of these hand stamps, Mr. Cartafalsa writes.

They were originally called "capitalist fees" cause they always seemed to be from Western type nations but they were later found on incoming mail from Communist nations. Back in the late 1970s and 80s the mailmen were very underpaid and would solicit tips from people getting mail to give good service. The post office instituted these fees to create a fund to pay mailmen more. It had nothing to do with refugee mail - but there was a lot of incoming refugee mail from western nations starting in 1976.(4)

The Banh Thad Camp was closed by the UNHCR in 1990, but it seems that about 1,000 of the Vietnamese refugees who had been housed there were living in Section 19, Site 2, along with 200,000 Cambodians, in 1992 (5).

While the story of the Indochinese refugees of the 1970s and 80s is a sad one, by 1979, the United States, France, Australia and Canada were beginning to open their doors to them. In fact, in that year, Canada accepted over 60,000

Vietnamese, Cambodian and Laotian refugees. (6) Tens of thousands more followed.

UNUSUAL POSTAGE STAMPS

I suppose it should not be a great surprise that someone would see a "two for one" opportunity in the issuing of a stamp that could also be sold to collectors of baseball cards. In fact two countries did just that. In August 1992 St Vincent issued a set of 12 stamps (Scott 1693-1704) honouring some of the baseball greats of the past. The stamps were produced as individual self-adhesive imperforates on thin card. Each stamp measured 64 x 89 cm had a removable backing printed with the players statistics. In 1995 Guyana issued a similar item (Scott 2943a-I). These stamps were also printed as self-adhesive imperforates on thin card. Each one featured Hall of Famer Nolan Ryan in the uniforms of the four major league teams he played for, New York Mets, California Angels, Houston Astros and Texas Rangers.

Here are 2 stampless folded letters that would seem to be very similar at first glance. However, this is definitely not the case. Crown circle handstamps are quite scarce to rare and are one of the only handstamps Stanley Gibbons list in their stamp catalogue. A common use of this handstamp in my 1992 Stanley Gibbons (yes, I know I should buy a new catalogue) is $\mathfrak{L}1000$ on envelope





The first letter was posted in Amherst Nova Scotia on August 14 1847 and has the "AMHERST AU 14 1847 N.S." large split ring in red. As there were no postage stamps in 1847, the "PAID AT AMHERST. N.S." crown circle handstamp in red was applied to show that the 11 1/2 pence rate to the border of Canada/US was paid in cash. When it arrived at the American exchange office, the clerk wrote "10" (cents American) in black manuscript to show that the rate from the exchange office to Hartford Connecticut was not paid (it would have been collected from the recipient in Hartford) and crossed the "PAID" portion of the crown handstamp so there was no confusion about which amount was paid and unpaid. Crown circle handstamps are quite rare on cross border letters and this cover shows a most unusual paid/unpaid usage....the first one I have ever seen.

The second folded letter was posted on July 1 1854 (Canada Day, but about 13 years too early) with an "Amherst JY 1 1854 N.S." large split ring cancel on the back in black. On the front of the folded letter is a "PAID AT AMHERST. N.S." crowned circle handstamp in red. This is where the similarities end with the 2 letters. In 1854, postage stamps were available for use and were normally used to prepay postage and thus the crown circle handstamp was not used...... except...... when they ran out of postage stamps (note in Stanley Gibbons). What is most interesting about this letter is that this crown circle handstamp signifies not only the payment of the 3 pence postage ("3" in manuscript), but also the 6 pence ("6" in manuscript) registration fee to Truro, Nova Scotia. This is only the second known use of the crown circle paying both regular postage and registration fee.

Both usages are rare and both are of exhibition quality. The pair of covers is available for \$4500.00.
