


The contest will continue into 2024... even though the participation is less than pathetic. Each of the four 2023 issues attracted about ten entries each.

What to Collect? (Hint: EUROPA)

I have been a stamp collector for many years going way back to grade 2 and Cub Scouts, but it was about 20 years ago that I joined the Cobourg Stamp Club and started to take stamp collecting seriously. In the primitive years, I only collected Canada stamps, some in used condition, others mint, with no rhyme or reason to the way I collected them.

So, after joining the club I was able to break my collections into two parts, one mint, the other used, It had gotten to the point where the collection was almost complete, other than the 2 or 3 dozen stamps that every collector drools and dreams about.

My dilemma started, what should I collect now... Queen Elizabeth Machin stamps from Great Britain? Collected a shoe box full of them, too many colours, and boring. Maybe Christmas stamps... nope too generic. I bid on a



junk box at a club auction, and going through the stamps I came across a stamp I somewhat remembered from my childhood (\leftarrow)

But I could have sworn that this stamp was issued by Greece (\rightarrow), so my search began. I started with a

Scott Catalog and searched the listings from Greece, page by page, but I couldn't find an image of this stamp.



Then I searched the German pages, still couldn't find the image of the stamp. But I did find a listing of stamps over several years under the heading of "Common Design." I found the section at the front of the catalogue listing all of the Common designs for EUROPA stamps, now this looked interesting, 10 or 12 European countries each issuing one or two stamps each year. So it began, a collection of EUROPA Stamps.

In 1956 six countries, Belgium, France, Germany, Italy, Luxemburg, and the Netherlands issued 2 or 3 stamps of a common design, titled Reconstructing Europe (Complete set shown on the next page).

More issues would follow each year, in 1960 The European Conference for Posts and Telecommunications, known by its acronym CEPT took control of the EUROPA stamp program. By 1964 the familiar symbol on the right was prominently used on each issue of the EUROPA stamp. 1973 was the last year of the common design, in which a shared theme was used by the issuing countries.



By 1990 it became apparent that the postal and telecommunications sectors were becoming more diverse in the distinctive fields. 1992 was the last year the CEPT symbol was used on the stamps.



EUROPA It was replaced in 1994 with the word EUROPA in its distinctive font.

PostEurop was established and took over the EUROPA stamp-related activities, selecting the annual theme for the new stamp issues. Starting in 2002 PostEurop members cast votes on the best stamp design. Stamps are issued each year close to May 9th, which is Europe Day.

Currently, there are over 40 countries that issue EUROPA-themed stamps which are a popular collectable theme worldwide. At the request of Ukraine's post office, the 2023 theme was "PEACE- the highest value of humanity." The winning design from POST Luxembourg was adopted.



There are many and various online platforms about EUROPA stamps that can be explored. Happy Collecting.



An Ocean Letter



Wireless message issued on Oct. 19, 1931

AN OCEAN LETTER (Prefix OL) is a special class of message accepted on board a ship for transmission by wireless to another vessel proceeding in the opposite direction. The latter vessel forwards the message to its destination by registered post from the first port of call.

The establishment of radio transmitters on board ocean liners, matched with receiving stations on land, provided a new means of communication between passengers and relatives ashore.


A passenger two days out from Liverpool bound for New York could send a message home employing a passing ship going in the opposite direction! The outgoing passenger completed a message form and handed it to their radio officer who would transmit the message by radio to the officer on the second ship reached port; the message would be posted as a registered letter to the addressee. Thus, a message could be posted in Liverpool before the original sender had reached New York!

The Marconi company had been providing transatlantic radio Morse transmissions from ships since 1901. However, it was not until November 1912 that Marconi applied to the British Postmaster General for permission to introduce the Ocean Letter service. The Post Office gave permission but with conditions: transmissions must be in plain language; the two ships involved must be travelling in opposite directions; both ships must be outside the range of all coastal radio stations and the final mailing was to be as a registered letter.

Ocean letters could be sent at a fraction of the cost of a telegram.

For the first years of ocean letters, the sender might choose between ordinary rate or registered. The telegraph operator was functioning like a postmaster and was equipped with postal rate tables to make sure franking was correct. Most were sent as registered until 1925, probably because senders wanted to make sure they reached the addressee, considering the sender had already paid a higher price than for an ordinary letter. Around 1925 the service seemed to be so reliable that registration was abandoned in most cases. Most ocean letters were sent as first-class mail.

This Ocean Letter is from my grandfather. He was travelling to London, England on *Empress of Britain* and sent it to my mother who was at school in Forest Glen, Maryland. The wireless message was sent to a ship (*Lapland*) going in the opposite direction. When the *Lapland* docked in New York City, a first-class letter was issued and mailed.



King Edward VII - Postcard Rate, Canada & India

The new issue of stamps bearing the likeness of King Edward VII was initiated due to the death of Queen Victoria on January 22, 1901, however, these stamps did not come into service for nearly 2 years in several British Commonwealth countries. Examples here are from Canada and India, paying the 1 Cent / 1 Anna postcard rate in 1907 /1908, in Canada and India.

For the first time, the Postal Department in Canada decided to place the "Crown" on the regular issue of Canadian Postage stamps. The crown introduced in the upper left and right-hand corners of the design was not necessary but served as a decorative and symbolic purpose (Source: StampsandCanada.com) to mark King Edward VII's coronation as Monarch of the British Commonwealth (22 Jan.1901-May 1910).



Notice the "Toronto. CAN." as a postmark on this postcard as later postmarks of this type were changed to "Toronto. ONT."



On the "India Postage & Revenue" stamp One Crown is part of the design

India to Italy. This postcard bearing postage value of 1 anna, made up of two ½ anna King Edward VII stamps 1902-09 #71 green, was cancelled at 'Darjeeling' ('Forest scene in the Darjeeling Himalayan Railway').

Let's Talk About Squared Circle Postmarks.

(A worldwide review of this type of postmark)

Many of you may have heard about the squared circle postmarks and may be aware that they have been used in Canada, the U.K. and many British colonies but I am quite sure that not too many know that the squared circle postmarks have been used in many countries worldwide.

But first of all, let's explain what are these postmarks:

The Squared Circle Postmark is formed by combining two pieces of a cancel. It is a circular cancel with a city or country name and possibly also calendar or date information, completed with a series of external bars on the four corners to form an external square frame.

As with anything else connected to the postal services, the first postmarks of this type were introduced in Great Britain at the end of 1879 as an alternative to the duplex cancels which were quite larger and more difficult to use. Furthermore, the idea behind this new postmark was that the combination of a circular postmark with the corner bars would allow for better cancellation of all stamps affixed on the cover or a card and minimize the risk of fraud. The Circle Squared Postmarks were very popular until 1910 but then their usage started to decline as new simpler cancels became available.

In general, they had virtually disappeared by the mid-20s (with some exceptions that I will mention later on). In the beginning, these postmarks were mostly used in Great Britain and the Commonwealth Countries and later introduced in countries like the Dutch Colonies, Italy (probably the country with the highest number of different postmarks), Spain, China, Brazil, Hawaii, Austria etc.

During their existence, they were modified many times so it is possible to find many different postmarks from the same post office. But, those of small towns and remote post offices which have been used for only a year or less can be quite rare.

In this article (and articles in future issues of the *Philajournal*) I will try to give some basic information about all countries that used the squared circle postmarks, focusing more on the countries for which there is no literature available and a bit less on those like United Kingdom, Canada or Australia where there is sufficient information in specialized publications.

So we will start in alphabetical order with the **A** countries arriving at the **Z** countries maybe a year or so from now.



Aden (South Yemen): The Aden Squared Circle Postmarks were used in three different locations: Aden, Aden Camp and Aden Cantonment. These postmarks can be found both on stamps of British East Africa and of India; they appear to be more common on stamps from India.

Albania (Italian Offices Durazzo, Scutari and Valona): These postmarks have been used in these three locations in the early 1900s. In Durazzo, they were used between 1903 and 1914, and in Scutari between 1902 and 1914. The



Valona ones are rare as they were only used only in 1908 (not shown).

Australia (Northern Territories): Over 20 different postmarks have been identified in the book of Overton, however, there are probably more. In general, they are all quite scarce except the Port Darwin and Alice Springs.



This is a list of known Post Offices in the Northern Territories: Adelaide River, Alice Springs, Anthony's Lagoon, Arltunga, Barrow Creek, Borroloola, Brock's Creek, Daley Waters, Everleen, Howley Creek, Durrundie, Katherine, Port Darwin, Powell Creek, Roper River, Top Camp (Alexandria), Union Town, Victoria River (Timber Creek), Wandi, Winnecke (Gold Fields), Hermansbury (Mission Station), Fountain Head Railway Station (on Pine Creek Railway). The postmarks show "S_A", at the bottom as at the time the Territories were administered by South Australia.

Australia

(Queensland): The squared circle postmark in Queensland was only used in Brisbane, where it was introduced in



1883 and continued until 1892 or later. It was used for both departures and arrivals and was codified using different letters. The letters recorded so far are A, C, D, F, H (wide and narrow), K, L, P, T and U (per Campbell, Queensland Postal History 1990).

The postmark has a code letter, two lines for the date, "Brisbane" at the top and "QL" at the base. Some of the codes are rarer than others, however, none appears to be particularly common.

Australia (South Australia): The squared circle cancels have been used in about 600 different Postal Offices in South Australia. This includes the Post Offices of the Northern Territories, which at the time were administered by South Australia (see above). Similar

postmarks have been used in Queensland (see above) and I have been also told that they have been used in Melbourne, Victoria but I could not find any proof of this. These postmarks have been produced with many different variations, so it is possible to find postmarks which are different for the characteristics of the corners, the dimension of the letters, the spelling of the abbreviation of South Australia etc.

Austria: No publication mentions the possibility of the squared circle postmarks being used in Austria. However, I have received a copy of a card mailed in Wien on January 2nd, 1892 with a Wien squared circle postmark. I am searching for more information on this squared circle postmark and if it has been used in other Austrian cities.

Bahrain: These postmarks were used in Bahrain between 1885 and 1900, on stamps of British India. Although they have been used for around 15 years, they are not common, particularly on covers.









Bangladesh: These postmarks were widely used in British India including some towns which are now part of Bangladesh, such as the attached postmarks of Dacca and Feni. I intend to identify all these postmarks separately.

Barbados: As shown in the attached example, the postmark does not show anything else than the name of the island, the date and a letter, which can be A, B or C. These letters identify the part of the day in which they were posted.





Borneo (North): I have not found any mention of these postmarks in any catalogue or book I have checked. However, two types are known to exist, Sandakan and Tenom.

Brasil (Belem and Bage'): There much information isn't too about these postmarks and they are not mentioned in any catalogue. In any case, they were introduced in Belem, in Para', in the North of the country, around 1930 and were used for approximately 10 years, only for airmail correspondence and as an



alternative to a more common circular postmark. I have acquired postmarks dated from 1937 to 1947. They appear to be most common in 1941. This postmark may have been copied (in a larger size) from the neighbouring Suriname and British Guyana postmarks.

A second postmark has been identified recently and used in Bagé, Rio Grande do Sul, which is very far from Belem. All copies I have been able to see are dated 1942, at the time of a local fair. It appears that this postmark was probably produced only for philatelic purposes.

British Bechuanaland (now Botswana): The Post Offices of Mafeking and Vryburg were located in this territory. In 1895 the territory was incorporated in the Cape of Good Hope Province and the Mafeking postmark was modified with the CGH inscription. The Postmarks of these two locations with the B.B. (British Bechuanaland) inscription are quite rare.

THEN and NOW in Canadian Stamp Collecting

I was a serious stamp collector from 1970 to 1985, but then I gave it up to do my family history and genealogy. After publishing two large family histories, I was done with that and returned to stamp collecting in 2020.

Here are my observations on what has changed, and not changed, in Canadian stamp collecting. These are based on my former active involvement in the RA Stamp Club in Ottawa (Recreation Association - with membership open to all Federal employees), and my current active participation in the West Toronto Stamp Club and the Burlington Stamp Club.

My observations are described using THEN to refer to 1985, and NOW to refer to the 2020s, a span of 35 years. See if you agree with me, or maybe not! Your feedback is welcome (link above); the best responses will be published in a later edition of Philajournal.

The biggest change, of course, has been the widespread use of computers and the Internet. <u>Computers on their own</u> are used for keeping checklists of collection holdings and want lists; designing and printing custom album pages or exhibition pages; scanning images of stamps, blocks, covers, etc.; writing notes and articles; and preparing presentations.

<u>Computers used with the internet</u>, make all this possible: local and national club web pages; emailing of personal correspondence and club newsletters; making all those old journal issues and articles readily available; club and committee meetings and presentations via Zoom; online auctions, dealer web sales, and online sales through web sites like eBay and HipStamp.

These things have **not changed** much since 1985: stamps still have tagging; hingeless mounts are still used; Canadian stamps, especially the classics (up to the Admirals) are still the most favoured collectables.


Most Canadian collectors still don't belong to any local club; pricing is still based on condition, with NH premiums on the older issues; the percentage of us also collecting countries other than Canada/GB/Commonwealth/US seems to be the same, at about 40%; exhibiting is still going strong; most collectors are still men, with about 10 to 20% being women. Dealers continue to sell at stamp shows.

Another thing that has not changed is the list of active Canada-wide philatelic organizations. These five societies all started before 1985 and are still going strong:




Royal Philatelic Society of Canada (started 1887) British North America Philatelic Society (1943) Philatelic Specialists Society of Canada (1954) [Ed.: by invitation only] Postal History Society of Canada (1972) Canadian Aerophilatelic Society (1984)

These things have <u>changed</u> over time. THEN Canada produced about 40 new issues per year, NOW it is about 70. THEN it was common for addressed mail to use stamps, NOW most addressed mail does not carry a stamp! THEN the popular Canadian catalogue was Lyman's,



NOW it is the much better Unitrade Specialized Catalogue of Canadian Stamps. THEN there were many storefront dealers, NOW most dealers only sell online and at shows. THEN common mint stamps sold for use as postage went for about



90% of face value, NOW they sell for about 33% of face value. THEN more people collected GB, Commonwealth, USA, and postal meters, NOW

more people collect semi-official airmails, old cancels, permits, and Canadian postal

history. THEN a set of Scott catalogues occupied 4 inches of shelf space, NOW a set spans 28 inches on the shelf. THEN the Scott catalogue illustrations



were black and white, NOW they are in colour. THEN about 75% of stamps were issued in panes of 50, NOW about 60% of stamps are issued as booklet panes of smaller numbers, typically ten.

Canadian Bank Note was printing stamps THEN and still is NOW. The other main Canadian stamp printers were/are these:

NOW there are more varieties of modern Canadian stamps for those that collect them.

In summary, many things have remained the same, and many have changed. The saddest change is the huge decline in the use of postage stamps on mail, which means that most Canadians never see most of our current commemorative stamps.

One Hammer, Two Post Offices

The first circular date stamp used in York (Toronto) was a simple double ring with a diameter of 30 mm. with YORK between the rings at the top and U. C. at the bottom. This hand stamp was used between March 23, 1829, and April 29, 1830.





The use of this hand stamp is shown above on a single folded letter from YORK to ST. CATHARINES dated September 21, 1829, and addressed to W H Merritt Esq. [ed.: reduced to 90%]

Mr. Merritt was a businessman and politician in the Niagara region. He was born in the USA in a Loyalist family that resettled in Upper Canada. He fought in the War of 1812 and was held as a prisoner of war. Following his release, he returned to the Niagara Region where he became a businessman, an active supporter in the settlement of escaped slaves in St. Catherines, and a founder of the Weiland Canal.


On March 6, 1834, York was incorporated as the CITY OF TORONTO thereby making the YORK postal handstamps useless. The hammer was subsequently transferred to YORK in Haldimand County where it entered service on April 13, 1838, used until December 16, 1867.

The second cover, above, [Ed.: reduced to 70%] shows the Haldimand use of this handstamp on a December 7, 1863, cover to Wellington County. As a bonus, the 5-cent stamp used to pay the domestic letter rate is from position 37 as shown by the dot above the letter 'P' in POSTAGE. \rightarrow

Filip Konowal, a Ukrainian-Canadian Hero

Under the Gothic pile of Parliament's World War I Victory Tower, two soldiers who were awarded the Victoria Cross (VC) met. It was 1944 and they were there to sell Victory Bonds for World War II. They shook hands and then parted. One was a trim, dressed in khaki Major, named Paul Triquet, who had just recently won the VC in the battle near Ortona.

The other VC winner was a small man, by the name of Filip Konowal, whose bravery was all but forgotten by everyone, but himself. This is his story.

Filip was born in Kutkiw, Ukraine, on the March 25, 1887. He had joined the Russian Army for a short period as a hand-to-hand instructor, then seizing on an opportunity, he immigrated to Canada in 1913, in order, in his words, "to get some money". On July 12, 1915, he volunteered and was

accepted by the Governor Generals' Foot Guards; sailed to England in June 1916, and then was made an acting Corporal as a member of the Canadian Expeditionary Force (Royal Westminster Regiment).

In late 1916, Filip fought in the Battle of the Somme and the following year he served with distinction at the Battle of Vimy Ridge, where he led a squad of Japanese-Canadian soldiers to capture the important position known as "The Pimple". In August 1917 he fought bravely against the enemy at the Battle for Hill 70, for which he received his Victoria Cross, according to the 1917 London Gazette. It was reported that Filip managed to kill 52 members of the enemy forces. In two days, while in charge of a section in attack, he mopped up cellars, craters & machine gun emplacements. Two days later, Filip was badly wounded; a German bullet marked his face for life. For these heroic efforts, he received the Victoria Cross. It was personally pinned on him by King George V. In pinning Filip with the VC, the King said: "*Your exploits are one of the most daring and heroic in the history of my army. For this, accept my thanks.*"

After the War, life was not easy on the civilian street. On July 20, 1919, Filip killed a man in Hull Quebec, who was assaulting a friend of his. He was found not guilty by "reasons of insanity," and spent nine years in asylum confinement. He was released in 1928, being homeless and destitute.

However, the Sergeant-at-Arms at the House of Commons noticed Filip and got him a job as a Junior caretaker on Parliament Hill. Filip worked seven days a

week for \$4 per day, mopping floors, and washing dishes. One day, Prime Minister Mackenzie King spotted him washing floors and wearing a VC ribbon; Filip was reassigned to be the custodian of Room No.16, the Prime Minister's Office; a post he held until his death on June 3, 1959. He was buried with full military honours at Notre Dame Cemetery in Ottawa, where in March 1987, his wife Juliette joined him.

In an interview with the Ottawa Citizen in 1956, he was quoted as saying about his heroics at Hill 70. "I was so fed up standing in the trench with water up to my waist, that I said to hell with it and attacked the Germans. My Captain tried to shoot me because he thought I was deserting."

A little trivia about Filip Konowal's life follows: In addition to his salary of \$4 per day as a janitor, he drew a monthly wartime bonus of \$18.40 and a \$15 War Pension (non-taxable). Out of his \$1,880.80 per year income, in 1944 Filip paid \$100 for War Bonds, & \$230 for income taxes. Our Ukrainian-Canadian hero, Filip Konowal, was grateful that Canada had adopted him; he said on one occasion, "SHE FIXES ME FINE".

There are several plaques and historical markers erected in Filip's honour throughout Canada and Europe, including a sculpture in his village in Ukraine. The most recent plaque was just unveiled in his honour by the Ukrainian War Veterans Association of Canada on December 2, 2023, at the Bloor West Village in Toronto.




