Polish Post special editions



Original and Blackprint commemorating the 100th anniversary of winning the Nobel Prize in Chemistry by Marie Curie.

The Polish Post (Poczta Polska www.pocztapolska.pl) often issues souvenir sheets in both perforated and imperforate versions. Very, very few issues are also printed as the so called "Blackprints" (czarnodruki), where the souvenir sheet is printed from the original plates but only in black. These issues denomination have the crossed out and are not postally valid (cannot be

used on mail). At other times small souvenir sheets or blocks known as "Newprints" (nowodruki) are similarly issued to publicize philatelic events. Again, these items have the denomination crossed out and have no postal validity.

Lately Polish Post has also begun to issue special souvenir blocks as matched numbered sets, however these items are not offered to the general public but rather are distributed to members of the Polish Philatelic Union. These souvenir blocks bear the following wording, "Made using the original production plates" and "For members of the Polish Philatelic Union for the promotion of collecting postage stamps issued by the Polish Post". These items also have no postal validity.

(Ed.: These are issued in limited quantities, are very sought after and usually realise higher prices)

Running a [Stamp] Show



So, you are thinking about running an event? Want to know what's involved, how much work it is, and if you can handle it? You can do it!

I know, because I just helped organize **Royal 2019 Royale** in Mississauga and if I can do it, you can do it.

Why bother? It's a lot of work and no pay. Everyone has their own motives, but I chose to step up for two main reasons. As Sam Chiu put it, I wanted to "give back to the hobby". Sam was

talking about judging, but it applies to running a show as well.

I love stamp collecting, I like exhibiting, I like learning new stuff, I love history and I want the hobby to flourish and grow. So, I too want to "give back to the hobby". I did that by helping to run a **major** show. The second reason is you can shape the show and have more of the things you think people will like. What do you need to think about before starting? Every list will be slightly different, but my list was:

1) What type of show? Large national event, regional, or local show. Will you have exhibits, a bourse and/or seminar? How many days? What size event in both dealers and attendees? (All of this was pretty much decided for the Royal.)

2) Site. Where and when will you hold it? Is it available?

3) Committee. You can't do it alone. You will need experienced people to help. I had a bourse manager that has run shows and dealt with dealers for major shows in the past, an exhibit chair who had organized exhibits and seminars for major shows before. I had a floor manager who had set up all kinds and sizes of shows. I had a show program designer who had not only made a show program before, but even chaired a committee that ran a Royal. I also have a wonderful, understanding spouse who was not

only OK! with me dedicating all that time to the show, but who stepped up and organized the dinner, breakfast and many other things. She was more of a co-chairman than a helper. Good people with lots of experience - boy did it make my job easier!

4) Budget. You have an idea on what you want to do, where you want to do it and who is going to help. Now, you need to know if you can afford it; most clubs can't afford to lose a small fortune hosting a show. The numbers will be scary for a Royal, but rest assured that they are fully manageable.

Have a meeting and make a list of what needs to be done. Listen to the experienced helpers, and help mentor the inexperienced people. Constantly watch spending and update the budget. Don't forget the small stuff. If you miss them, not a big deal, but the more you remember, the smoother the show will run, and that will be noticed.

When the show arrives, make sure you have lots of helpers. People to sit at the front entrance and, direct people, to help lug stuff around, to run "to and fro" and to do undemanding little jobs, like holding the ribbons while someone tapes them to the frames. You need those people. And don't be afraid to ask them to do something.

It will be exhausting and there will be many little issues to decide on. My only advice here is: Don't override a committee member that has decided on a course of action without talking to them first. Even then, unless it is crucial, don't do it. Lastly, be organized. One of the things I would change is email control. I would read all my emails, answer some immediately and set aside some to look at after I found the answer. I lost track of some and didn't answer those people at all; that was rude, and I apologise to anyone that I did that to. So, yeah, organize your correspondence.

Would I do it again? YES. In fact, I have started talking about running a regional show in Ontario, possibly co-sponsored by the Grand River Valley Philatelic Association and the Greater Toronto Area Philatelic Alliance. I followed the four steps from above to get started. I know what type of show, the size, what I want to do. I have not formed a committee yet but know who I will ask for each job. I am just waiting on the OK! from the GVRPA and GTAPA, and seeing what dates are available at the chosen site. Stay tuned for further information!

So, all I can say is – go ahead and do it. It will be worth it.

Montecassino Abbey Stamps



Montecassino is a rocky hill about 81 miles south east of Rome and is adjacent to the town of Cassino. It is best known for its Abbey, the first house of the Benedictine Order of St. Benedict. History for Montecassino dates back to around 570. In the 11th and 12th centuries, Pope Victor II recognized Montecassino Abbey and encouraged fine art and craftsmanship, and during this period 3 Popes were drawn from the Abbey.



In 1929, Italy issued a set of 7 stamps for the founding of the Abbey of Montecassino by St. Benedict in 529. The stamps picture the rebuilding of the Abbey, the death of St. Benedict, and the Abbey. The set is reasonably priced mint, but catalogued at over \$600USD used.

During the Italian Campaign of World War II, the Abbey was heavily damaged and rebuilt after the war which is depicted on the two stamps issued in 1951. The denominations are 20 and 55 lire. The higher denomination



catalogues at \$50USD used.

Today the Abbey is a historic landmark visited by many tourists.

Forgeries of Sicily and Roman States.

On June 27th, 2019 I gave a presentation at the North Toronto Stamp Club about Italian forgeries, with a particular focus on the stamps of the Roman States and Sicily. The purpose of the presentation was to show to my fellow collectors what tools are available on the internet that will allow them to identify many forgeries on their own.

After talking to many collectors (and dealers) about stamps of the Italian States, I have realized that many of them do not have a good knowledge of the stamps of the Italian States, so they are prone to making mistakes; so it is important that collectors (and dealers) learn how to examine them on their own before making a costly purchase.

Through my internet searches, I discovered that there are a few tools available online to help gain a good knowledge of Italian stamps, and make a fairly good assessment on their own.

The best tool I found is a website called: http://forgeriesofitalianstates.com,



it is a fantastic site, which allows you to compare pictures of genuine stamps with images of the most well-known forgeries. At the bottom of each picture appears a list of all the key differences between the specific

forgery and the genuine stamp. By simply following the instructions on the website, you will be able to tell not only if your stamp is a forgery, but also who the forger that made it was.

Until I discovered this website, I used to create my own support pages, detailing all the differences between each genuine Italian stamp and their forgeries, but now I no longer need to do so, as all the necessary information is available on the aforementioned website.

Another website that I recommend using is: http://stampforgeries.com.



This website simply shows pictures of genuine stamps alongside those of the most common forgeries. In the case of those forgeries that can be easily recognized through a simple comparison with a genuine stamp, this website will suffice. The beauty of this website is that it does not only show forgeries of stamps of the Italian States; it is also possible to find information on forgeries of stamps from several other countries as well.

It is always important to remember that the starting point in identifying any forgery is firstly to compare it with a good picture of a genuine stamp; a simple comparison will help you to identify some of the most common forgeries present on the market.

This is particularly true for the stamps of Sicily, of which you do not need to be an expert in order to identify some of the most common forgeries.

I also recommend visiting another website: www.italianstates.com. It is available both in English and Italian, and contains high quality images of all the genuine stamps of the Italian states.

There is also another very good website: www.ibolli.it, but unfortunately this one is only available in Italian.

I hope that with this information you will feel more confident in examining the stamps of the Italian States present in your collection, or those which are offered to you. In any case, if you still have any doubts, you can always contact me at **stampsofitaly@yahoo.ca** and send me a good quality picture of the stamp you wish me to examine.





You Never Know What you find

(Originally published in Markham Stamp Club's newsletter in January 2019)



You never know what you can find at the Markham Stamp Club meetings. At one of their November meetings I picked up the cover you see displayed here. It was in one of the big boxes with hundreds of covers. What is remarkable about

this cover, is that it shows postage of two different postal authorities. The result of a historical event of the 20th century: Reunification of Germany. Three stamps are from East Germany (Scott # 2850-52), two from West Germany (Scott # 1614, 1615). For a short time some stamps from either Germany were valid in the other.

East Germany (official name "Deutsche Demokratische Republik", or short "DDR") used on their stamps no longer their acronym DDR, but showed "Deutsche Post" as of July 2, 1990. These and stamps issued until East Germany ceased to exist on October 3, 1990, were valid in the entirety of Germany until the end of 1991. West-Germany (in German: "Bundesrepublik Deutschland" or 'BRD") changed their name on stamps from "Bundespost" to "Deutschland" on May 5, 1995 with Scott # 1894.

The other interesting aspect about this cover is that the sender was a philatelist. A handwritten request on it shows the concern of the sender: "Bitte philat. stempeln! Danke" (Please, cancel philatelic! Thank you). It was no accident that stamps from two postal authorities were chosen for this mailing.

Unfortunately the postmark's date is not legible. I can only make out that it originated in Eisleben, the birthplace of Luther and the site of his death. Besides the town the postmark has a slogan that reads "Schweissautomaten" (in English: welding robots). I am not sure what the purpose of this slogan is; just a mystery that does not need to be solved.



Canada Picture Post Stamps - Scouting and Guiding.



The Maple Leaf Chapter of SOSSI staffed a booth at the Royal 2019 show in Mississauga in June. We produced a cover and a Picture Post celebrating both the Royal show and the World Scout Jamboree held in West Virginia, U.S.A. from July 22 to August 2 this year.


The stamp shows the Canadian contingent badge, which also has a small copy of the World Jamboree badge in its design.



Early Picture Posts provided a frame into which you could paste some image.



The first one has a photo of the 2nd Halifax Troop at CJ'01 (Canadian Jamboree 2001) in Cabot Park, PEI, while



the second one inserts the Jamboree logo for the Pacific (BC/Yukon) Jamboree at Roberts Creek, BC in 2003.

There are now 55 known Canadian scouting / guiding Picture Post stamps. As more and more are created, it provides an interesting philatelic sub-topic to focus on.

Canadian Boy Scout & Girl Guide Philatelic Catalog. Version 3

Other than a few lists of cancellations, there has not been any other attempt at publishing a comprehensive catalog of Canadian Scouting/Guiding philatelic material.

This Catalog is a chronologically arranged, illustrated catalog of Canadian Boy Scout and Girl Guide stamps, cancellations and covers from the early years through to the end of 2018. It includes over 50 Picture Post issues, 150 cancellations and 2000 images of philatelic covers. There are many helpful appendices, including an extensive and detailed Index.

More than a mere philatelic catalog, this document is a valuable resource in describing and understanding the history of scouting and guiding in Canada. It records major events such as World Jamborees, Canadian and Provincial Jamborees, Girl Guide Camps and special anniversaries of a wide range of local and national organizations. The use of side-bars throughout the Catalog adds historical comments to the illustrations, making it interesting reading for any Scouting or Guiding enthusiast.

First (printed only) version had 242 pages and was published by "The Scouts On Stamps Society International" (SOSSI), in May, 2008. The pdf version has been on the SOSSI website for members only, since 2008.

I have finally convinced SOSSI to make the latest version open and freely accessible to the world. This Version 3 is now 447 pages, in full color, updated through 2018. It is now freely accessible on the SOSSI website at https://www.sossi.org/catalog/Manson/v3.pdf

Many of our GTAPA folks and other philatelists were in scouting in their youth & they may find it interesting. **ENJOY**



Covered bridges



Romantic and colourful covered wooden bridges are slowly disappearing from the Canadian countryside. At the end of the 19th Century there were 1,400. Now only about 140 remain, and those are giving way to more modern structures.

In June Canada Post

issued bright new stamps paying tribute to five of the most outstanding bridges. Located in picturesque parts of the country, the striking bridges are tourist attractions. Two bridges are located in Quebec, and one each in New Brunswick, Ontario, and British Colombia. All five are considered engineering marvels.

More than a century ago – in the era of the horse and wagon – two were known as "kissing bridges." One was New Brunswick's Hartland Bridge and the other Ontario's West Montrose covered bridge. Young men "trained" their horses to stop about half way across the bridge, wait while the couple shared a couple of kisses, and then continue to the other side of the bridge.

The longest covered bridge of its kind in the world – at 391 metres – the goings-on at the Hartland Bridge led to considerable opposition and concern when it was to be covered in the 1920s. At the West Montrose bridge, located in the Waterloo region, having to pay a toll didn't deter the young men. As the story goes, local girls learned to be wary when their escort's horse stopped inside the bridge without any command from the driver.

The West Montrose is Ontario's last historic covered bridge. It was constructed on the Grand River in 1881.

Powerscourt Covered Bridge, located in Elgin Township, built in 1861, it still stands on its stone foundation on the Châteauguay River. Félix-Gabriel-Marchand Bridge, known as Marchand Bridge or the Red Bridge, is a covered bridge in the Township of Mansfield-et-Pontefract, Quebec.

In B.C., Ashnola No. 1 railway bridge measures 135 metres across the Similkameen River. It is the sole survivor of five bridges that crossed the Similkameen River on the Great Northern Railway line from Oroville WA to Keremeos.


