

"Bombay - INDIA PAID" – Westward Sea-Post Mail

With the railway network in India being developed by the 1860's and then connecting several cities and the Bombay, Baroda and Central India (B.B & C. I.) Railway being developed gradually, mail was being delivered in shorter durations of time, than was possible earlier.



The "Bombay – INDIA PAID" postmarks shown here are from covers that were based on contracts agreed between shipping companies particularly, the Peninsular & Orient (P&O) Company and the Post Master(s) to facilitate the payment of postage of Indian mail going overseas.



[Postage: 14 annas] The Bengal Circle Type: 7; B 1 – Calcutta. Rectangular framed "INDIA PAID" marking. Addressed to LONDON: "Calcutta & South Eastern Railway". Received: April 20, 1860.

[Postage: 6 annas] The Bengal Circle Type: 7; B 113 – Midnapore 2 X Rectangular framed "INDIA PAID" markings. Mailed to: "Epping, England" Received: September 23, 1861.


The 4a stamp paid the rate via Southampton, the 2a paid the Packet fee from Midnapore to Bombay, facilitating the delivery of mail to England.

In a book that you will find Online titled "A Short History of the Expansion of the British Empire, 1500 – 1902" by author William Harrison Woodward and published by the CAMBRIDGE UNIVERSITY PRESS in England, the following passage describes how the city of "Bombay" came under British rule:

"...By his marriage Charles II acquired from Portugal (1661) the sovereignty of the island of Bombay, which in 1668 was handed over to the East India Company as a fortified possession of the Crown. Bombay was the first portion of the soil of India to own the dominion of the King of England. Its position was thus superior to that of Madras which was held on lease at a rent from a native prince. Being an island it was to some extent independent of the hostility of the Moghul or of his enemies, whilst its area (30 miles by 8) was sufficient to admit of large development..."

The island of Kastellorizo

Because of its proximity to the Turkish coast (only 2 km), the island has had a very interesting history both before and after the introduction of stamps.

The island of Kastellorizo or Castellorizo or Castelrosso in Italian is a small island of 12 square kilometers, at the edge of the Dodecanese archipelago.



Greek name, Megisti (biggest) can be unclear. The island is smaller than Dodecanese islands, such as Rhodes, but the island lies in the middle of its own little archipelago made of verv small islands: here Kastellorizo is definitely the biggest.

This article will only focus on the philatelic period but it should be mentioned that the island changed hands a few times after the Byzantine era and was ruled by the Knights Hospitaliers (now known as Order of Malta), the

Aragon Crown, Venice, and the Ottoman Empire. Its philatelic history starts under the Ottoman empire (see picture on right) where it was an important port in the region with a population, at its peak, of 10,000 people (compared to only 500 in recent years), of which about 90% were Greek and only 10% Turkish.



The population of Kastellorizo had already tried during the Greek independence war to join Greece, but after a long struggle between 1828 and 1833 and the illusion of becoming part of Greece, the island ended up again under the Ottoman Empire.

About 80 years later, in 1912, Italy started the Libyan war against the Ottoman empire and managed to take control of the island of Rhodes and the Dodecanese islands, just north of Kastellorizo. The population of the island saw the opportunity to free themselves from the Ottoman empire and sent a delegation to the Italian General Giovan Battista Ameglio asking him to occupy the island. But they were to be seriously disappointed as the General refused to send troops to Kastellorizo, explaining to them that the island was too close to the Turkish Coast and the Italian Fleet could be easily shot at by the Artillery Battery situated just opposite the island. Consequently, the Turkish garrison managed to keep control of the island for another year until the islanders decided to rebel against the Turks who were forced to abandon the island. Some Greek soldiers arrived from Samos to help the population to defend themselves against the Turks, however, the Turks did not react.

A set of 12 overprinted Greek stamps was prepared and used during this period. At the start of World War I, the French Navy started expanding its presence in the area and the French Troops occupied Kastellorizo in December 1915. That occupation lasted about 6 years. The French managed to keep the Turks away from the island however in 1917 the Turkish coastal artillery managed to hit and sink the British seaplane carrier HMS Ben-my-Chree anchored in Kastellorizo (as General Ameglio had predicted). In the beginning, the French Levant stamps were used on the island, but then in 1920, they were replaced by French stamps overprinted Kastellorizo. Three sets were issued in the 1920-21 period. Three different overprints: BNF (*Base Navale Francaise*), ONF (*Occupation Navale Francaise*), and OF (*Occupation Francaise*), while a fourth issue appeared at the last minute before the Frenchs' departure, is considered bogus. Samples of stamps on the next page. Covers from this period are very rare and have a high cost.



In 1921 the peace treaty assigned the island to Italy, as an extension of the Dodecanese, and this prompted the withdrawal of the French troops from the island. Unfortunately, that also caused a permanent split in the Kastellorizo archipelago as only the islands of Ro and Strongyli were assigned to Italy and all the others remained Turkish. The Italian tried unsuccessfully to also obtain the inhabited island of Kekova (Caravola), further south, which is now become a renowned archeological site. The Italian occupation lasted about 20 years and after a short period of 4 months where Italian stamps were used with Castellorizo cancels, five sets were issued in that period, of which 4 made of Italian overprinted stamps (Castelrosso) and one depicting the map of the island and of the surrounding area, including the Turkish



coast. During that time the island was used as a stopping port of seaplanes, which evidently also carried much sought-after airmail to various world destinations. To note that also the Dodecanese stamps could be used on the island so mix frankings of Dodecanese and Castelrosso stamps are not rare.





During World War II the Kastellorizo remained in Italian hands until the armistice of 8 September 1943, then it was occupied by British forces and the MEF overprinted stamps were introduced. Finally, in 1947 the island and the Dodecanese islands were handed over to Greece. which administered it as a separate territory first (1947 issue of Greek stamps overprinted S.D.D.) and then absorbed into Greece in 1948, starting the use of normal Greek stamps.

Kastellorizo now is a quiet tourist destination with a population that after a massive emigration (mostly to Australia) is reduced to 500 people. It is the most eastbound town in the European Union and the only place in the Union where the solar eclipse of 2006 could be seen in its totality (but that's another story). It has gained some international notoriety thanks to the Oscarwinning movie Mediterraneo, filmed and based on the island, and the recent dispute between Greece and Turkey for gas exploration rights in the sea waters just south of Kastellorizo.





The Only Undersea P.O. In The World

Recently, while rooting through some of the postal curiosities that I have picked up the last 12 years I have discovered a Cachet sent from "THE ONLY UNDERSEA POST OFFICE IN THE WORLD" posted in WILLIAMSON PHOTOSPHERE.



It is beautifully postmarked "SEA FLOOR MAY 6 1940 Bahamas", and it commemorates the 100th anniversary of the Penny Black, the world's first postage stamp.

A little history on the Photosphere... This underwater chamber was a brainchild of a man named John Ernest Williamson, who was a pioneer in underwater photography. He designed this chamber so that he could take photos of underwater creatures, viewing them through a thick glass window. Eventually, in order to raise publicity for his invention, he opened an underwater Post Office, where letters were sent down, canceled, sent back up to the surface & posted to collectors all over the world. This Post Office opened on Aug. 16, 1939, and closed sometime in 1941, as the world had bigger problems to deal with (WWII).

On July 1, 1938 Bahamas issued (in a set) a 4 penny King George VI stamp depicting the Sea Garden as seen through the Photosphere (SC# 106), shown on the cover. In 1965 Bahamas created a long set of Definitives, in which the 1 Shilling stamp shows the underwater Sea Garden (SC# 213) & a 5 Shilling stamp (SC# 216) shows the underwater Post Office.





Short, candid history of the Kawartha Stamp Club

Kawartha Stamp Club, 66 years.... and then some!



А enthusiastic verv of group stamp collectors have just gathered in person, for the second time during this phase of the pandemic. Ever since my pre-teen years as a member of the KSC, can I recall ever being at meeting where а

attendance has been low? Attendance has always been good with lots of variety in programs. In fact, there have been some evening meetings where if the start time was at 6 pm, people would be lining up by 5 o'clock.

The Kawartha Stamp Club (KSC) held its first regular meeting on Monday, March 19th, 1956. Some of the early philatelists were Dr. G. Langley, John Young, Charles Butcher, Marlow Banks, Jack Hales, George Benton, Frank Hickey, and Betty Killingbeck. Prior to this meeting, a lot of preliminary organization was undertaken by Kathryn Hansuld, wife of the late Richard M. Lamb of Kitchener, who regularly wrote a column on stamp collecting in the Peterborough Examiner. Assistance also came from Bill MacFarlane of the YMCA and Mr. Eric Rushton of the Canadian Philatelic Society. This brings us to 66 years of meetings.

But, there's more! While researching numerous philatelic journals from the late 1800s to the early 1900s, I have discovered that there was a group of collectors of the hobby regularly gathering, although there were no minutes of meetings or formalities as some of us have today. In my collection, I have a number of very early covers from two of Canada's early leading stamp dealers. One was Kelsey Hall of Peterborough and the other is Ketcheson of Belleville. Between these two dealers, they were very active in aiding collectors in the Peterborough and surrounding area.

Fast track to today, 2022. The KSC's second pandemic era meeting averaged 25 people, with all attendees complying with health regulation guidelines. The first meeting consisted of a live auction where 2-out-of-3 lots were sold. Collectors are hungry for stamps! Our most recent meeting consisted of every member bringing up to 3 items they wanted to sell-off. There's always a wide selection of 5 and 10 cent books to shop through. Plus, we

occasionally have items from estates sales, in-club dealers, and we invite guest dealers (where they are the only dealers present).

Our program and KAPEX show director, Peter Evelyn has been, and continues to do an excellent job putting together programs for our meetings, and organizing our upcoming show KAPEX '22, which will be held on April 23rd, at the same location of our regular meetings, Westdale United Church, 1509 Sherbrooke St. W, Peterborough





Province of Saxony "Down & Upstairs" Watermarks



When I first began collecting German stamps I must admit I paid little attention to Allied Occupation stamps issued by the then Soviet Union.

However, after acquiring my Michel catalogue I quickly gained a greater appreciation for just how diverse and



collectible many of these stamps are. Today I still wince when I reflect on

how I discarded so many (a collector's key sin) because of my limited knowledge of these so-called "DDR" stamps. Fortunately, it's never too late to live and learn which in Philately, is perhaps one of the intrinsic joys of this wonderful hobby.

After World War II the occupied Eastern part of Nazi Germany came under Soviet administration and the reestablishment of a regular postal service eventually became necessary.

To this end the German Democratic

Republic (GDR), as it would later be referred to, began issuing new stamps in the five regions under their control.

In particular, a total of 19 definitive stamps and 7 special stamps were issued in the Province of Saxony between October 1945 and February 1946. In this article, I will briefly touch on the three Definitive Stamp Series (I, II, III) each depicting the **Provisional Saxony (SACHSEN) Coat of Arms**.

Varieties Abound

There are many known varieties of Saxony stamps and a single constant. The genuine 1Y (>) watermark stamps and one of the many varieties require the Bund Philatelistischer Prüfer (BPP) expert assessment! However, in addition to the lucrative 1Y watermark, there are over thirty catalogued "plate flaws" of this stamp series (It should be noted CV only applies to MNH or Used stamps). For instance, PFENNIG a Series III 10 pf stamp is spelled with an "O" instead of "P" and the listed CV for this particular plate flaw is about \$700 CAD.

For those who may be contemplating collecting another country, I would first encourage you to consider taking another look at the stamps of the GDR. The field is as broad as it is varied and armed with the knowledge found in a specialized German catalogue (written in English I might add) would undoubtedly be a wise investment in fun and enjoyment for years to come.

The advent of various methods of Air Mail in the 1930s, but first a bit about me.

My interest in stamp collecting started when I was a schoolboy holidaying with my parents on the Isle of Wight, U.K. I purchased a small collection of Newfoundland stamps at a traditional Stamp shop. The Newfoundland name fascinated me and I suppose to a young boy, it was a place far away and an island "newly found" and mysterious.

Following the completion of my university degree in Power Electronics, and perhaps with "Newfoundland" tucked away in the back of my brain, I immigrated to Canada!

Within two weeks of arriving in Mississauga, I was employed by Picker X-ray Mfg. in Brampton. Within 12 months I met my future wife Susan, who is originally from Saskatchewan. I began traveling for work and over the next 20 years, I progressed through the company ranks to the position of Engineering Manager eventually moving to the US in 1989 and living in Chagrin Falls, near Highland Heights, Ohio where I worked.

With a busy career, I endeavored to find time (as a stress reliever) to concentrate on collecting 1935 & 1977 Silver Jubilee worldwide stamp issues and related First Day Covers (FDCs), visiting local stamp fairs and major exhibitors wherever I went. I started seriously collecting FDCs after a visit, with my father, to Bletchley Park, U.K. Famous for code-breaking efforts during WWII. I invite you to read my article <u>"The Enigma of Cover Collecting" in PhilaJournal #68 (Vol. XVII #4, 2019.)</u>

In 1998 my Company changed ownership and we made a family decision to return to Canada. I took on a position with Communications and Power Industries (CPI) in Georgetown, Ontario as the Business Development Manager for Europe and U.K. This meant more traveling and visiting local stamp exhibitions and fairs all over Europe on weekends and evenings.

Upon retirement, my horizons widened and I have continued to build my stamp and cover collections... "Newfoundland" was the beginning of a great adventure and is still on my bucket list to visit after the virus is under control.


And now to the topic of various methods of Air Mail in the 1930s...

I will present the major means of transporting mail via Catapult Mail (WN.79); Balloon Air Ships (WN.80); Imperial Airways Mail (WN.81) and Newfoundland Inauguration Mail Flight plus a little extra of "Little Known Facts" (WN.82). Hope you enjoy these.


Catapult Air Mail Delivery by Aircraft & Ships

Innovative ways to deliver mail across continents using ships and aircraft have gone hand-in-hand since the early 1900s. However, there was none more unique than the development and introduction of the Catapult Mail system in 1929. In 1927, the German Transport Ministry sought to speed up transatlantic mail service to America. To do so, they entered into agreements with the North German Lloyd (Norddeutscher-Lloyd or NDL) shipping line, Lufthansa, and the German Postal Service (Reichspost). The NDL outfitted two ships, the Bremen and the Europa, with floatplanes and catapult

equipment. When the ship approached the aircraft's flight range to the destination shore. the airplane was catapulted off the ship and the plane would flv the remaining distance with the mail. This allowed delivery of mail to shore while the ships were still



500-800 km from the port. Delivery from Europe to North America was cut down by approx. 20 to 30 hours from the westward voyages, and more dramatically, 24 to 48 hours off the eastward trips.



Westbound mail mostly flew into New York although there were some flights into Boston. Eastbound flights initially went to Cologne, Cherbourg, Amsterdam, and Bremerhaven. However, after July 21, 1930, flights all went to Southampton. Catapult mail operated mainly between May and October, due to the harsh weather conditions making the program impractical during the winter months. The service ran from a test period in 1929 to regular operation through the summers of 1930 to 1936.



pieces carried.

The mail originated from three sources: Inland Germany, Danzig (German/Polish) port on the Baltic Sea, or on-board sea post. Most letters carried on-board bears a red Norddeutscher Lloyd cachet and a black first-flight cachet. The last "9" in the flight cachet date is a modified "8".

On 22 July 1929, the Bremen launched its first catapult flight to New York. Mail carried on the flight was stamped with a serial number, with a total of 10,997





In 1933, a catapult airmail service was also instituted for ocean liners on the Germany-South America routes. This service was in operation until 1939.

The mail delivery from Europe to South America was even more impressive; achieving 4-day delivery from up to two weeks before.

Unlike the North Atlantic Catapult Post in which mail was typically carried by airplane only on the final leg of each journey, mail on the South Atlantic routes was carried by plane on both ends of the routes, with the ship carrying mail between Spanish Island Las Palmas, to Brazilian Island Fernando de



mail between Spanish Island Las Palmas, to Brazilian Island Fernando de Noronha. The above map illustrates the Route, with Catapult Ship in black and Seaplane or conventional plane in red.

Flights continued to South America from Cherbourg and other European Ports, with mail being loaded onto Bremen and Europa at those locations, continued until the outbreak of WWII in 1939.

These northbound covers are



Catapult service on the Europa, to and from North America, ceased due to the introduction of mail service on the Zeppelin airship Hindenburg (LZ-129) in 1936. South American routes ended with the outbreak of WWII.




