Fantasy Stamps: The Kingdom of Sedang

Some of you may have seen on the internet, or found in some old collections, stamps from the Kingdom of Sedang. These stamps were issued in 1889 and represent one of the first attempts to profit from the growing interest in stamp collecting through the issue of fantasy stamps. The Kingdom of Sedang was the invention of a French adventurer, Charles -Marie David de Mayrena.

Mayréna, a former French government official with a dubious history, had studied geology and medicine in France but moved to French Indochina, where in 1888 he was the owner of a plantation. When the king of Siam began claiming territories near French Indochina, Mayréna convinced the French Authorities to let him lead an expedition into the interior in order to negotiate alliance treaties with the local tribespeople. Mayrena had a secret agenda. Once he reached the area, he befriended the local tribesmen, married the daughter of a local chief and, after helping them to stop an epidemic, he convinced the local chiefs to elect him Chief of the Chiefs.



The Kingdom of Sedang, as he named it, incorporated the Bahnar, Rengao, and Sedang tribes. Once he became king, Mayrena established his capital at Kon Gung (also called Pelei Agna, or Great City), and assumed the new name of Marie the First, King of the Sedang, June 3, 1888.

Mayrena subsequently travelled to Europe where he tried unsuccessfully to sell his territory rights to the French and to other foreign powers. In Paris he stayed at the Ritz Hotel with a group of dignitaries and started raising money by

selling nobility rights to rich French businessmen. He then moved to Belgium, where he started selling "official" stamps of the Kingdom of Sedang and mining rights in Sedang. A few months later he boarded the ship Sachesen to go back to Indochina. In Singapore, he was arrested by the British for contraband and had to interrupt his return trip.

In the meantime, the French denied Mayrena the authorization to return to Indochina and sent troops in Annam to stop any autonomy demands in the Sedang region. Mayrena was forced to remain in Malesia, in the island of Tioman in Penang State. On November 11, 1890, he died in Tioman, without being able to return to Sedang. The causes of his death are not clear, probably poisoned by a cobra bite or by a poisoned arrow.

None of the stamps he brought with him ever arrived in Sedang but in the meantime, in Europe, his Belgian partner managed to sell quite a large number of stamps to collectors who wanted to add a new exotic kingdom to their collection.

These fantasy stamps are over 125 years old and were still quite popular in the early 1900's. You can find them easily in very old stamp collections. As far as I know there was only one set of seven stamps issued with the following denominations: 1/2 math, moi (= 1) math, ber (= 2) math, pouen (= 4) math, moi (= 1) mouk, \$1/2 and \$1.





These stamps should be considered Cinderellas and have a very colourful history behind them.

They continue to attract genuine interest from some stamp collectors.







A Colonel Mak tried to relaunch the "Kingdom of Sedang" in 1996 by setting up a website, awarding nobility titles and even issuing stamps. The "Regency" of the Kingdom of Sedang was initially set up in Toronto and then moved to Montreal. I have been unable to find up to date information on the current status of this "Regency of Sedang".

The Real Photo Post Card

One of the real thrills of collecting is that the study of stamp leads to the study of postal history, which enriches and deepens your knowledge, until finally the Real Photo Post Card (RPPC) becomes a visceral pleasure. This item is a treasure on both sides of the card.



It was purchased for the dramatic image on the photo side as much as for the Italian ship cancel on the stamps. The two sides support each other wonderfully. The lovely sepia photo shows a narrow, hole-in-the-wall pass surmounted by a castle, a parapet wall over the pass, and a smaller fortification to the left. It triggered a ghostly memory... The printer of the card was given as Pallonjee, Dinshaw & Co., of Aden, and Aden is mentioned in the message as well.



Using these hints I realized that what we have is in fact the full view of the walled pass leading down into Crater, which is shown in miniature on the five-shilling Aden stamp issued in the 1950's, on the left.





The reverse shows a typical handstamp of the Royal Italian Navy, with a coat of arms in a double-ringed cancel lettered "R. NAVEALULA". Alula is a port in Italian East Africa.

With a little diligence I learned that this was also the name given to a gunboat operating from 1921 on, presumably in the Red Sea squadron. The cancel is undated but the stamps were current only up to 1930, so the collector has to be content with a nine-year window. The card is a cheap, but irreplaceable, item fully evocative of the era and the place in which it originated.



Western Wizard Visits Toronto

Robin Harris, expert in most things philatelic, spent four whirlwind days in Toronto in October sharing information with local GTAPA clubs. Topics were **Simplifying the Machins**, the **History of the Unitrade Catalogue** and **Lowe-Martin Serpentine Die Cutting**. Meeting hosts were the West Toronto Stamp Club, North Toronto Stamp Club and Vincent G Greene Phil. Research Foundation.

At all three events, it was "standing room only" as Robin encouraged and challenged collectors to expand their knowledge and to think beyond their current collection practices. Robin's outfit, with a philatelic theme, pictured here, was appreciated by the Wednesday night group.

A special vote of thanks goes to Ted Nixon, Chairman of the VGG Foundation, who sponsored Robin's trip. While in Toronto, Robin met with Ted and Library staff to discuss improvements to their website.

Security Measures

Stamp issuing agencies have often used various methods as security measures such as micro printing, watermarking, tagging or syncopated perforating to name just a few to authenticate their products.





The image on the right is what is seen under infrared light

Bosnia and Herzegovina - Croatian Post Ltd Mostar in June 2012 issued a stamp inscribed Medjugorje 2012 dedicated to a shrine visited by millions of pilgrims annually. The stamp is protected by the so-called INFRAREDESIGN protection which reveals a security feature design which can only be seen using an infrared light or camera. This was the first time the technology has been used for a postage stamp.



Finland also protected one of its issues in 2013 when it issued a set of six stamps featuring characters from the extremely popular game Angry Birds. The game created by a Finnish game developer first released in late 2009 for use on touchscreen based smartphones has had over 2 billion downloads in

its various forms for phone and computer use. The stamps which feature a pattern which is only visible under UV light also have irregular perforations which follow the shape of the characters.


Fancy Cancels

A fancy cancel is a postal cancellation that includes an artistic design. Although the term may be used in reference to modern machine cancellations that include artwork, it primarily refers to the designs carved in cork and used in 19th century post offices.

The regulations concerning the postmarking of envelopes at the time of Confederation may be summarized as follows: The item was to be postmarked in the lower left corner of the missile with the date and name of the forwarding office; if the office had not been issued with a suitable date stamp it was to be done in script.

Adhesive postage stamps were to be obliterated with a killer, not the date stamp. If no such killer had been issued to the office, the postage stamp was to be cancelled with a pen and ink cross, or by a suitable killer provided by the postmaster. The office of destination had to record its arrival with its date stamp, or in script.

The reason postage stamps were not to be cancelled using a date stamp is that if it was the only postal marking on the front of the cover, and the adhesive stamp was removed, the record of the item's time in transit was lost. This could leave the Postal Authorities open to a charge of undue delay, which they wanted to avoid.



This cover illustrates an obliterated stamp and the placement of the postmark according to regulations.







Fancy cancels made by postal officials fall into several groups. The most prolific are simply cross cuts on a generally round background which were most likely made from cork and which include designs such Sunburst, Maple Leaf and Star, shown above.







Oltre Giuba – Italian Protectorate

Oltre Giuba is the Italian name for a strip of land west of the Juba River in East Africa. To the English speaking world, it is known as Jubaland. To the south is the Indian Ocean, on the east side is Italian Somalia, to the north is Ethiopia, and on the west is Kenya.



Italy was claimed loss of possessions after World War I. Under the Anglo Italian Treaty of July 15, 1924, this small strip of land was given to Italy by Great Britain in 1924 and was ceded to Italy on June 29, 1925. It is about 33,000 square miles in size and then had a population of about 12,000 people, mostly Somalis. In 1926 it was incorporated with Italian Somaliland, and in 1936 became part of Italian East Africa.

Oltre Giuba's first stamps were issued on July 29, 1925, and the last ones were issued on June 1, 1926. In that very short period of time (less than one year) a total of 66 stamps were issued. All except two sets of seven and six stamps respectively, were Italian stamps

overprinted "OLTRE GIUBA". The first set consisted of 20 regular issues ranging from one centesemi to 10 lire, 10 postage due stamps ranging from 5 centesemi to 5 lire, and 13 parcel post stamps ranging from 5 centesemi to 20 lire, all overprinted.

The two overprinted commemorative sets were issued to honour Victor Emmanuel and St. Francis of Assisi. Two sets issued specifically for Oltre Giuba were issued in June 1926, a set of seven stamps showing a map of Oltre Juiba which commemorated the first anniversary of its acquisition by Italy, and a second set of six stamps for the Italian Colonial Institute omnibus issue.

A Popular Christmas Postmark from Austria

In Austria, the Christ Child, Christkindl, brings the gifts on Christmas Eve. Christkindl is also the name of a small village in Northern Austria. Every Christmas season, a special post office opens there to service all mail it receives with commemorative stamps and an original pictorial postmark.



The village was established as a pilgrimage shrine. According to folklore, a choirmaster and organist who suffered from epilepsy visited the area one winter. As he walked in the woods he often prayed. On one occasion he carried a small statue of the Christ Child given to him by the nuns at a nearby convent. He placed it in a niche that he had cut in a pine tree and prayed for relief of his

illness. His health improved and the local townspeople hearing of the "miraculous cure" visited the area. It soon became a seasonal centre for pilgrims. A small wooden enclosure was built around the tree and by 1709 a small church was erected. It soon became a prominent tourist attraction and by 1877 the church was reconstructed incorporating the pine tree in its altar.

In 1950, the Austrian postal authority decided to build a seasonal post office using a special annual hand cancel. The project proved to be very successful and it has continued ever since. It is one of the most popular philatelic events of the year for worldwide collectors of Christmas stamps and covers.



Collectors can have their letters and cards postmarked by the Christkindl Post Office. Send your pre-addressed envelopes in a separate envelope to: Christkindl Post Office A-4411 Christkindl, Austria.

Include International Reply Coupons to cover the postage home worldwide. You may illustrate the cover(s) or add labels but leave room for stamps and the postmarks. Here are two samples of stamps and postmarks from my collection

Norman Rockwell's Scouting Connection

In the fall of 1912, a young 18 year old man entered the offices of *Boys' Life* magazine. He had just finished attending three different art schools in the last two years and was looking for a job. The Boy Scouts of America (BSA), in July of that year, had just published their first issue of *Boys' Life* and had decided they needed their own illustrator if it was to become a success. It was good timing, since that young man was Norman Rockwell. After showing examples of his work, he was quickly hired. This started his long and significant association with the BSA organization.

Rockwell illustrated many of the stories in the magazine and designed the magazine covers, as well as illustrating a number of scouting manuals. His work was quickly recognized and he decided to leave his job and work on commission. Thus the BSA was Rockwell's first, and only, salary-based job.

However, Rockwell never really left, since he continued for the rest of his life to illustrate many magazines and manuals for the BSA. Then in 1925 the BSA issued their very first Calendar as a fund raising project. Norman did the Calendar picture, as he did the next year, and the one after that. In fact, over the 52 years, 1925 to 1976, Rockwell illustrated 50 of the Calendars.

On September 1, 1979 Liberia issued a set of 50 stamps, one for each of those 50 pictures. Two are shown below on FDC's (Scott 857i & 856a).





The first one is *Can't Wait* from the 1972 Calendar. The other one *Beyond the Easel*, showing Norman in Boy Scout uniform, was from the 1969 Calendar.



As the BSA approached their 50th Anniversary they convinced the Post Office to issue a stamp recognizing this milestone Once again Rockwell was called on to do the artwork. The result was this stamp issued on February 8, 1960 (Scott 1145). Shortly after, he

designed one other stamp (non-scouting), but then decided to stay with his other larger artwork in the future. Upon his death in 1978, Rockwell left the rights to all his scouting material to the BSA. In 2004, SOSSI held their annual meeting and other events at TEXPEX in Dallas and had a tour of the BSA Scouting Museum there. In that Museum is a separate Norman Rockwell Room where they hang on a rotation basis, 15 to 20 of Rockwell's original oil paintings of the Calendar series. These are large, almost floor to ceiling size paintings that are absolutely spectacular.





Rockwell was recognized by the USPS, who issued a stamp and a souvenir sheet on July 1, 1994 (Scott 2839 & 2840a to d) in his honour.



He is also depicted on many scouting covers such as this February 3, 1998 FD one with the scouting stamp (Scott 3183j) from the *Celebrate The Century* series. Rockwell is seen in a humorous pose in a scouting uniform.

Norman passed away in 1978 at the age of 84 after decades of supporting the scouting movement in the U.S.A. The BSA presented Norman Rockwell with their highest award, the Silver Buffalo, for his distinguished service to scouting.

The Language of Stamps



Have you ever noticed a stamp on an envelope or a postcard is upside down or even located in an odd place? The explanation might be that the sender was in a hurry and did not pay attention to what they were doing.

However, you might be surprised to learn that they might have being using the stamp to send a coded message!

This language of stamps started in the time of Queen Victoria as a way for a writer to send a discreet message. It became very popular in the 1890's especially on postcards where your message can be read by nosey people. Today it is rarely used due to the decline in letter writing and postal rules limiting where a stamp can be place. But still, it is popular among those writing to loved ones separated for an extended time. It adds an icon of affection to their letter.

A thing to note is that there was no standard for this language of stamps. I have several postcards similar to the one show on the left each giving their own meaning to the orientation and position of the stamp. What was important was the individuals communicating had to agree on the meaning otherwise the wrong message might be received leading to an unfortunate miscommunication.

Here are three items I have in my collection interpreted according to the postcard shown on the left.



Top right-hand corner, upside down

"I am always thinking of you."



Tilted to the right

"Will you be mine?"



Lower left hand corner, upside down

"I am always true to you."

Animals have often been featured on Canadian Christmas stamps, but never quite like these portrait-style illustrations, according to Canada Post. These three "classically Canadian" animals, designed by Paprika and illustrated by Gérard DuBois, appear in a "whimsical holiday wardrobe".

- ➤ On the international-rate stamp, the polar bear braces for the cold in a red cap, scarf, and cozy sweater.
- On the domestic rate stamp the toque attired moose is featured.
- ➤ On the U.S.-rate stamp, a grinning beaver wearing a red flannel shirt and green flat cap with a sprig of holly in his mouth will be a collectible for sure!



On the reverse side of the First Day Cover, this paragraph tells a story of what these three could be saying to each other....

'It must be just about time," said Moose, aloud to himself. Through the snowy trees, he saw Polar Bear lumbering forward. "A good Christmas Eve to you! 
