

#### A Short Introduction To Pneumatic Mail

The year1853 saw the installation of a pneumatic tube system designed to speed the dispatch of telegrams between the London Stock Exchange and the nearby Central Station of the Electric Telegraph Company. It was not long before postal authorities began installing similar systems for the transport of mail between branches.

The installations consisted of a system of underground tubes linking area Post Offices. The tubes ranged in diameter from 3 inches to as much as 36 inches in the case of the connection between the main post office at Camden Town and the Euston Square railway station in London. Mail was placed into cylinders and propelled to its destination using either compressed air or a vacuum system.

U.S. cities that used such pneumatic mail transportation systems included Boston, Philadelphia, Chicago, St. Louis and New York City where the system operated until 1953. Some European operations lasted even longer. Vienna operated until 1956, Berlin till 1976, Paris till 1984 and Prague where parts were still in use as late as 2002 until severe flooding of the system caused it to be mothballed indefinitely.

Mail from many pneumatic mail systems bears no special markings to indicate that the item was ever transmitted that way. However some postal administrations provided preprinted postal stationery for use in their systems.

The Berlin pneumatic mail system called Rohrpost, (literally "Pipe post"), issued both special envelopes and postal cards. As the mail was sorted a destination office number would be hand written on the item before it was placed into a cylinders for routing to the appropriate destination office. At the receiving office the item would be struck with a receiving handstamp that had the same number.

Vienna, Austria prepared postal cards for use in their system. These cards were marked "Korrespondenz-Karte zur pneumatischen Expressbeförderung (Correspondence card for pneumatic express delivery). As in the case of the Berlin pneumatic mail, handwritten destination and handstamped receiving office numbers are seen on these items.

The Paris system had the most variety of preprinted stationery items over the course of its operations, including items marked Carte Pneumatique, Carte Télégramme, Télégramme and Enveloppe Pneumatique. Again most items show manuscript destination numbers and handstamped receiving information.

In Italy special postage stamps marked "Posta Pneumatica" were issued for use on mail sent through the tube system. A total of 22 Posta Pneumatica stamps were issued between 1913 and 1966.



Although no longer used by postal authorities for moving items of mail, pneumatic systems are still used by businesses and institutions such as hospitals for delivering internal paperwork and other items quickly and efficiently between departments.



#### Seek and Ye Shall Find

As a regular purchaser of Gibbons Stamp Monthly, I had seen this item before – in the September issue! Imagine, then, my surprise when it turned up in a dealer's box at the recent North Toronto bourse, priced at 50% off as the show was about to close...



I enjoy accumulating the philatelic evidence of the Antarctic regions, and knew of the existence of Marion Island, but had never previously had anything sent from it. Unsurprising – because it is one of the most remote and untenanted places on Earth. It has been known since 1663, but was never claimed by any nation, lying as it does some 1700 km. south and a little east of Port Elizabeth. It was used by sealers and a vague suzerainty was claimed by Britain, which offered a guano lease in 1908 and a whaling license in 1926 to entrepreneurs.

However, in 1947 the South African government made a formal claim to both Marion Island, and its neighbor Prince Edward Island, by sending the HMSAS Transvaal to raise the flag. The landing was made on December 29, 1947 and the ship left shortly thereafter. Sister ships Natal and Gentoos brought labourers and supplies and a research station was constructed. The philatelic story begins on January 28, 1948, when the base was first manned by a party brought to Marion Island by the HMSAS *Cape of Good Hope*. The team sent to man the base consisted of six Tristan Islanders inured, it was hoped, to the depressing rain and cold of the island - and in charge was Allan Crawford, the meteorologist who was responsible for the famous "potato stamps" of Tristan, and a principal agitator for Tristan to have its own stamps.

Crawford brought a cachet, and having been formally appointed Acting Postmaster, he applied it to a few items sent on the return voyage. More substantial mails were sent out eight more times in 1948, each item receiving the cachet plus a small date-stamp beneath it. The team, including Crawford and his cachet, were relieved and sent home August 28, 1948 – two days after my item was dated. It entered the South African mails at Port Elizabeth on September 3. The scientific base on Marion Island has been continuously occupied, up to 50 strong, since that first year. A variety of cachets were used to identify mail, but in 1958 a permanent post office was established using semi-pictorial cancels. But, collectors – realize your limits! So numerous were the requests for servicing covers that the scientific community there found the labour of stamping souvenir envelopes too tedious and the post office was closed in the early 1980s. Subsequent mails were cancelled aboard the supply ship M. V. Agulhas (very colourfully!) and a recent land-based cancel is also found, applied in Cape Town itself. I have little interest in the more modern material, but am delighted with my sole cover to date, handled by Crawford himself.

#### Footnote to This Story by John Wilson



Tristan has recently issued a set of stamps honouring the recently-deceased Allan Crawford (he made it to 94 and was still active in the Friends of Tristan da Cunha organization to the end). Two of the values show Crawford in his prime, and the second shows the "potato stamp". He designed a set of values, hoping to have stamps authorized for use on Tristan. He actually had 20,000 copies of the red one printed in South Africa. At the time, four large potatoes were worth a penny, but no-one had any actual money...The Tristan stamp web site shows these and says, I think, that 4 potatoes were worth three cigarettes in 1947.





#### **A Presentation to Remember** Eclipse Philately at North Toronto Stamp Club by Peter Butler, FRPSC

Members of the North Toronto Stamp Club and guests from several other clubs in the GTAPA, were treated to an outstanding presentation at the club's first meeting in the new year. Following a short Annual Meeting at which the new executive for 2010 was introduced to the membership and coffee and pieces of a celebration slab cake were enjoyed, Program Coordinator Peter Butler introduced the evening's speaker, David K. Foot.

David combines his passion for philately with his enthusiasm for chasing eclipses across the globe. Professor Foot is recently retired from the University of Toronto, where he taught economics and demography. His book, Boom Bust & Echo (1996) was a best seller across Canada and beyond and was translated into several languages. He continues to be a very popular guest speaker and is invited to present at conferences around the world. As a stamp collector, he is a member of the Philatelic Specialists Society of Canada and, as mentioned, one of his special interests is eclipses on stamps and covers.




This hand-illustrated eclipse cover was postmarked at ECLIPSE, VA on August 31, 1932, the day that a total solar eclipse (TSE) passed over North America. The eclipse path started in the Arctic, passed over Hudson Bay where maximum totality occurred, and swept southeast over Quebec and New England before ending in the Atlantic. Maximum totality was 1 minute, 45 seconds. Eclipse, Virginia was not in the path of totality, although it did experience a partial solar eclipse (see cover for illustration).

In his fascinating presentation, David used relevant philatelic items to explain why total solar eclipses (TSE's) have held a fascination for both professional and amateur astronomers alike. He explored the characteristics of TSE's and the ways in which TSE's have been observed from land, sea and air. His expeditions to view TSE's, has made it possible for him to obtain many philatelic firsts, (often created by himself) buy eclipse stamps and covers first hand from many countries and obtain cancels as well as eclipse ephemera. His talk was illustrated with a wide variety of philatelic material, from pre-stamp covers to cinderellas, and it was laced with many personal anecdotes that brought the events to life for the audience.

David's presentation lasted for over an hour ("Is it over already?" one enthusiast questioned) and for another 20 minutes audience members gathered around him to hear more of his stories, ask questions about his travels and enquire about the philatelic materials he has gathered. It was a very special meeting partly because of David's passion and enthusiasm for his topic and his philatelic treasurers and partly because, as a gifted teacher, he was able to excite the audience that hung on every sentence and presentation photograph.

Harvey Shuter, the club's gifted cover maker, prepared a set of eight celebration covers using Canada's astronomy stamps of 2009, to present to David as tangible evidence of our appreciation for such an enlightening and entertaining evening.

#### **Collection Canada '09**

the annual collection of all the stamps issued by Canada Post for 2009... ...or so you might think!

Every year at this time, Canada Post announces that its annual collection of mint stamps from the previous year is on sale... at \$59.95 plus tax. "It brings together all of the definitive and commemorative stamps... in a single, beautifully illustrated, intricately designed volume," so it states on page three of the new book.

Robin Harris, Editor of *Corgi Times*, the fine newsletter of The Elizabethan II Study Group says, "Well half of that statement is correct... it is a great hardbound book with fascinating stories and images behind the stamp issues [and] I would recommend this publication to all collectors, however, it is not complete in terms of the stamps that were issued by Canada Post."

It's not the first time I've heard that criticism of the annual collection. If I remember correctly Robin has written about the volume being "not complete" before. I also remember thinking I really should find out what's missing and do something about it, but I never have. This year, the list of what is missing from the collection blew me away. There are 10 items not included in the package of "all definitive and commemorative stamps." Just read through this listing of what's not there and you will be thinking, as I did, of coming up with a better way to collect Canadian mint.

First, let's look at what is missing from the yearly package if you are counting on the new volume having everything inside:

- Olympic sports, five self-adhesive stamps from booklet panes
- Olympic mascot/emblems, five self-adhesive coils, three self-adhesive booklet singles and two large format coils
- Year of the Ox overprinted souvenir sheet
- Rhododendron flowers, two self-adhesive stamps from booklet panes
- Art Canada: Jack Bush, single 54¢ stamp from pane from 16
- Astronomy, two self-adhesive stamps from a booklet pane
- Recording Artists, four self-adhesive stamps from booklet panes
- Roadside Attractions. four self-adhesive stamps from booklet panes
- Lest We Forget, souvenir sheet of two stamps
- Christmas, three self-adhesive stamps from booklet panes

Robin explains that for the specialists, the selfadhesive singles are die-cut to shape which produces slightly different varieties than those from booklet panes. If that difference is not something you need to be concerned about then several of the varieties listed above will not be of concern to you and will not be needed in your collection.

For those collectors/specialists that do what the varieties, it means that 33 stamps are missing from Canada Post's so-called complete collection. You would hardly be satisfied if you were counting on buying everything at one time instead of traipsing to the post office every month to buy stamps, only to find out that a third of the issues were not included. What's to do about this, because the answer is certainly not to give up on collecting mint Canada? Or is it? Before you make that decision, here's a plan that might influence your thinking.


The best way to get all the stamps is to buy Canada Post's quarterly packs. Have you seen them in many post office hanging on the wall behind the counter? They cost anywhere from \$2.60 to \$21.11, depending on the number of stamps enclosed. These packages include all the varieties listed above that are not in the yearly collection.

Another plus, as someone mentioned today, "I'm changing my way of purchasing mint stamps and I'll be saving shelf space too. Those yearly books are taking up too much room in my library." I'm thinking that before I make a change, I might check a few yearly collections with the listings in the *Unitrade* catalogue. Will all of the varieties I'm probably missing be listed there? Ouch... I'm no longer complete!

So where to start?

Probably the most difficult question a collector has to answer regarding the collecting of Machins (pronounced "May-chin") must be "What is to be the cut-off?"

With the abundance of Machins available, does one simply collect:

• A sample of each face value in its specific colour.

• A varied collection of each face value of Machins to help distinguish shades, printing methods, phosphors, perforations, papers and any other varieties.

• A range of Machins covering all the varieties associated with one particular face value.

• A range of stamps to demonstrate the diversification of one particular Machin colour. (e.g. green, brown, etc.)

• A range of stamps showing the way that a particular digit has changed over the life of Machins. (2 or 4 would be good examples)

All are a collector's prerogative and no one method can be regarded as either right or wrong, they are simply just different ways of addressing the problem.

From a starter's position the easiest solution may be to start collecting group a) and as one gains more knowledge and experience allow the collection to diversify into any or all of the other aspects.

Lets consider that you have decided to collect those in group a). One starts by looking for one example of each face value with the different colour combinations associated with it. To begin planning for the collection, it is suggested that one obtains a list of known items. There is a large number of catalogues around that will point a collector towards what are available (Scotts, Stanley Gibbons, Krause – Minkus, The Specialized Machins Catalogue, Deegam Machin Handbook, etc). The problem is that each one tends to list several varieties for each value and for a collector to remain faithful to group a) they will need to modify their list accordingly.

As different variations are noticed and acquired it does not take a collector very long to realize that one copy of each face value results in a collection that tends to be somewhat inadequate and begs to be elaborated upon, and so the Machin bug bites.

#### **RECOGNIZING VARIATIONS**

With a view to alleviating some of the aggravations encountered in collecting Machins each article will attempt to explain/explore a common variation that has caused problems.

#### Photogravure and Lithography

These two main printing methods are a great cause of confusion. The subtle differences between stamps of the same value and colour I have learned are mainly because of the two printing methods involved, these being photogravure and lithography. Without knowing the true differences I began by separating the stamps with a "duller" appearance, these I learned later were the lithographed items.

Photogravure is made up of a series of recessed colour cells which overall results in showing more tones than lithography.

Lithography does not have recesses and so usually results in a much "flatter" looking image.

The easiest place to tell the difference between a stamp from a photogravure source and one from a lithographed source is around the denomination. Stamps in photogravure show a "lumpy" edge to the value while those in lithography show a very clean-edge to the value.

These areas will probably need to be viewed through a good magnifying glass (I use a 10x). Also once an example has been identified it may be prudent to keep it close at hand to refresh the memory from time to time. Then as more experience is obtained in determining the differences it will become second nature.

#### 2009 Toronto Stamp Collectors' Club Christmas Dinner

On the 8th of December, the members of the Toronto Stamp Collectors' Club (TSCC) met at the Royal Canadian Military Institute for their annual Christmas dinner.



The TSCC was founded in 1892 making it the oldest stamp club in North America and one of the oldest in the world.

Fourteen members and guests attended the happy event. After a main course of prime roast beef, Yorkshire pudding and wine everyone settled back to listen to the evening's speaker. The guests of honour were **Mr. Milo Vassallo** and **Mrs. Rita Vassallo**. Mr. Vassallo is the former Consul General of Malta. He admitted not to being a stamp collector but countered that he is familiar with the hobby since his father was an avid collector.

Mr. Vassallo went on to describe his early years in Malta. He was born on the island and was only six when the war started. He recalled experiencing years of bombing and of spent night after night in bomb shelters. An uncle was killed in an air raid. For years, there were food shortages. Eventually he immigrated to Canada and became a citizen. Mr. Vassallo also spoke on other aspects of the colourful history of Malta which goes back to 5,200 BC.

After the question and answer session, Mr. Vassallo endeared himself to the members by supplying several interesting collections of Maltese stamps that were then raffled.

At the close of the evening, **Dr. Owen White**, President of the TSCC, presented Mr. Vassallo with a Life Membership in the Club. This is only the second time in its 117 year history that such an honour has been given.

#### New U.S.A *Celebrate Scouting* Stamp Unveiled

On November 5, 2009, the United States Postal Service issued a media advisory that a *Celebrate Scouting* stamp would be unveiled at the Smithsonian National Postal Museum in Washington, on November 12, 2009.

The Boy Scouts of America (BSA) were chartered in 1910 and thus are celebrating their 100<sup>th</sup> birthday this year. However, the United States Postal Service (USPS) has a policy that "stamps or stationery items shall not be issued to honor fraternal, political, sectarian or service/charitable organizations". The stamp issue is thus for a more general "100 years of scouting in America", rather than for the BSA organization. The stamp therefore just has the word "Scouting" along the bottom, and depicts the images of two different scouts in clothing and accessories that are often part of the outdoor scouting experience. The Boy Scouts of America shared the unveiling ceremony with the United States Postal Service.



A few things of interest surround this postal issue. The above images show the front and back of a "max card" available at the unveiling ceremony. It was jointly offered by the USPS and the BSA. The example shows one that has the National Postal Museum Station cancellation dated on the unveiling day, November 12, 2010. Does this mean we will now see more examples of early unveiling ceremonies and thus of official "unveiling day covers" as well as "first day covers"? Secondly, the announcement quoted an issue date of "July 2010", eight months after the unveiling date. That is certainly a long period before the stamps are actually issued.

The July 2010 date was chosen to coincide with the BSA National Jamboree to be held at Fort A.P. Hill in Virginia, July 26 – August 4, where 50,000 scouts and leaders will be in camp to celebrate 100 years of scouting. To create a focus on philately, SOSSI (Scouts On Stamps Society International) will have 25 members working with the scouts on their Stamp Collectors Merit Badge in the Merit Badge Midway area. As well, another 10 members will be part of the "lick-em, stick-em" group, preparing a variety of philatelic covers as souvenirs of the *Celebrate Scouting*" stamp issue.

#### **Greenland Cover Mystery**

This registered cover from Greenland may look just an ordinary cover with a set of Greenland overprint stamps to a postal cover collector. However this single cover led to a philatelic mystery.

This registered cover was posted in Sondre Strømfjord, Greenland in March 31, 1956. Sondre Strømfjord is on Baffin Bay on the west side of Greenland near The Arctic Circle. It has a research station and a small airport with Greenland's longest runway. From time to time, flights from northern Europe to Canada or USA land here for refueling. Other than that, the only flight landing in this sub-Arctic airport is to bring supplies to the research station or military flights to the base on the other side of the runway. Most likely the letter was written by someone from the research station to a friend or a family member back in San Fernando, California. However looking at the stamps used to mail this letter, a set of overprints and neatly cancelled, tying all the stamps for proper rate and usage for that period indicates the sender must be a collector of covers or the least a stamp collector.

What makes this cover is unusual is the stamps on the cover. All of them are 1945 Denmark Liberation issue overprints, and all are overprint color error varieties. The overprint is "DANMARK BEFRIET 5 MAJ 1945". The 10ø purple and olive and 15ø red and bright ultramarine portray King Christian X of Denmark. The 30ø dark blue and red brown (Dog team), 1k brown and gray black (Polar bear), 2k sepia and deep green (Eskimo in Kayak) and 5k dark purple and dull brown (Eider duck)




Fig.2 Compete set of Greenland stamps overprinted SC# 22, 23, 24, 25, 26 and 27

Of the overprint colour errors, stamps which should have carmine overprint have blue overprints and those of which should have carmine overprints have blue overprints. Scott lists these overprint colour errors as 22a, 23a, 24a, 25a, 26a and 27a. The 2009 Scott catalogue value for the overprint error, used set is US\$ 1825.00 where as the overprint catalogue value for the same set, (used) is US\$ 840.00 (*fig.2*)

There are three strikes of "Sdr. Strømfjord" CDS, one ties both 22a and 23a, the 2<sup>nd</sup> ties all four 24a, 25a, 26a and 27a in the middle. The 3<sup>rd</sup> is on the top left corner of the cover arrived in San Fernando on April 4, shows on the backstamp. Registry was denoted by a preprinted registry label hand stamped "Sdr. Strømfjord".

Now the mystery of these stamps, the overprinting of this issue were extremely small with the official issues estimated at 3,000 or even less by the time they arrives at The Royal Greenland Trade company (KGH) in Copenhagen (fig.3). Every sheet was examined by KGH for colour variance and overprint. There were no records of such variants was found and sold at face value. All of them sold to in USA by the world largest wholesale company who was a monopolist at that time period, **H&J Stolow**.

Later it was learned that the majority of these stamps were not earmarked for sale in Greenland but for sale to J & H Stolow, who sold some of the sets to other stamps wholesalers in USA and Canada. (*fig.4*). There was a deal signed between Danish Consulate General, Greenland section and J&H Stolow (*fig.5*) for the immediate sale of 10,000 sets and another 10,000 sets within a year.

Of the 30,000 sets printed, following is the breakdown of how they were distributed.

- 1. 15,000 sets to J&H Stolow, for their exclusive sale in USA, Canada and rest of the world.
- 2. 5,500 sets were sent to Greenland for official sale there, but were lost or disappeared in transit. It was rumored these were sent to J&H Stolow's operations in New York and forwarded from there to Greenland.
- 3. 9,000 sets were sent to Denmark for official sale there.
- 4. Only remaining 500 sets were sent to Greenland as replacements for those missing.




Fig.5 The agreement signed by the J&H Stolow to buy the Greenland stamps.

Now the biggest question arises, who ordered and received the overprint colour error stamps? They were never officially ordered and none of them was sold in Greenland or Denmark. The evidence points to J &H Stolow, who must have ordered the colour error, but in what quantity? No one knows. Was there any secret agreement between Danish consulate, Greenland section and J & H Stolow to deliberately print the overprinted colour error? or did Stolow receive the color error directly from the printer without the knowledge of the Greenland Consulate?

To this date Danish and Greenland Postal authorities have maintained that there was no overprint colour error either ordered or received. Now, all evidence is pointing finger at J & H Stolow. They have in the past openly ordered and printed various bogus stamps and sold them to other dealers. One such example is the stamp for the non-existent county, "Republic South Moluccas", printed at the Austrian Federal Print Office.

As far as can be seen, these Greenland overprint colour errors will remain a mystery in need of research.


