

# A Message from the Family of Cliff Rundle

Dad was a quiet, wise and respectful man, with a great interest in history and appreciation for the widespread beauty found in nature. He loved colour and design and was very detail oriented. He was employed for 44 years by General Motors of Canada Ltd., mostly in the Oshawa Parts Department -- time interrupted only by his service overseas during WWII with the 2<sup>nd</sup> Canadian Army Ordnance Field Park. He was an avid reader, good thinker and hard worker.

Stamp collecting was the perfect hobby for Dad. It gave him a chance to sit back and take time away from his labours, while finding satisfaction in the finer things that history and nature had to offer and were so impressively captured on the face of a stamp. It didn't take much -- a little bowl of water, hinges, tweezers, magnifiers, binders and catalogues -- and a folding card table. When that table found its way out of the den closet to stand upright in front of Dad's chair, we knew that it would be there for hours on end and that Dad was "in his glory".

It was difficult to hand over the collections that Dad had put together for my mother, my sister and me. While we didn't have the same interest in the stamps that Dad had, the time, effort and thought we knew had gone into the display of each collection meant everything to us and we were unable to part with them. Our collections sat for more than thirty seven years before the decision was made to share his interest with others who would value the stamps as much as he did.

Realizing that the love and care he had put into each collection meant more to us than the stamps themselves and that with high quality photocopying, we could keep a copy of the collections intact, while still preserving and honouring Dad's efforts, we decided to sell.

Not knowing who to contact after all this time, I turned to Larry Friend, President of the GTAPA. Very quickly he found buyers, and before passing the collections along, copied every page from each collection so that my sister and I are able to still cherish and admire Dad's special hobby and gift to us.

Membership in the Oshawa Stamp Club provided a means for Dad to share his hobby with others, make contacts, trade, and expand his own collections. It was a home away from home where he found much peace and contentment. Contributing to the publication of this issue of PhilaJournal allows me the chance to give back in some small way – to say thank you -- and to pay tribute to my Dad, John Clifford "Cliff" Rundle.

In the Rundle case, we displayed three frames, taking a page from each daughters' collection and his wife. (See sample to the left)

# Ignacy Jan Paderewski, concert pianist and politician

In October 2016, I purchased a three cover lot of mail addressed to Ignacy Paderewski, on eBay. As well as being a world renowned concert pianist and composer, he was also Prime Minister of Poland in 1919. Two of the purchased covers are shown in this article.

Paderewski was born November 18, 1860 in rural Poland where his father was an estate manager. Following musical studies in Warsaw, Berlin and Vienna, he began a 50 year international career that made him one of the best known and best paid pianists of all time. His first American tour was made in 1891 and he returned regularly until settling in the United States in 1913. He purchased a 2000 acre estate in California that he named Rancho San Ignacio.

Paderewski's involvement in politics began during World War 1 as an active member and spokesman of the Polish National Committee in Paris. Following the end of the war, he returned to the newly independent Poland and was appointed to the dual role of Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs. In 1921 he retired from politics to resume his musical career and left Poland never to return.

After the fall of Poland in 1939, Paderewski returned to public life and became head of the National Council of Poland, the Polish Government in Exile in London. He restarted his Polish Relief Fund and gave many concerts to raise money for the fund. During one such tour he was taken ill with pneumonia and died in New York on June 27, 1941.

Paderewski was initially buried at Arlington National Cemetery, but in 1992 his body was taken to Warsaw, Poland and interred in St John's Cathedral.



As well as being honored in his native Poland with schools and streets named after him, Paderewski was honored in the United States several ways. The U.S. postal services issued a stamp of him in the Champions of Liberty issue. Streets in many U.S. towns and cities are also named after him and in 1960 his star was put on the Hollywood Walk of fame.



# Congregation of the Propaganda Fide

In 1923, Italy issued a set of four stamps celebrating the tercentenary of the Congregation of the Evangelization of Peoples, which was founded in 1622. The stamps portray Christ preaching the gospel to the people. It was Pope Gregory XV who founded the Congregation and it is his picture in the upper left corner of each stamp. The purpose of the Congregation was to educate people regarding the Catholic faith.



Each stamp portrays a saint in the upper right hand corner: St. Theresa d'Avila on the 20 c stamp, St. Dominic of Guzman on the 30 c, St. Francis of Assisi on the 50 c stamp and St. Francesco Saverio on the 1 lire.

The arms on the bottom right show the arms of the order to which the saints belonged. The crowned shield of Savoy is shown on the bottom left. Only 200,000 sets of stamps were printed, but 150,000 sets were allocated to the Patronato Roman di Italica Gens. The stamps were on sale for three days only (June 11 to June 13, 1923) and only in Rome. They were valid from June 11 to June 30, 1923 only.

In addition, 25,000 sets were issued for Eritrea, Italian Somalia, Cirenaica, and Tripolitania, by overprinting them for these colonies. Both the 20 c and 30 c have been retouched (including those of the colonies), by reducing the ten thin lines to the right of Christ's head to 5 thicker lines.



The mint stamps are reasonably priced, but used are very expensive. Caution should be exercised if purchasing used ones to ensure they are postmarked in the June 11 to June 30, 1923 time period.

If you collect something special, let others know about your collection and maybe they have something that would enhance it.





# **Pre-production** ~ **Progressive** proofs

Once the design has been chosen and approved the next step is the production of the die or its equivalent, depending on the printing process to be employed. For example, in intaglio printing the design is cut into a die; the die is used to make a roller; the roller is used to multiply the design as many times as needed onto the printing base and the printing base is used to print on paper.

A die is a small piece of metal, usually steel, but sometimes copper and very occasionally other materials such as wood, ivory or even plastic. the design is cut into the die by hand or by a combination of handwork etching or machine tooling. The equivalent of the die used for process such as photolithography and photogravure is a photographic negative produced by a special camera.

The hand-cutting of the die is a lengthy process demanding great skill and patience. As work progresses the engraver will arrange for prints to be made from the die in order to check how work is shaping. These prints are called "progressive proofs" or "engraver's proofs". They are usually unique, with multiple copies existing for only the completed design.

# Another Form of Cover: "The Parcel Card"

Illustrated is a 'Bulletin d'expedition', created by the Universal Postal Union back in the 1880's to accompany a parcel and prepay its postage, express fees, and even customs charges. I found this item completely by accident, as it was listed in eBay by its destination, Hong Kong, not Switzerland.

It contains two of Switzerland's most beautiful stamps, a set of four representing the four Evangelists, as carved in wood in St. Oswald's church. The stamps had a very long life-time, although the two lowest values (3 francs and 5 francs) were soon overtaken by a definitive series, these remained current throughout the 1990's.

As a collectable, there are two schools of thought: first, it is very difficult to reconcile the value of the stamps attached to any particular parcel rate, since other services and taxes may be included; and, as some of these services are purely fiscal, the stamps may or may not have been postally used. On the other hand, the cancels used are postal and the condition of the high values is generally far better than those used on a physical parcel, subject to great wear and tear.

A "Parcel Card", more properly termed a "Despatch Note", is sent along with the parcel and frequently attached to a customs form issued by the sending country – as seems to have been the case here.

Acknowledge that the rates involved will remain a mystery. We do know:

- The sender, probably Vietnamese or ethnic Chinese, resided in Meyrin, where the postage and fees, if any, were paid.
- A carton of something, weight, 3kg., was sent.
- A parcel registration sticker at the upper right gave the Meyrin post office number, 1217 a suburb of Geneva, in fact.
- The parcel was next handled within Geneva, shown by the attached sticker '1215 Geneve 15'.
- It was also cleared of customs at the Geneva airport the following day, as shown by the boxed cancel.
- The Hong Kong post office did not attempt to get a signature from the addressee; the space for this is blank on the reverse.

However, it seems most likely that it was received; the sender asked for it to be returned in case of non-delivery and no further markings are to be found. The card was, for the record, purchased from an American seller!

The parcel card is very common in some jurisdictions and rare in others, depending on whether it was kept by the post office or released to sender or recipient. It is, for example, relatively difficult to find those used to or from Canada. But in this case, though not of much use in my study of Hong Kong postal procedures, this card offers a glorious use of my favourite high-value Swiss stamps!








# Eighth World Jamboree Covers

The Eighth World Jamboree was held at Niagara-On-The-Lake August 18 to August 28, 1955. A stamp (Scott 356) honoring this Jamboree was issued on August 20, the official opening day. Over 150 different First Day cachets/covers have so far been identified for this event. Here are a few that are slightly different.

The cover below is "Inbound" mail to the Jamboree. It was mailed from Ancaster, Ontario on August 20, the first day of issue, and addressed to the Manager, Bank of Montreal, Jamboree Village, Niagara-On-The-Lake.



This cover was also mailed on the first day, August 20, to someone in Johannesburg, South Africa.



It is the cancellation that is interesting. It has "British Mail Office/Night Staff/Aug 20 1955/Toronto, Ont.". Was this accepted by Canada Post as a legitimate diplomatic use?

These two covers are "Postage Due" examples from the Jamboree.



Both were mailed on First Day, August 20, from the Jamboree. The first one is mailed to Hanover, Ont., while the second one was sent to Winnetka, Illinois. Both types of Jamboree cancels are shown (eg VIII 20 vs. 20 VIII), and they both received a penalty of twice the going rate of postage in the two countries (10 cents for Canada & 8 cents for the USA).

The Bank of Montreal in nearby St. Catharines decided to open a subbranch right in the Jamboree. One of their employees, Mr. Rudolph Koci, managed it. This was an excellent choice since Mr. Koci was an ex-Czech Scout and spoke six languages. The Jamboree Camp Chief, Mr. Jackson Dodds was the first to deposit some money and thus held Account #1. The first Scouts to use it were Jan Olof Tengo (Sweden), Humphrey de Vries (Curacao, Dutch West Indies) and Alan Stevenson (Kent, England).





The original mailing card was <u>recancelled</u> December 26, 1979 and used as a mailing label to return the developed film from CFB Ottawa to Corps de Cadets, Anjou PQ; again paying the parcel post rate of \$2.35 for 1.5 kg using a Pitney Bowes postage meter with 540000 serial block; shows 'Final Notice' stamp dated March 12.


This example is a Self-addressed Canadian Forces card used for mailing undeveloped photographic film in a canister from Corps de Cadets, Anjou PQ to CFB Ottawa; with circular date stamp SUCC-STN. ANJOU No. 3 MONTREAL, P.Q. December 12, 1979; parcel post rate paid \$2.35 for 1.5 kg.





PEMEX FDC cancelled

on March 8, 1979 at Pembroke Ont, was 'recancelled' on the back of the cover at Pembroke Ont on September 29, 1979 to commemorate the actual PEMEX show.



A homemade cache is attached to a cover commemorating Ronald Reagan's visit to Canada on March 10, 1981 at the Postal Museum in Ottawa. New US stamps were added and it was 'recancelled' on World Peace Day, December 8, 2005 in Washington DC - many years before presidents had orange hair.

So, now you can go through your collection(s) and look for some similar items or, spend some time in the dollar boxes at your next stamp show! Have fun!

# 'Recancelled' philatelic items (Canada $17^{\mathbb{C}}$ definitive)

There were times in history when a word evolved to describe an item or process that was specific to the philatelic community. The words 'perfin' and 'cancel' are good examples of words became sufficiently popular to make it into mainstream. Words tweaked by prefixes such as, 're' or 'pre' to further enhance the meaning. Philatelic examples are 'reposted', 'remailed', 'precancel' and 'precanceled'.

Now, the philatelic community has another need for a particular word ... to describe the action of applying, usually at a later date, additional cancelmarkings on a philatelic item that had served its original purpose and was canceled appropriately; the additional cancel is intentional and may add value or usefulness to the original canceled item. Additional cancels may be applied to items that are postally used, or items serving a philateliccollectable purpose.

There are many things that we may redo in life – reapply for a job; rezone a property; reboot your computer; remarry for money. In these examples, the word suggests that the original purpose was fulfilled and a subsequent action was taken that is similar in nature to the original purpose. I am suggesting, the following word(s) to fulfill this philatelic need - 'recancel', or 'recancelled' in the past tense. Neither word appears on the internet or in any mainstream dictionary; nor do they appear in the Scrabble dictionary!

I am sure most collectors have a 'recancelled' item in their collection but don't know it. The following examples contain at least one 17¢ definitive stamp, used correctly, within period of March 8, 1979 to December 31, 1981.



Void unless Post Office Meter impression or Postage Due Stamps are value of Postage due paid. Nu à moins de porter un empreinte de compteur de Postes ou des timbres-taxe pour la valeur du port dû payé. Postage due receipt was postmarked in Waterloo, Ontario on June 1, 1979 and sent by the post office to its intended destination. Correct postage was affixed. Then the post office did two things – applied a precancelled meter postage and a pen strike over the stamp.

Does this item depict a double 'recancel' or just a double cancel? You decide....

Nothing I read but philatelic lore;


And when some specimen of choice I buy,


