

Poland Local Posts 1915-1918: Sosnowiec

This a fourth article on the subject of Local Posts in Poland 1.

In Sosnowiec the regional German administration gave permission for the municipal administration of the town to provide Local Post delivery services and charge a fee for the service. This permission however was from the regional administration and although authorization from the German Post and Telegraph to issue stamps had not been given Sosnowiec did issue

stamps. The first set of two was issued 19 February 1916 and showed the town crest. Three months later on May 24th the same design was used and the second set printed in different colours along with a vertical wide coloured band. Both sets saw a very limited use since on July 8th Cerman Posta



use since on July 8th German Postal authorities banned their use.



A third stamp, or label, was issued July 24th, in a triangular shape with no denomination. On August 8th German authorities also prohibited the use of this stamp. Afterwards indications of payment for mail delivery were made by the use of the square cancellation device used to cancel the unauthorised stamps.



A Sesquicentennial Project

At the February 2017 meeting of the Philatelic Specialists Society of Canada it was agreed that the Society would produce a philatelic salute to honour Canada's 150 years of Confederation. Members were to prepare single page displays each representing one year since 1867. There were no restrictions beyond a common type size and page margins. The plan was to unveil the display at the Greene Foundation Open House on July 8 after which the pages would be scanned and printed as a souvenir book.



An additional printing will be done early in 2018. To obtain a copy of this publication please see the advertisement elsewhere in this PhilaJournal for details.

The page representing 1879 tells the story of Sir Sandford Fleming and his proposal for Standard Time as presented by Michel Houde To simply state that the project was a success would be understatement. As the project coordinator I was absolutely amazed by the diversity of the submissions. While some of the material was extremely valuable or rare, the majority was reasonably "common" stuff presented in a personally unique fashion. The book was published in December with the entire first printing being sold. A limited edition of 25 hard cover books was also completely sold.

Italian Libya

Libyan history is hundreds of years old. Libya has been ruled by Carthaginians, Persians, Egyptians, Greeks and Italians (the Roman Empire). Libya is in North Africa, situated directly south of Italy on the shores of the

Mediterranean Sea. It is surrounded by six countries: on the east Egypt, along the south Sudan, Chad and Niger, on the west, Algeria, and on the north-west Tunisia. Libya is made up of three major regions: Tripolitania, Cyrenaica and Fezzan, and its capital is Tripoli. Tripolitania is located at the northwestern part of the country, Cyrenaica on the north- eastern part and Fezzan is located south of Tripolitania. Since 1551, Libya was loosely held by the Ottoman Empire (Turkey and southern Europe), but in 1911 Italy fought for





and won over the area of Libya.

Italy was interested in the fertile coastal areas, important for grapes, oranges, almonds, dates, raising camels, sheep and cattle. When



Italy assumed the area of Libya, the population was just under one million. Today, the entire country has a population of 6.3 million (GTA population is 6.4 million). Initially, the area was known as an Italian North Africa, but the name Libya was widely used. Stamps were issued by all the three regions as well as Libya. Italian Libya stamps were issued between 1912 and 1940, Cyrenaica and Tripolitania stamps were issued from 1923 to 1935. Libya

issued a number of regular, semi-postal, airmail, special delivery, postage due and parcel post stamps. Many of them are very hard to find and are very expensive, especially the higher denomination and the used stamps.

The North Toronto Stamp Club is celebrating its 80th anniversary in 2018

The North Toronto Stamp Club (NTSC in short) was founded in 1938. As Europe was rapidly drifting towards war, it was not the best time to start up a stamp Club. However, the Club managed to survive through its first decade and in the mid-50s was already a very active component of Toronto's philatelic community.

Through the commitment and dedication of its members, NTSC has thrived through these 80 years to become one of the most vibrant Clubs in Ontario and probably in Canada. Members of the Club are actively involved in the major philatelic organizations in Canada, they exhibit nationally and internationally, give lectures and presentations on philatelic subjects on a regular basis, write articles for philatelic magazines etc. The wealth of philatelic information available at NTSC in all philatelic fields is one of the major attractions for new members and beginner collectors, as at every club meeting, they can meet very experienced collectors who are very keen to share information and mentor them.

As an average of 40 to 50 members attend each Club meeting, the Programme Manager faces a continuous challenge to try to organize events which satisfy the interest of all its members. Every meeting ends up being different from the others as new ideas are explored. At the same time members can find the opportunity to browse through large stocks of stamps which are available in the sales circuit books, the members' tables, the 10 cents books section and the two tables available to visiting dealers.

The North Toronto Stamp Club is planning to celebrate its 80th anniversary throughout the whole year, with some different initiatives launched at each Club meeting. For example, on the January 11 meeting, our Members were surprised with "1938" themed gifts. There was a special draw of a collection of exactly 1938 different stamps (Picture 2) and all Members born in 1938 or earlier received a special philatelic gift (Picture 1). The second meeting in January, which is also our AGM, saw a special "Birthday" celebration, including the cutting of a Birthday cake. 
Confusion about Pre-production Stamps

Many collectors are confused by these terms. They hear them from time to time. They may have some vague idea of what they mean. Let's clear up the confusion.

An essay is a proposed design for a stamp. The design was not adopted though. The design differs in some way from the issued stamp. Some essays are for stamps that were never issued. Some essays may closely resemble the final approved design of a stamp. Essays were used to evaluate the different possibilities for a stamp design.

Proofs come in two forms, die proofs and plate proofs. Both are for issued stamps. A die proof is an imprint of the die block itself. A plate proof is an imprint of the full printing plate. Sometimes you'll hear the terms "small die proof" or "large die proof". That has nothing to do with the die itself. It relates to the size of the paper that the proof was printed on. These proofs are in the same color as the issued stamps, or in a color very close to the issued color. Printers prepared these for the postal administration to examine and approve them before going to the printing press.

Trial Color Proofs are also in the same design as the issued stamp, but they come in varying colors. Most trial color proofs are die proofs, but a few are plate proofs. These were produced in different colors from the issued stamp to determine which color looked best before going to press. I only scratched the surface on essays and proofs here. There is so much more to learn.



1st St. Andrews Scout Troop

The postcard below is an interesting "QSL" card. A QSL card is usually sent by a ham radio operator to confirm receipt of a transmission sent by another operator. It usually comments on the strength of the reception and maybe also leaves a more personal message.



This one is from ham station **VE1KW** and mailed to someone in Burton-on-Trent, England, with a cancellation from St. Andrews, NB on Oct.27, 1938. On the left side it has printed "First St. Andrews Scout Troop". Below that the operator typed some comments on the quality of reception. Along the bottom it identifies this operator's equipment and frequencies, and a remark saving "hpe to wrk Eng. this wntr.". The right side has "Van Horne Scout Hall" printed. The home of that same First St. Andrews Scout Troop is shown on the next postcard. For those who recall some Canadian history, Van Horne was responsible for pushing the construction of the Canadian Pacific Railway out west, building the Chateau Frontenac Hotel in Quebec City, and the Chateau Lake Louise in Alberta. He had built a summer residence by St. Andrews, which is probably how the scout hall got its name. Scout radio communications became very popular in 1957 when the first "Jamboree-On-The-Air" was held. Since then it is held every year on the third full weekend in October. Hundreds of thousands of scouts and guides around the world link up with a ham operator to contact others in distant lands.

The Long Arm of the Cape Government Railway

This postcard of 1891 is uprated by a half-penny, as it travelled beyond the frontier into the Orange Free State – but it was carried all the way by the

Cape Railway. The card has the interesting Oudtshoorn octagonal cancel – which is why it was purchased! – But it tells an interesting story when examined more closely. It was sent from one station master to another and concerned the transmission by rail of a parcel. The address

THE ADDRESS ONLY TO BE WRITTEN ON deuburo 16 AON 9 Z

had to be corrected; there was no station master at Reddersberg so it had to be handled by the counterpart at Edenburg (the two places are a few miles apart). The text is as follows: Dear Sir – I have forwarded to you address RL R E, 1 bag tobacco for Mr. Rud. Lilienfeld, Reddersberg, which please treat in the usual way and oblige" –signed by Josef Matare.

What is the story here? Josef Matare is traceable through the Internet; he was a pro-British member of the local community and lived on until 1921. Lilienfeld is still a common name around Reddersberg, though I cannot trace Rudolph. And the routing?

Following the discovery of gold in the Transvaal, in 1886 the Cape government had made an arrangement with the Orange Free State to build and operate a railway through the OFS all the way to Johannesburg. The line reached Bloemfontein in 1890 and reached the Transvaal in 1892. From

Oudtshoorn, the southern end of the line, the card took two days to arrive in Edenburg, where it was back stamped; the Station Master applied his own cachet (ed.



Purple) the following morning and sent it on to Reddersberg, which had no post office until the following



year. So on the first blush, a card of no elegance turns out to have a fascinating connection to the South African gold rush and the rush to develop an infrastructure to service it!


