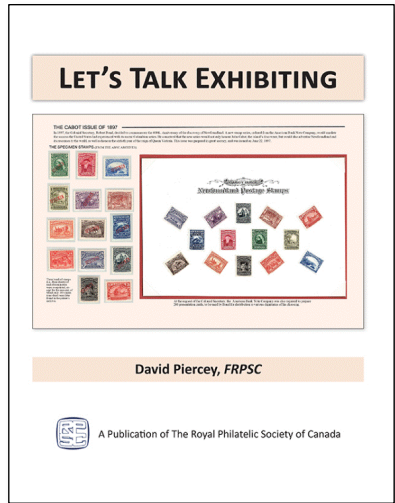
CAPEX 22 International One-Frame Stamp Championship Exhibition is fast approaching, being held in downtown’s Metro Toronto Convention Centre.

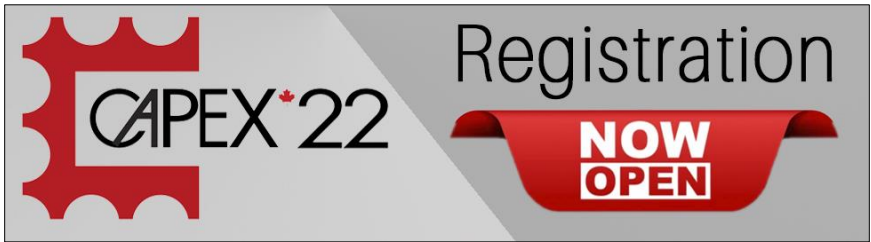

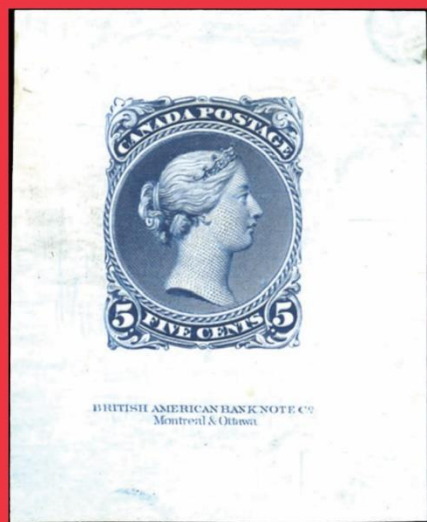

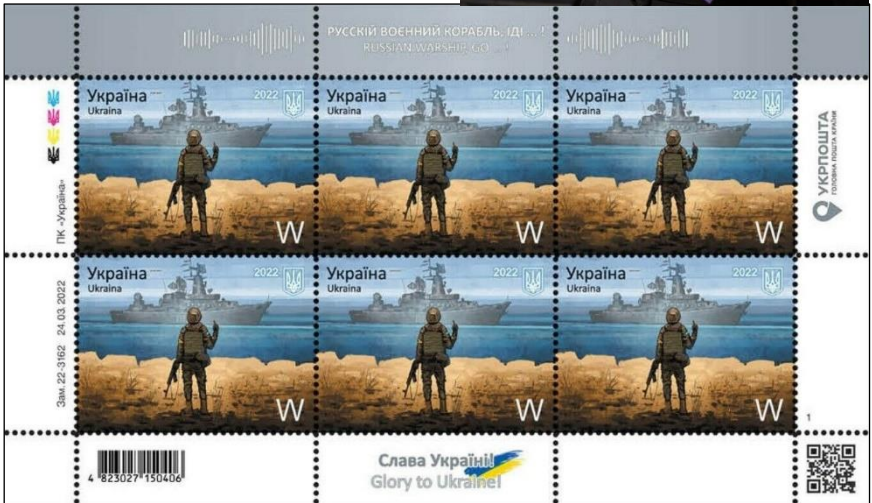

The Italians and Ukraine: Over 200-Year-Old Bond

Very few people know that Italians have been living on the Ukrainian coast of the Black Sea for over 200 years. It all initiated with the Republics of Genova and Venice which established commercial bases near the Black Sea to support their trade with the eastern European countries.

Italians began living in all the cities along the coast from Odessa to Mariupol to Feodosiia (the old Genova enclave of Caffa) to Kerch. They liked the area so much that they never returned back home to Italy.

The largest immigration took place between 1780 and 1800 when the Italian population reached over 20,000 people and about 10% of Odessa's population was Italian. In fact, Odessa was founded by an Italian, Giuseppe de Ribas, born in Naples, who was an officer of the Neapolitan Navy, assigned as an attaché' to Admiral Potemkin.

Giuseppe de Ribas saw the potential of the area near the small village of Khadjber and was allowed to develop a new town and a new port there, which he named Odesso in memory of an old Greek colony. The name Odesso was later converted to Odessa by decree of the Empress Catherine the Great. Odessa became very rapidly the most important seaport of the Black Sea, also thanks to the intensive trade connections that de Ribas helped to establish with the major Italian ports. Because of these early connections, Italian was a language widely spoken in Odessa and, in certain areas, the street names and even passports or other official documents were written in Italian.

In those early times, many famous Italians lived there or visited the region, including the Italian hero Giuseppe Garibaldi who worked on ships based in the area.

The architecture of the city was also influenced by Italians as the architect Francesco Frapolli designed the Opera House and the Trinity Church.

Thanks to the Opera House many Italian Musicians and Artists continued to visit Odessa, such as Eleonora Duse and Tommaso Salvini.

Two Music Composers, Edoardo Di Capoa and Giovanni Capurro were staying in Odessa in 1898 when they came up with the idea of a new song “O Sole Mio” (My Sun) which

was probably inspired by the beautiful dawn seen on the Black Sea, and which, then, rapidly became a symbol of Naples and Italy in the world. The Italian presence on the Black Sea Coast remained very strong until WWI and the Russian revolution when many Italians returned back home.

Afterward, with the advent of fascism in Italy, quite a few antifascists emigrated to Russia and ended up in Ukraine. Unfortunately during the Stalin era, things changed dramatically for the Italians living on the coast of the Black sea.

Even though some of them had been living in that area for 8 to 10 generations (and in many cases did not speak Italian anymore) and some had immigrated more recently to escape fascism, Stalin became obsessed with the idea of eradicating fascism and under his orders, all Italians or Ukrainians of Italian descent (about 10,000) were deported to Atbasar in North Kazakhstan. Upon the arrival of the train in Atbasar, two months later, half of the people had died in the train carriages and many more died in the prison camps that they were transferred to. In total, around 9,000 Italians (90%) died during the first couple of years after their expulsion.

Many years later the few survivors were allowed to return to the Black Sea under Nikita Krushchev's regime and ended up mostly in Kerch, where today they are trying to revamp their Italian roots and maintain the Italian traditions and language in their small but active community.

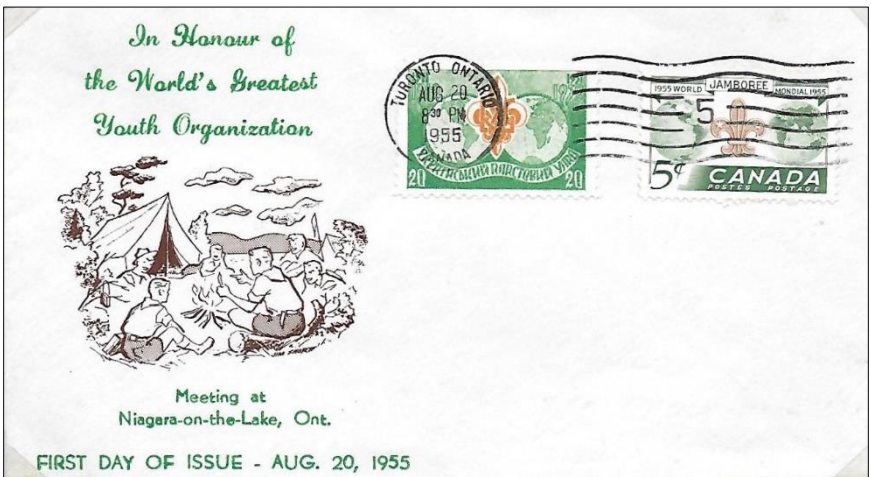
Scout Stamp Designs: Canada and Ukraine

On August 20, 1955, Canada issued a scout stamp honoring the 8th World Jamboree held in Niagara-On-The-Lake. Shortly after, the designer of the stamp, Mr. L. Hyde remarked in an interview about the difficulty in coming up with a new design since so many countries had already used most scouting symbols. He was right – the September 1955 edition of “Stamps” in New York had an article commenting on the similarity of the Canadian stamp design to a set of five seals or labels issued by the *Ukrainian Plast* (Scout) organization three years earlier in 1952.



The set commemorated the 40th Anniversary of the *Plast* organization and had the Ukrainian scout emblem in the middle between two world globes, just like the design of the Canadian scout stamp.

Someone highlighted this in a first-day cover by placing one of the seals beside the new stamp and having it canceled in Toronto on the first day, August 20, 1955.

Were any of Ukraine's 1990s Provisional Stamps Archived?

During UkrainepeX-2018, which twinned with the APS Stampshow in Columbus·Ohio, Jerry Kalyn and I attended on Sunday, August 12th a 'meet-and-greet' by the Philatelic·Specialists·Society·of·Canada, of which I am a member, chaired by PSSC President Ingo Nessel. A major part of the event was a presentation by Jean-Jacques Tillard, of Saint·Pierre·et·Miquelon, a small group of islands just south of Newfoundland that fly under their version of France's flag. Tillard specializes in and exhibits his birthplace's stamps. His first language is French, and so another PSSC member, Michel Houde, helped with translation when necessary.

Since I enjoy the collection of overprints and imperfs, Ukraine's 1990s provisionals are perfect for me, and in major part, Tillard's presentation dealt with overprints. His slideshow lasted about ½-hour, after which there was a Q & A session.

During the Q & A session, there was some speculation with respect to the emergence and postal use of obscure overprint varieties. Judge Sam Chiu, who collects and exhibits Hong·Kong, a field that has had its fair share of overprints, asked if, such as was the case with Hong·Kong, these varieties could in any way be explained by stamps that had been archived, but then eventually used after all since it was common practice to not waste paper, a valuable commodity. (Where have Ukraine collectors heard this before?!)

Hmm, I thought. Such varieties (trials, proofs, precursors, a 'pristine' final product, etc.) are explained by stamps that had been archived but then eventually used during a 'nothing was ever wasted' period. Out of the 'stroke-of-genius' question that Chiu asked, ...

It is becoming apparent to me that this 'waste-not' thread is a practice affecting postage that has been shared by many nations.

Further, I must ask... Did any of Ukraine's 1990s local post offices (whether individual post offices, municipal, district, or oblast (region)) keep such archives themselves? Is it possible/probable? And, if so... Might this in any way explain how some of them saw actual use?

Though there are of course other avenues that explain such usage, does anyone know the answer to this Ukrainian 1990s archives query? Anyone?

Finally, by the way, this is a keen reminder for me that even the most seemingly obscurely-related fields might in fact yield precious nuggets of thoughtful information that directly relate to Ukrainian collecting.

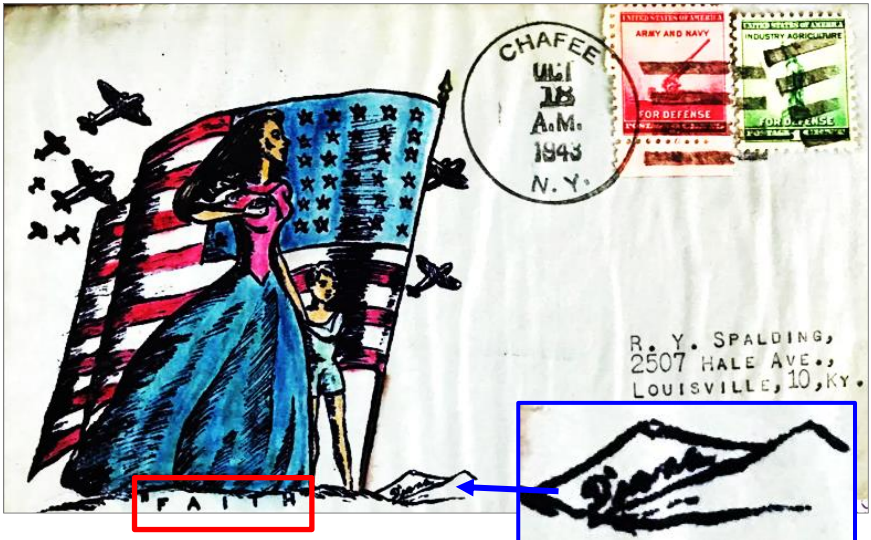

Stamp Series “People’s Solidarity”

- Soviet Occupation Zone, West Saxony

The **Volkssolidarität** (VS) of People’s Solidarity is a relief organization first founded in Dresden on 17 Oct 1945. In the months following it then spreads to the Soviet Occupation Zones of Germany and was one of many important non-parliamentary mass organizations in the former socialist country, East Germany. The VS principally focused on helping those who suffered the most as a result of WWII; children, the elderly, those expelled from Eastern Europe, and repatriated prisoners of war.

On 7 January 1946 (1st day of Issue) only four values (3+2, 6+4, 12+6 & 40+30 Pfennig) were issued only to be summarily recalled and later sold on 28 January 1946, along with the other eight values. This bit of information should be of particular interest to collectors because **Volkssolidarität** covers sold between January 7 and 27 1946 can fetch a premium of €150, or more.



A full series (as above) consists of 12 values. As with many earlier issues of DDR stamps, there are numerous minor printing accidents, plate flaws, and a small number of varieties, i.e., attached blank fields and singular imperforated edges that garner a premium. In addition, the Michel catalogue lists approximately thirty-seven plate flaws for this particular series.

There are also two color varieties of the 15+10 Pf stamp (as above) and a notable difference in catalogue value (CV). Even more noteworthy is the CV for the top value 60+40 Pfennig stamp with a 1X watermark.

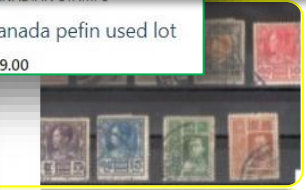
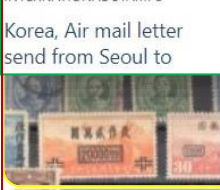

Zeppelin Airships and Hindenburg Mail

The first flight of the Graf Zeppelin Airship was in September 1928. It carried the first regular airmail to go directly from Germany to the US and vice versa. On the return trip, the airship carried almost 52,000 postcards and 50,000 letters.

In 1929, Graf Zeppelin circled the globe, with stops in Tokyo and Los Angeles. By the time it was taken out of service in June 1937, the airship had made 590 flights, each flight carrying up to 12 tons of mail.



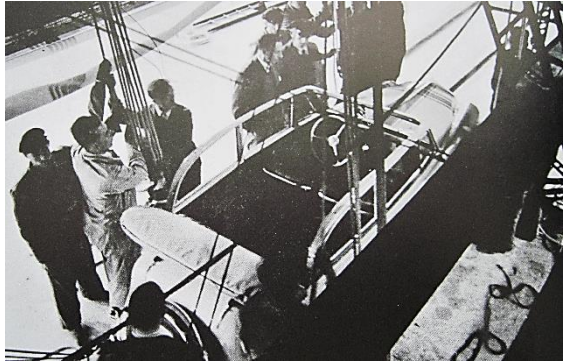

We are all familiar with the Hindenburg, the most renowned Airship of all time, however, you are possibly not aware of the part it played in Philately in its short-lived life. At the 3rd International Philatelic Exhibition in 1936 held in New York City, Hugo Eckener founder of the Zeppelin Company addressed philatelists telling the crowd that "I owe a debt of gratitude to stamp collectors around the world. Their patronage has helped fund the world tours of Airships". At that time worldwide collectors had spent more than a million in 1936 dollars on flight covers and postcards, business documents, and freight. A little known fact is that huge part of the success was for time-sensitive freight, such as perishable food, flowers & films.

However, some of the most surprising items included automobiles, pianos, and small aircraft.

The German Post Ministry swore in two of Hindenburg's crew to be on-board postmasters. A post room was established above the control room and next to the radio room. This would allow passengers and crew to purchase postage stamps and postcards from a

steward. Mail boxes were located in the reading and writing lounges. The postmaster used a date canceller post maker during the flight, with the very special "On board Hindenburg" postmark.

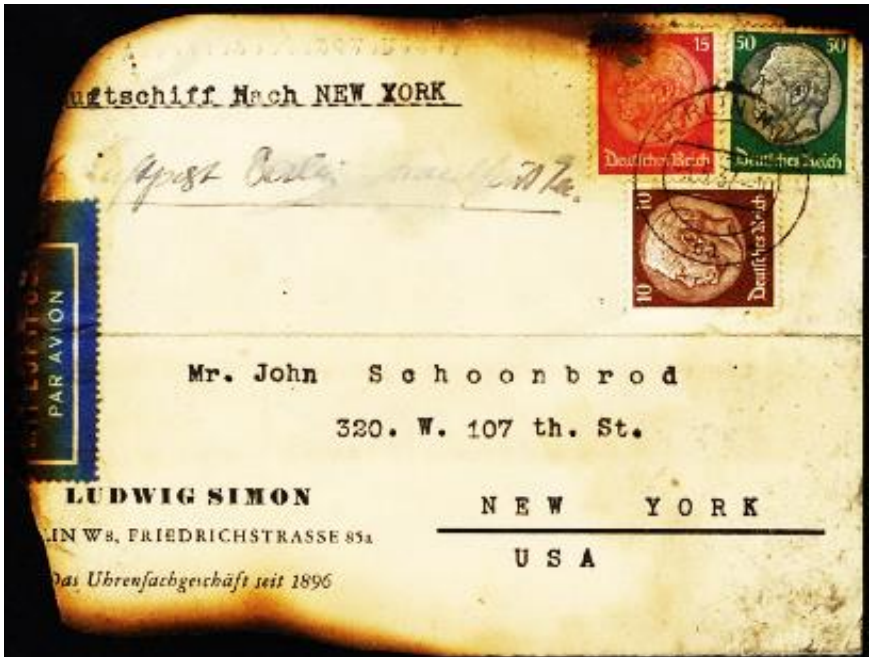
Hindenburg's two and a half day service was the fastest way to send mail between Europe and North America in 1936, when ocean liners took five days or more to cross the Atlantic.

On its last and final flight, as the airship was mooring to the mast at Lakehurst, New Jersey. While the airship was moored it sparked an electrical discharge which doomed the very famous ship. Most of the 17,609 pieces of mail on the last flight were destroyed in the fire, but a handful were recovered and today are highly prized "crash covers".

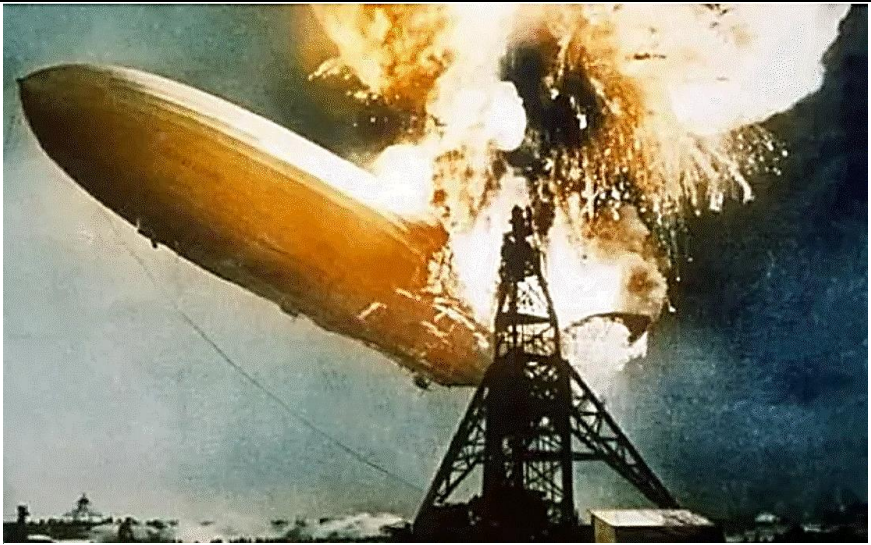

*“It burst into flames, it burst into flames!” he cried. “And it’s falling, it’s crashing ...it’s crashing terrible ... Oh, the humanity ... oh, ladies and gentlemen ...”*The words on the cover are those of W.S.L. Chicago radio reporter, Herbert Morrison, who bore witness to the raging inferno.

His phrase, “Oh, the humanity” is remembered today and is as powerful now as it was on 6 May 1937, when the legendary Zeppelin caught fire and crashed in a New Jersey field.

Hindenburg’s irregular schedule made the service unappealing to some business users, however, at the time there was no faster way to send regular air mail until May 1939, when Pan American Airways inaugurated airmail service across the North Atlantic in Boeing 314 Clipper flying boats.

The LZ130 Graf Zeppelin II was the last of the Zeppelins to carry mail as it was in civilian service for only a few months, from October 1938 to August 1939, making only 30 trips, all within Germany.

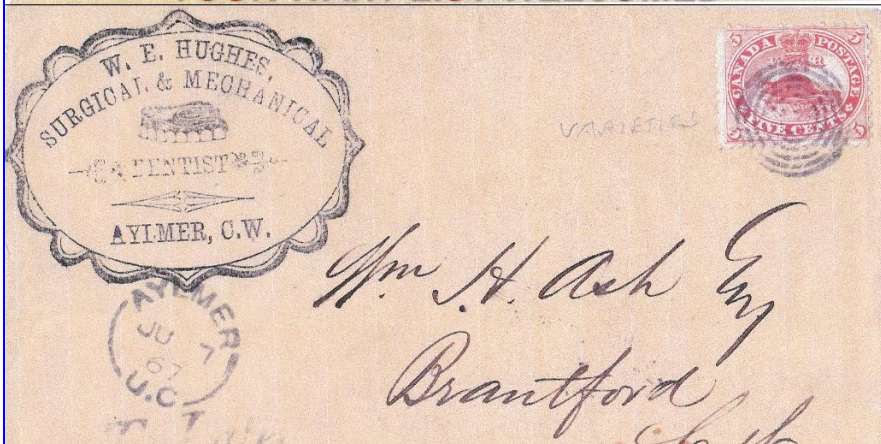

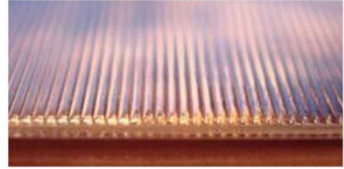

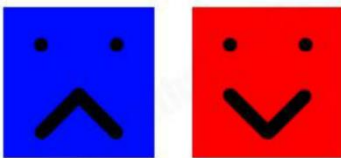
Lenticular printing is a technology in which lenticular lenses are used to produce printed images with an illusion of depth, or the ability to change or move as the image is viewed from different angles.



Close up of the surface of a lenticular lens



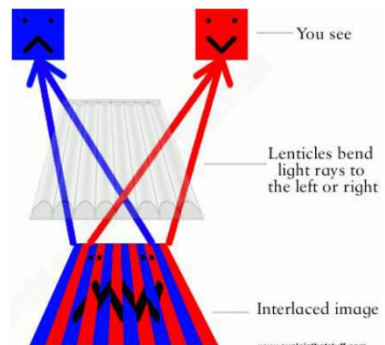
100th Anniversary of Montreal Canadiens

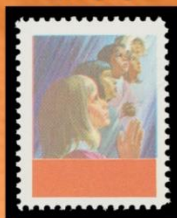
