

Grow your club - Grow your event - Grow our hobby!

With a new season of club special events such as Auctions, Shows, Bourses and Mini Shows brings renewed excitement and interest to our great hobby.

Have you taken the opportunity to visit one or more of these events over the past few weeks?

While making the rounds of several such events, it became obvious [to me] the shows that had the highest attendance are those that made the biggest effort to advertise their event.

For example take Troyak (Polish-Canadian Coin and Stamp Club) who put on a two day event – they advertised in all ways possible. They used local newspapers, television, their own web site, handouts, and flyer drops at various clubs, etc. The undertaking was a mammoth event with approximately 600 people attending –well worth the effort.

Kawartha Stamp Club held their annual show with great success, with 300 buyers attending. They took advantage of the PhilaJournal advertising and the exposure it brings along with GTAPA web site calendar and other traditional forms of advertising. Many positive comments from dealers and buyer were passed on [to me] about the professionalism the PhilaJournal ad brought to the event and the club.

Scarborough Stamp Club Mini Show is taking all the right steps handing out flyers at the different clubs as well as the PhilaJournal advertising, GTAPA website calendar and other traditional methods.

Ajax Philatelic Society dropped flyer at surrounding clubs and along with Troyak produced a video advertising their event – no doubt helping grow their event.

Oshawa's Stamp Auction took advantage of the Grand News and the PhilaJournal two publications dedicated to our great hobby – they also took advantage of both their own web site and that of the GTAPA. Oshawa also dropped flyers and sent out a number of well-timed emails to their list of 250 dedicated stamp, card and FDC collectors.

Oshawa's auction was a tremendous success with over 120 bidders in attendance. The auction sold 87% of the lots for record totals.

Did your event draw a rewarding number of participants – could your event have drawn more? If yes – broaden your advertising efforts, particularly those publications dedicated to philately – take advantage of all forms available – advertise early and often in a profession manner – bringing a polished look to your event.

In the News

Stanley Gibbons sell Britain's most valuable stamp for £,550,000



A single example of the elusive 'plate 77 Penny Red' has been sold by rare stamp and collectibles dealer, Stanley Gibbons, to a private client seeking portfolio diversification.

Just two months after acquiring a rare example of the legendary 'plate 77 Penny Red', described as "the finest used example in existence inside or outside a museum" by Stanley Gibbons Director of Great Britain Philately, the company has announced its sale to a private client in Australasia for £550,000 (CAN \$887,000).

The MACHIN Corner

The Machin Corner No. 10

Hello again. Well what a year this is turning out to be.

Early in the year, my contacts had indicated that there would be very few Machins issued from Royal Mail, three values in January (68p, 2p & 10p) together with those for the Diamond Jubilee in February, and the rate change definitives in March (it was unsure which would be subject to a rate change).

The three definitives were printed by Walsall and issued on January 10, 2012 in the "Roald Dahl prestige booklet". The 68p Sea Green was issued with the security code "P" and the year code "11", but without any security slots. The 2p Deep Grey-Green and 10p Light Tan were both issued without any security features. (How the heck are we going to differentiate any used items from all the others that abound?)

The Diamond Jubilee issue was to be a Miniature Sheet of 6 stamps of 1st Class denomination and these were to show the various heads of her majesty as used on previously issued stamps, coins and paper money.

Only one of these was to follow the standard Machin design, and would be coloured "Diamond Blue" with a background printing in iridescent ink containing the source code (M) and with no date code or security slits.

Additional stamps were also issued with different source codes (O for Counter Sheets, B for Business Sheets & T for Booklets). Again there were no date codes but Type 2a security slits were applied.

March has seen the release of "Large" letter Diamond Jubilee Machins, which were printed with the source codes of "F", "E" & "B" for a Book of 4, Counter Sheets and Business Sheets respectively. Then, without reason before the end of March, these were summarily withdrawn from counter sales. Now with the Diamond Jubilee celebrations lasting a full year, it makes one wonder what other interesting collecting variants we will be seeing before year end.

The rate change definitives will also prove to be very interesting. Currently planned is the release of three new stamps in April:

a. 87p in Orange

b. £1.28p in Emerald Green

c. £1.90p in Rhododendron (or Amethyst).

The rate changes that are planned will affect something like 30 or more of the services provided. (Typical changes will be a 1st Class Letter will rise from 46p to 60p and a 2nd Cass Letter from 36p to 50p; a Worldwide Postcard will rise from 68p to 87p, a Worldwide 10g Letter from 76p to 87p and a Worldwide 20g Letter from £1.10p to £1.28p)

In their usual way of operating, Royal Mail will probably find that their planned release of stamps for the proposed increases is inadequate and to cover those areas will require the issue of even more different definitives. However, at this time we simply don't know what is going to happen but rest assured it can only make for a much more interesting year than was foretold.

session. All twelve had high praise for the workshop leader, Michel Houde (pictured at left), a member of the Philatelic Specialists Society of Canada and a presenter himself at many different club meetings.

All attendees brought their own laptop computer or shared with a colleague. After a basic look at the program and ensuring that everyone was "on board," the group downloaded a short slide show of Michel's and proceeded to use the various

directives to change, add to or delete text or illustrations from the slide show. It was definitely a hands-on process and Michel was able to give individual assistance to those with problems or questions.

The session was so successful that members of the Board in attendance agreed that we should offer another opportunity in the fall or winter to repeat the workshop for member clubs.

With many clubs having their own projectors and members having laptops, preparing presentations for club meetings is becoming a welcome addition to club programming.



Postage Due

Postage due is the term used for mail sent with insufficient postage. A postage due stamp is a stamp added to an underpaid piece of mail to indicate the extra postage due.

When the Universal Postal Union was founded in 1874 the problem with underpaid foreign mail was not dealt with. The U.P.U. arrived at the decision that mail with insufficient postage should be marked with a "T" and from April 1, 1879 the amount missing would also be indicated in black. Later more countries started to use handstamps to indicate the amount due. Later the combination of handstamps with both the "T" and the amount missing came into use.

From October 1, 1907 the rules were changed. The amount due would be charged instead of indicating the amount missing. The amount charged was usually double the amount that was missing.

While this problem existed since the creation of regular postal systems, it was greatly intensified by the advent of postage stamps, since customers were now making their own decisions about the right amount to pay. The problem was solved by France in 1859, with the issuance of official postage due stamps, affixed and paid at the time of delivery. Postage due stamps are not valid for postage and are, by definition, labels.

The first Canada Postage Due Stamps were issued in 1906.

This time, it appears that the RPO clerk made the T 6c note; then a 6 cents DUE mark was made and, subsequently, Postage Due stamps were affixed and then cancelled when paid.

Beat chop covers

Covers that one covets can make very weak or very good prices on eBay, on the world's greatest open market. I attach two that went for very hefty prices -- both of interest to me because they feature the Chinese character beat chop wielded by the postmen from 1916 to 1934, for use on letters where delivery presented problems.



The first cover is now my pride and joy, but it was heavily competed for. I bought it because I (and the unsuccessful sniper based in Hong Kong) realized that it was the earliest verified use of such a marking. It was addressed to a relative of the then-Governor, which probably necessitated the postman's careful marking.

We don't know when the new system of markings for postmen was introduced, but this envelope pushes the date back a few months. The seller thought he was offering the world a set of the Russian semi-postal stamps and was so overcome with joy at the final realization that he sent me a duplicate copy of the damaged stamp so I could "improve" the envelope.

The second cover went for the same extravagant money, but I was not the winner. I was indeed a heavy bidder but my bid was based entirely on the beat chop.



Of more interest to the other bidders was the reverse of the envelope, showing a scarce air-mail marking in red.



The frenzy left me cold -- but it cemented the idea that in an open auction, there are many factors at play. The Germans have a great word for such items: they fetch a "liebhaberpreis" or "I have to have it price".

Unusual Postage Stamps

Many of the features that made a stamp issue unusual have now been used by several stamp-issuing agencies. Some of these features include stamps with scratch and sniff, stamps with heat sensitive inks, stamps with embedded granules, stamps with 3 dimensional images, the lenticular printed stamps that show action and stamps printed on materials other than paper. Designers and printers are finding it difficult to come up with novel ideas to impress the public. I will continue to research unusual stamp issues, but for the sake of continuing this column will write about stamp issues that are not necessarily unique.

Although not unusual as far as any of the above criteria I have decided to add a March 2012 issue from Germany since it has an unusual intended use.




It is described as a mourning or grief stamp. While it can be used for any mail the idea behind the issue that there was times that written personal letters more appropriate than e-mails or messaging. The stark

black, gray and white stamp shows a landscape at dusk. I imagine that covers franked with this stamp will be sought after by collectors of mourning covers, those covers of earlier times with black borders around the edges of the envelope.

On February 12 2011 India Post issued a stamp that was printed on khadi, which is an Indian handspun and hand woven cloth. The stamp in the form of a souvenir sheet was issued in conjunction with Indipex 2011, a world philatelic exhibition and shows an image of Mahatma Gandhi sitting at a charkha (spinning wheel) as well as a quotation of his from 1947.

An Exhibiting Opportunity Garfield Portch FRPSC

Every now and then an opportunity arises that has positive outcomes for everybody involved. For the Toronto philatelic community, that opportunity surfaced in mid-August 2011 with an email to Larry Friend from Lee Petrie, the exhibit curator at Toronto's Pearson Airport.

In her role at the airport, Lee maintains a series of exhibits featuring social, cultural and historical content. Every year she works with a number of graduate students in the Museum Studies program at the University of Toronto giving them an opportunity to curate an exhibition (for a course credit) with mentors and content partners. Lee's email offered the GTAPA to be content providers. Suffice to say that we accepted the offer recognizing that we would have an opportunity to present a philatelic display to more than a million travelers departing Canada via Terminal 1.



It was not until October that we met our two grad students, Chelsea Carss (from Ottawa) and Melanie Derschowicz (from New York) with our first meeting being held at the Greene Foundation. Here we discovered our first challenge... neither of our curators knew anything about philately! Suffice to state that they learned well with a crash course and exposure to the VGG facilities and staff.

Early in the planning, we discovered a second major challenge... we philatelists think of exhibiting in two dimensions only. Our traditional exhibition frame was being replaced by a 15 inch plexiglass cube mounted on a pedestal. Our presentation was limited to twenty of these cubes spread the length of the Terminal 1 International Departures lounge.

In the three months following, meetings were held weekly at the VGG Foundation and Charles Verge was invited to join the planning team. The curators decided that the exhibit would contain twenty



different aspects of philately with a bias toward Canadian content. The title selected was "That Connecting Link". Each cube was to contain a combination of stamps and other material that would tie together presenting one aspect of Canadiana.



An example of the content of a cube is the display of the Olympic Games in Canada. The cube contained not only stamps from Montreal, Calgary and Vancouver, but also a stuffed mascot and a toque.

To illustrate Thematic philately, I was pleased to provide not only stamps and a cover featuring firefighting, but also a photo of my great uncle at a "fire hall portrait" taken in 1954 along with a die cast

replica of the Pearson Airport crash truck and a die cast replica of an 1888 La France fire engine.



March 6, we assembled the entire exhibit on site and must give our student curators our enthusiastic thanks for a job well done. The exhibit is both attractive and informative and will be in place until August 9 this year.

Scouts on Stamps

1937 World Jamboree – Incoming Mail By Tony Manson

World Scout Jamborees always have a temporary on-site postal facility. Their main purpose & workload is to handle large volumes of outgoing mail from the 15 to 40 thousand attendees. There is a much smaller volume of incoming mail as well, which they need to distribute. The incoming card below is one example which makes one wonder who it should be delivered to.



It is also an example where it is necessary to look beyond the stamp, the cancel and the cachet while browsing through a dealer's stock of covers. It is postmarked from Brussels, Belgium on July 29, 1937, two days before the 5th World Jamboree started in Holland. It has four stamps totaling 1 Fr., including an air post one and a definitive with a seal attached advertising a tonic (Cachets du D:Faivre) "for all illnesses" (Contre toutes douleurs).

There is no immediate indication that it is a scout cover. However, a look at the addressee shows it to be addressed to "Scout Mondial" (World Scout), Vogelenzang, Hollande, which is where the Jamboree was being held. Also, on the left side just above the Par Avion label, it reads (translated) "This card is for a scout who is a philatelist". Hmmm ... I wonder how many scout philatelists were there (1% of attendees would mean 150 to 400)! And who should get the card?

On the back of the card was a hand-written message saying (again translated) "For any eager youth, please send me 3 World Jamboree stamps on a postcard with your address and I will send you stamps from this country with pleasure. Thank You".

This was a creative way of getting some World Jamboree philatelic souvenir, and of picking up an additional mail-order customer at the same time! And it makes this particular postcard an interesting souvenir itself!
