Presidents Report GTAPA AGM January 25, 2023

I will keep my comments short. Well, another year has flown by, and it is time to reflect on what if any successes the GTAPA has had during 2022.

On a positive note, GTAPA and its members took advantage of CAPEX 22 by producing, in conjunction with the GRVPA, a new advertising card showing all the current member clubs of both organizations. These cards were available in several areas including the Society tables of both Scouts on Stamps and the Ukrainian Collectibles Society. GTAPA also placed an ad in one of the CAPEX 22 publications showing GTAPA member clubs.

We also participated in the literature competition at CAPEX 22. Our quarterly publication *PhilaJournal* earned a Vermeil award while our GTAPA website was awarded a Large Silver.

Congratulations to Tom Malicki and Jerry Kalyn for all the hard work they have put into those areas over the years.

My personal thanks are also extended to Tony Manson who after ten years of excellent service as secretary for GTAPA has decided to step down from that role. Tony assures me that he will continue to participate in GTAPA.

I am glad to see that most if not all clubs are trying to return to some semblance of normalcy. Meeting attendance is mostly down but gradually rising and quite a few clubs currently have fewer members. However, I know of at least one club, West Toronto Stamp Club, where the membership has gone up quite a bit partially since they are using Zoom meetings to attract members from farther afield. Zoom sessions, whether hosted by individual clubs or groups like the RPSC have enabled many of us to get our philatelic fixes during the pandemic and the stamp shows have increased in number.

On a negative note, I have been concerned with the fact that attendance at the monthly GTAPA Zoom meetings has been poor.

Eventually, the Greene Foundation will become available for us to use. But that will not necessarily mean higher attendance since the number of member clubs belonging to GTAPA includes several from outlying areas which can make travel to meetings a challenge. I do not know what the future holds.



Kiribati, the dying islands



Before independence from the British Crown (in 1979) the islands were known as the Gilbert Islands, and they were part of the British colony of the Gilbert and Ellice islands. When England granted independence to the islands, The Gilbert and the Ellice islands decided to separate and so two new republics were created: d Tuvalu (the old Ellice islands).

Kiribati (the old Gilbert islands) and Tuvalu (the old Ellice islands).



Although the total population of Kiribati is only about 120,000 people (of which half live in the atoll of Tarawa), the 32 atolls plus one raised coral island, Banaba, occupy a huge stretch of the Pacific, with 811 square Kilometers of land spread over an area of 3.5 million square kilometres. To give you an idea of

the huge distance between the various islands Kiribati extends from the western hemisphere to the eastern hemisphere, as well as the northern and southern hemispheres; making it the world's only island nation to be situated on all four hemispheres of the Earth. The atoll of Tarawa is about 3300 kilometres away from the island of Kiritimati (Christmas Island) on the opposite side of the country. This is about the same distance as from Toronto to Edmonton or from Chicago to San Francisco or from Lisbon to Warsaw.



All the atolls are just above sea level while Banaba Island is the only one with some more elevated areas and a hill which reaches 81 meters above sea level. With the sea level in the Pacific expected to rise about half a meter in the next 50 years, all the islands of Kiribati will disappear under the sea, except portions

of the island of Banaba which would be too small to host some of the population of the other islands. The Republic of Kiribati is going to disappear from the world map not because of climate change per se but because of the accelerated speed of climate change. Unfortunately, this is something that

many people do not realize, while climate change has always taken place, it is the accelerated speed of climate change caused by human intervention that is having devasting effects on some parts of the world and particularly Kiribati.



The atolls in fact have been adapting forever to the changes in sea level thanks to the growth of coral. However, as the speed of climate change and the rise of sea level keeps accelerating, the growth of the new coral cannot


go faster and consequently, the atolls will end up being covered by water in a few decades. The first two atolls (Tebua Tarawa and Abanuea) went underwater a few years ago.

In 2013 President Tong began urging citizens to evacuate the islands and migrate elsewhere. In May 2014, the Office of the President confirmed the purchase of some 5,460 acres of land 9.3 million Australian dollars and in the

future Kiribati citizens may have the opportunity of migrating to Fiji, but many will be forced to move further away, to Australia, New Zealand and maybe the United Kingdom.

> The stamps of Kiribati talk about an idyllic place where the pictures of local fish, shells, birds, coconut trees and a simple life very connected to the sea are dominant. Their stamps also talk about the suffering and the destruction the islands went through during World War 2 when "civilized" countries fought to take possession of their islands (Battle of Tarawa etc.).

> One can only imagine how difficult it will be for the i-Kiribati (as the Kiribati people are called) to adapt to a different type of life. It will not be easy. I remember when a few years ago I read about the history of the island of Tristan Da Cunha, on the opposite side of the world, with a worse climate than Kiribati but as isolated as the Kiribati islands are. The inhabitants were forced in 1961 to abandon the island due to the eruption of Queen's Mary peak and eventually landed in England. They lived in England for 2 years but when, in 1963, they were given the opportunity to return to the island, almost all of them had no hesitation to go back, they had had enough of the "modern" European life.

King George VI On Scout Stamps



Queen Elizabeth has appeared on numerous scout & guide stamps over the years, as early as October 9,

1944, when she and her sister Margaret were both in guide uniforms on that year's New Zealand Health stamp issue.

This was not the case for her father King George VI, who appeared on only one set of two scouting stamps. Jamaica issued these on March 5, 1,952 for the First Caribbean Jamboree to be held on March 5-17, 1952.

However, King George died on February 6, 1952, just one month before the stamp issue. It was too late to change the plans, so the issue went ahead.



But there was one change made, seen from these proofs.

In the proofs, King George is facing to the right, whereas the final stamps show him facing forward.

Radio Reception Cinderellas

Philatelists of a certain age will remember the "crystal radio", no batteries, just a "cats' whisker" to tune, a long wire antenna, and headphones. While radio, or wireless, was around prior to and during WWI it wasn't till the early 1920's that commercial radio stations were popping up in every city in North America. In those early years of AM radio, no FM or TV yet perfected for the general public, new stations grew from less than 100 to more than 500 in 1922 and well over 800 by 1960's. This included Canada, USA, Mexico and Cuba. Most of these stations, to promote reception, issued "verified reception" stamps, example of which is shown here from CFCA Toronto.

When a station was heard, the date, time, and frequency along with 10 cents was sent to station to confirm reception and the station would send a confirmation by station card; cover with a verified reception stamp attached or included in letter. There were a plethora of philatelists or stamp collectors worldwide in the early years after WWI; the collection of Cinderellas that confirmed radio reception was a natural extension of the hobby. In fact, there were albums available in Canada, with station call signs, frequencies, city names and provinces that a collector could keep track of reception stamps from the radio stations.

These stamps were printed by American Bank Note and produced for EKKO Co. Chicago, as in examples shown you will note EKKO letters, top

left, clockwise in each corner. All Canadian stamps featured a Beaver, the US ones were an Eagle. A couple of rare stamps are known to have an Eagle; those of CKNC in Toronto & CKAC in Montreal.

The short history of CFCA, owned & operated by the Toronto Star's owner Joseph Atkinson. He got the idea to promote the Star through radio from his Son, an amateur (Ham) radio operator with station license 3EC. The Star, through radio "Star Concerts" and in conjunction with CITCO (Canadian Independent Telephone Co.) began in late 1921 to produce concerts from





WWI Christie St. Military Hospital (Christie & Dupont, Toronto). These were broadcasted on 9AH and later became CFCA. Broadcast was on 400m or 750kc at a power of 100 watts. The antenna for this station was a 5-wire, flat (horizontal) top, mounted on two 80ft towers on the Star building of the time. In early 1922 station call sign 9AH was replaced by CFCA broadcasting concerts from the old CGE plant on Wallace Ave. & Ward St. in Toronto.

By 1923 CFCA was broadcasting hockey games from the Mutual St. Arena with announcer Foster Hewitt who used a telephone for a microphone. In 1924 it moved its studios to Yonge and St. Clair, where in 1928 ceased operating as CFCA (sold to Ted Rogers) and became CFRB 1010; the "RB" stands for "Rogers Batteryless".

This is a short synopsis of the beginnings of radio and the Cinderellas for radio stations to verify reception and the production and distribution of the related stamps.

The writer is a collector of these stamps and would appreciate locating covers, station cards, postcards, and used or mint labels produced by EKKO Co.


On the Canadian Encyclopedia website, an article titled "Newspapers in Canada: 1800s–1900s" details as follows "...as a newspaper's circulation increased, merchants became more interested in it as an advertising medium. With productive capacity increasing in all industries, advertising, as a means of persuading people to buy the massive volume of goods being produced, became crucial (see Industrialization in Canada).

Early advertisers were wholesalers trying to catch the attention of other merchants. But by the 1890s, retail advertising, aimed at a mass market, was dominant, and big-city dailies earned just a third of their revenues from subscribers and single-copy sales. By 1900, consumers were flooded with newspaper advertisements enticing them to purchase such things as soap, patent medicines or electric belts." "Insufficiently Addressed" Air-Boat (Seaplane) Mail

In an online article titled "History Through Our Eyes: Aug 10, 1939, Letters arrive by airmail" found in the Montreal Gazette of August 10, 2019, the



opening line states that "In the summer of 1939, Montreal was abuzz with news of the first Transatlantic

mail flight between Southampton, England, and North America."




1939 Cover paying the 25c+6c rate for postage between Montreal, Canada and Yorks, England.

In another online publication by the American Airmail Society, it is stated that "Foynes applied its cachet as a receiving mark to incoming mail."

However, this "Unusual Addressing" on this cover from Montreal, Canada to Yorks, England seems to have been created to fail delivery as the "Undelivered for Reason Stated..." purple postmark is under the sending, "Montreal CDS" postmark.

The Receiving postmark of the "Yorks CDS" also accompanied by the Cachet and manuscript inscription by the York Postal official's signature states "Not York Dely (Delivery)" [written in Pencil] and "Try Dewsbury" [written in red ink]. Healds Road is a Street in the town of Dewsbury, West Yorkshire!! 1939 First Transatlantic airmail flight from Southampton to North America took place on Saturday, Aug. 5, 1939. The Imperial Airways flying boat Caribou landed in Montreal as well as Botwood, Newfoundland, and New York.

Postal Indicia on Personalized Mail, used by many for promotion via direct mailing.



Postal indicia are used by Businesses, Charities, and Individuals on their direct mailing envelopes to promote, seek donations and publicize.

Just before Covid interrupted our lives, in a month, we had 3 or 4 charities send their unique preprinted envelopes with colourful indicia where the stamp should be. Two types of indicia exist, a vertical one that looks more like a stamp and a horizontal one with an information label printed so it looks like it is detachable. Please check the examples to see other information contained with the indicia. The picture in the indicia is what makes it collectable. When purchasing these each organization receives a Customer Number from Canada Post to be used on all future orders, so it is easy to track which business the advertisement came from even if the picture is not self-explanatory.

Charities have been known to sell their mailing lists for extra income, to other fundraisers. As a result, we have received donation requests from charities or businesses we would have never imagined before.

These ranged from the regular Cancer Society mailouts to other diseases that inflict us, but also from a variety of animal charities, organizations, publications, businesses, even religious groups, all vying for our hard-earned dollar. On the imprints for Scott Mission on Spadina, which we have always supported, there are even photos of some of their customers.

To me, this brings in another form of Philately which I think has a small number of followers

but rising as more and more businesses opt for advertising via mass mailing. Recently I had purchased a balance of a stamp collection from an estate, and in it was a binder of Postal Indicia in the hundreds and much duplicated. The chap was a member of our club, but I had never heard him mention this new hobby at one of our meetings.



The North York Philatelic Society has reopened its doors!



On December 7th, 2022 The North York Philatelic Society (NYPS) has succeeded in restarting its activity at a new location (the Edithvale Community Center at 131 Finch Avenue West) and with a new look.

The NYPS has a long history as it was founded in 1953 and in the past has been one of the most active Clubs in the Toronto area. However during last few years membership has been constantly decreasing and the Club's future started to be at risk. Then came Covid and the decision of the management of the Carnegie Centennial center to restructure their rooms and destine them to different purposes. So, with a very short notice, we found out we did not have a meeting place anymore. Without a meeting place and with an uncertain future, the Club has continued to remain closed even after the covid restrictions had been eased.

To an old member of the Club like me, it hurt to see that the NYPS was destined to disappear and so, with some other older members, we have started examining the possibility of an energetic relaunch of the Club., also taking into account that the North York area has a tradition of stamp collectors who don't necessarily belong to any stamp Club.

The first step was to find a new location and thanks to Harvey Shuter's perseverance, we finally managed to secure an excellent room in a very

central location (close to the Yonge and Finch junction) and at minimal cost.

From there we began a very aggressive plan to relaunch the Club. It was a very difficult task in the current environment, but we have been very lucky to obtain the unconditional support of GTAPA and of the other neighbouring Stamps Clubs (North Toronto, West Toronto and Markham). The relaunch plan of the Club has been based on securing the support of a small number of the old members and by presenting the Club to all potential members with a new image and a more dynamic approach. While we have used all available tools to reconnect with all the people who had been members of the Club in the past, and with stamp collectors living in the area, we have focused on giving our members full visibility of what to expect in their visits to the Club.

The message to our members is that in each of our meetings they will be informed beforehand of what to expect at the Club. So we now guarantee that there will be at least one dealer selling at the Club with a large selection of worldwide stamps, that we will always have 10 cent books and table sales of items belonging to Club members, a mini auction of a minimum of 40 to 50 items and a draw of philatelic items to be won by the participants. In addition to that we will have a predetermined theme for every meeting to attract those people who have very specific interests. We started on December 21st with a topical night, followed in the early meetings in 2023 by Asian stamps, then with European stamps, then a "covers evening" and finally on February 15th a large auction with more than 200 items.

The months ahead will tell if we have been able to relaunch the Club for the long term. In any case the start has been encouraging with an active and enthusiastic participation of past members and the arrival of a small but very positive group of new members.

Hopefully, by the end of the 2023 year, which marks the 70th anniversary of the NYPS, we will be able to conclude that our efforts have been successful and that the North York Philatelic Society is here to stay as a small but dynamic stamp Club with the aim of expanding the population of active stamp collectors in the Toronto metropolitan area.


