

Since 2021 the **Royal Philatelic Society of Canada** has hosted two monthly Zoom presentations, namely Stamp Talks and Stamp Panels. These are free but registration is required at https://www.rpsc.org/. Previous Stamp Panels presentations can be viewed by all, but you must be an RPSC member to view Stamp Talks.

Another interesting monthly Zoom presentation is offered by the US-based **British Empire Study Group** (https://bestudygroup.org/). Invitations can be requested by contacting joan@aced-m.com. Some are on YouTube.

Finally, I would be remiss if I did not mention the wealth of philatelic knowledge available in the form of PDF or Video (via YouTube) presentations for public viewing made by members of the **Philatelic Specialists Society of Canada** (https://www.philatelicspecialistssociety.com/). To date, there are over 115 items to view encompassing a myriad of subjects.

It is worth observing that many Zoom sessions are recorded in Webinar format where your privacy is assured, and attendees are not identified.

With the North York Philatelic Society, there are now four Stamp Clubs online auctions per month in Ontario.

The North York Philatelic Society (NYPS) is the latest club to join a monthly online auction program which was started during the Covid times by the Oxford Philatelic Society (Ed.: OPS - email: oxfordphilsociety@gmail.com for auction links and Zoom invite) and the Owen Sound Stamp Club (OSSC) and is proving to be very successful (Ed.: here is a link to their very concise calendar: https://owensoundstampclub.org/Events.html)

At the moment there are four online auctions which are run every month thanks to the program developed by Don at Stamp Smarter (https://stampsmarter.org/). Two auctions are run in the first half of the month (OSSC and OPS) and two are run in the second half of the month (NYPS and the OPS).

NYPS has only started with this program in the spring of 2023 but we are very happy with how it is growing and for the opportunities it is providing to our club members both in terms of selling and buying stamps.


The July auction took place on July 24, 2023, with 253 items for sale. At the end of the auction, there were 220 items sold and after the auction, other 12 items were sold through the "unsold" listings bringing the total of items sold to 232. That is a **91.7%** success rate of the items sold. This is an exceptional result obtained thanks to the sellers offering a high variety and diversity of auction lots by country, by topic, by catalogue value and by year range.

The selling price of the items sold went from a low of \$1 to \$35. Although in previous auctions there were items sold for \$100 or more, the above range is the most common and means that many items sold are very affordable and within the budget of the stamp collectors at our club. Our plan is to continue these monthly online auctions for the near future and to maintain the number of lots at over 250 items per auction.

Fenelon Stamp Club Introduces New Hardware

The Fenelon Stamp Club honoured a 'Giant in Philately' this year at Fenpex, the 37th Annual Stamp Show and Exhibition on August 12th, 2023, Fenelon Falls Community Centre, 27 Veterans Way, Fenelon Falls.

Marg Allen, а founding member of the FSC. was honoured with the introduction of the Marg Allen new, Memorial Trophy. With a photo of Marg and consent from her family, combined with modern laser technology and techniques, her image has been lasered into a crystal block with an inscription, to create this masterpiece of a trophy.

"We wanted to create a way to both honour Marg, and to encourage fellow members to participate in the 'One Page Exhibit' category", said Mark Armstrong.

Mr. Armstrong came up with the idea a few



months ago while on a Cruise Ship in the Caribbean. "Seeing the photocrystal-block in the ship Photo Gallery was the nucleus of this idea", Mark said, "Returning home and doing further investigation, I discovered 3DCrystal.com on the internet, presented the idea to Marg's family, and ran with the idea." Marg Allen was widely known throughout North America before her passing in 2019. She held a number of positions within the RPSC, and various other philatelic organizations, and was a prolific author of history throughout Fenelon Township. "It would be near impossible to 'not' find anyone in the Kawartha Lakes region who didn't know Marg, and her passion for philately", said Mark.

Postcards and letters from the top of a Volcano: The Vesuvio Cancels

For hundreds of years, the adventurous (and rich) tourists visiting the Naples region paid large sums of money to reach the summit of the Vesuvius Volcano and see the crater from close. Even if Vesuvius (Vesuvio in Italian) is not extremely high (about 1300 meters) the ascent to the crater was not very easy. It took quite a long time and could be achieved only by hiring guides who would transport the tourists by a donkey or by different types of "Sedan Chairs". Resting stations had to be set up along the road to allow the animals or the porters to rest and have access to some fresh water.





All this changed on June 6, 1880, when the new Funicular was opened. The Funicular was designed by Hernest Oblieght, a Hungarian Engineer who saw the opportunity to make access to the crater much easier for the growing number of tourists visiting the Gulf of Naples.

The original Funicular railway was built to perform an ascent of 750 meters at a very steep angle. The concept of the Funicular was per se, very simple, with two wagons going in different directions (up and down) and being held



by a single cable that would be powered by a steam engine situated in the lower station. Of course, the system also required a very powerful braking system to make sure that the wagons would not pick up too much speed in the descending direction. The two wagons were appropriately called Vesuvio and Etna and could only hold 8 passengers (plus the conductor).

There were only two stations, Stazione Inferiore (the lower station) and Stazione Superiore (the higher station) and the trip would take about 10 minutes, saving hours and hours of hard trekking to reach a point relatively close to the crater. To commemorate the opening of the first Funicular in Italy Luigi Denza and Peppino Turco wrote a special song... and so was born the song Funiculi' Funicula' which became known all over the world with millions of records sold and was even "adopted" by Richard Strauss and Rimsky Korsakov in one of their compositions.

It was only natural that the first visitors wanted to share with their friends or family the excitement of having reached the summit of the volcano by sending them letters or postcards.



As early as 1881 we found some documents with a beautiful cursive cancel "Vesuvio" in black or red. I have not been able to collect enough



information to find out if the Vesuvio cancel was an official postal cancel.

In most letters or postcards the Vesuvio cancel appears to be next to the stamp while the Town of Resina cancel (the nearest post office by rail) obliterates the stamp. However, I know of two cases, including one in my possession (see picture), where "Vesuvio" is used to cancel the stamp. It is possible that the conductor of the funicular was authorized to sell stamps and collect letters and postcards on behalf of the Town of Resina post office but then the official cancelling of the stamps would take place in Resina. The use of the Vesuvio cancel on the stamps could be an unauthorized use which the Resina post office decided to tolerate in a few exceptional instances.

In any case, the Vesuvio cancel appears on letters and postcards for about 20 years until it is progressively replaced by a circular cancel (see picture) which is known by at least two different formats and three different colours. But also in this case, the official collecting the correspondence at the Funicular station did not seem to be authorized to cancel the stamps which continued to be cancelled in Resina.

It is only with the appearance of the Vesuvio squared circle cancel in 1905



that the Funicular office appears to have been authorized to operate as a regular post office. The squared circle postmark was only used for a couple of years between 1905 and 1907. Very few of these postmarks have been preserved (less than 10) used between June 1905 and February 1907. I am adding a picture of the only one in my possession which has now been



transferred to the editor of the Gaggero Squared Circle Postmarks catalogue to be kept in their archives. It is a letter sent to Beaulieu in France with a franking of 26 cents, possibly the post office had limited availability of stamps and only had 2 cents stamps instead of the required 1 cent.

Keep in mind that documents from that period cannot be very common because in **April 1906 there was a massive eruption of the volcano** and the Funicular was badly damaged and stopped operating for some time.

Going back to the Funicular, it was not a very profitable operation until the 1900s when the railway connecting to the lower station was expanded and a new railway connecting Naples to Pompei and Poggiomarino was opened, making access to the Funicular much easier.

In the meantime, the ownership of the funicular had been taken over by Thomas Cook and Co. [ed.: Map in this article is from their archives] which renovated the line twice, before and after the 1906 eruption. Quite a few different postmarks bearing the Cook name are known but they only had an advertising purpose and were not used as postal cancels. The Funicular continued to function until 1944 and then from 1947 to 1953, when it was replaced by a chair lift, which enabled it to increase significantly the number of people transported to the summit of the volcano. However, the opening of a new road in 1955 which allowed cars and buses to come close to the summit of the volcano made the chair lift less attractive until it was closed in 1984. Even so, between 1953 and 1984 the chair lift managed to transport an average of about 100,000 people per year.



The Last Day

The Vesuvius Funicular marked the start of a new trend in the city of Naples. Various Funiculars were opened in the following years connecting the coastal part of the city to the hills. Four Funiculars are still operating today in the city of Naples and they offer the opportunity to rapidly reach the upper parts of the city to enjoy the magnificent views of the Gulf of Naples.

Another Funicular is still operating on the island of Capri.

The Application of Canada's Excise Tax Negotiated through Bank of Hamilton

In an online paper by Christopher D Ryan, titled "Canada's Excise Tax on Cheques and [the] other types of Commercial Paper, 1915-1953", it is stated that:

"During the period of 1915 to 1953, when an excise tax was imposed by Canada on commercial paper, the following items were negotiable under statute law; Promissory notes (unconditional promise to pay a specific sum of money to a specific person, bank or company) and bills of exchange.

Canada's excise stamp tax on commercial paper was part of a series of taxes imposed on April 15, 1915, by the Special War Revenue Act, which was later known as the Excise Tax Act. The use of postage stamps on documents other than postal money orders was permitted from April 15th, 1915, through September 30, 1923, and again, in most cases, from July 1, 1931, through to February 19, 1953.


Banks were forbidden to accept taxable documents that had not been stamped; banks were permitted to stamp the document and collect the tax from the person receiving the proceeds of the transaction. Adhesive or embossed revenue stamps were used throughout the lifetime of the tax."


1898, Prior to Taxes

The presenter asked the question: "What are the chances of obtaining such treasured material? What are the odds?" Mr. Wachter went on to demonstrate through maths probability theory this fascinating proposition utilizing the iconic Seaway Invert, the wonderful "White Queen (missing red colour) "as well as ALL 6 (six) of the high-value National Park Definitives missing black inscriptions and grouped together as a visually stunning block, to just mention some highlights. A lively Q&A finished the evening that no one seemed willing to end!

As a follow-up to an interesting donation of "Bayleyana" (see picture) material received at a previous meeting. See the illustration attached as an example of bogus fantasy items created by our infamous old-time member Walter S. Bayley. He was also party to a fake Invert Sheet episode.

The mission is intended to supplement the TSCC history published by Gray Scrimgeour for our centennial in 1992. Hoping to publish an addendum for our 150th year!?! Private Hudsons Da (Mia) Prattance Ottan

1879 3c Small Queen Cover Middle Church Man. to Moose Factory, mailed on DEC.9.1879 (broken circle free strike with inverted indicia, only the second strike recorded by PHSC, and only one month after proof strike) and addressed to "Moose Factory / Hudson's Bay / via Mattawa - Ottawa River / & Temiscamingue". The back of the cover shows four different datestamps: Winnipeg (DEC.8), Pembroke (DEC.17), Ottawa (DEC.17) and another unidentified (DEC.20). Owner's write-up states "J. Park transported the mail from Lower Fort Garry to Winnipeg, picking up mail at Middle Church. By 1879, the railway reached Winnipeg. This cover was carried by rail via the USA to Eastern Canada, arriving in Ottawa Dec. 17, thence to Mattawa Dec. 20 and then by the Hudson Bay Co. dog sled route to Moose Factory. Middle Church postal revenues were \$22 in 1879...", Very fine.



1857 "SUEDERLAND / C.W" Unrecorded and Unknown Post Office, a cover mailed Free to Toronto from "SUEDERLAND / C.W" on MR 4 / 1857 / O. Arrived Toronto on MAR.9 and passed through City of Ottawa on MAR.4 (same day as departure). A very interesting postmark, as there are no post offices listed under that name, so one can only guess that this is a spelling error by the postmark manufacturer.
