President's Comments

This issue of President's Notes unfortunately has both positive and negative aspects. On the positive side, Tom Malicki submitted *PhilaJournal* to the American Philatelic Society Star Routes Awards 2023 competition and received a Large Vermeil award in the newsletter section. This is the second award *PhilaJournal* has received in the last two years, the previous one being a Vermeil at Capex22 where GTAPA also earned a Large Silver for our website. Our bank balance is healthy and since there are currently no commitments for expenditures the executive has decided to not collect membership dues from the clubs for the year 2024.

Now for my negative thoughts. The GTAPA monthly Zoom meetings for the past couple of years have been very poorly attended. There is some concern about whether GTAPA is perhaps an organization that other than having a great monthly publication in *PhilaJournal* has little to offer member clubs.

The highlights of the September meeting included an article written by Garfield Portch, one of the founding fathers of GTAPA, about the future of GTAPA. I don't know whether the reps from the various clubs discussed it at their meetings, if they have done so then only the very few who attended the September and October Zoom sessions provided any input. What are the expectations and needs of the clubs from GTAPA?

Gregg Redner, current president of the Royal Philatelic Society of Canada (RPSC) is working with various groups to develop plans or strategies to promote and enhance our hobby. Maybe GTAPA in one form or another can be an Ontario subset in his plans...

Content Comments

Judge 1: This publication is a journal, very large with lots of content from multiple clubs. Informative and interesting. Multiple calendar events listed throughout journal - consider master schedule that readers can print out at home. It could be a link to a PDF or website.

Judge 2: Many illustrations and advertisements are indistinct. Contact details and links to officers of the Alliance should be in the journal, not just the web site.

Judge 3: This is a Herculean effort to bring together disparate input from a dozen different amateur sources and it comes close to achieving what it sets out to do: serve as a compendium of philatelic goings-on across a fairly wide geographic area. Each club makes its own report discussing meetings, shows, short features, etc. The result is a very large publication, over 50 pages, encompassing nearly 20 local clubs across southern Ontario. It is more like a community bulletin board in booklet form: somewhat haphazard and cluttered, inconsistent in quality, filled with advertising and useful nuggets but requiring a fair bit of patience to plow through.

Judge 4: When taking candid photos, avoid shooting from behind subjects. Pictures showing the backs of people are boring. If the subject is sitting (at a vendor's table for example), go behind the vendor's counter and get down low. Close in on one or two people for more dynamic photos that add interest and energy.

Judge 5: Good mixture of Ads and member club news. Image quality on submitted articles variable. Excellent job of exchanging information between member clubs!

Design Comments

Judge 1: Fun "Good Reader Award". Summer 2023 cover link broken; the yellow highlights are distracting. Thank you for submitting the publication.


Judge 2: Difficult to evaluate vs. individual club journals. This one serves about 19 clubs and takes paid advertisements.

Judge 3: On the plus side, there are lots of photos of meetings and lots of information. The first impression is that philately in Ontario is lively and vibrant. On the down side, it's somewhat overwhelming to browse. Streamlining it and bringing some consistency and better design to the contents would be a big help (and could serve as a model for other organizations) but may be beyond the resources of the editor, given the volume. It would require additional staff, but this really seems ready to graduate from being an overgrown newsletter into being a smart little magazine chock full of useful info. Given the broad base it serves, perhaps a stipend for additional production staff can be scraped together.

Judge 4: In your titles for a message or report by the president, the executive's title is singular possessive and requires an apostrophe, e.g. President's Report or President's Message

Judge 5: TOC essential!!

Cobourg and nearby Port Hope Post Offices.



Cobourg and nearby Port Hope were both served by post offices that were magnificent buildings built in the late 1800's. In 1856, Ebenezer Perry sold this corner property to the Bank of Montreal who then built this building around 1860.

In 1881, it was conveyed to W. D. Burn

who sold it to the Crown in December 1882, and it became the Cobourg Post Office. In 1889, after the addition was constructed, it also became the Custom's House. Despite much controversy and objection, the Post Office moved to its present location and this building was demolished in 1960.

Construction started on the Port Hope post office and customs house in 1883. This distinctive building stood on the corner of Queen and Hector



Streets, an unmistakable feature of Port Hope's skyline, an ornament to the downtown and a compliment to the nearby Town Hall.

On April 20, 1970, in an unforgivable act of wanton destruction, a handful of fugitive Town Councillors became part of the building's history when they took it upon themselves to demolish the building.
