Philajournal: Au revoir/ Goodbye. You will be missed

By now, most of you are aware that *Philajournal* will also stop producing new issues after the Winter 2024 issue due to GTAPA's closing down.

This decision has been inevitable due to the shortage of resources and volunteers. Still, it saddens many of us who have gotten used to reading the Philajournal for many years.

The North York Philatelic Society has supported the *Philajournal* these last two years. You may remember that our Club had been struggling for a few years already, starting around 2015, due to the lack of volunteers and new members. Unfortunately, due to the lack of volunteers, nothing was organized in advance at the Club, and members who were still loyal to the Club never knew what to expect at one of the NYPS meetings, which in some cases ended up even being cancelled due to no attendance. Then COVID came, and the Club was unable to organize virtual meetings. This forced the Club to close down indefinitely.


At the end of 2022, only the determination of a few of us to relaunch a stamp club in a vital area of the city allowed us to reopen the Club, which, however, could count only a handful of old members who were still interested in coming back. To succeed in relaunching the Club, we needed to give our members a clear vision of what to expect at each meeting and project an image of innovation and dynamism that the old club lacked.

The first twelve months to relaunch the Club were very successful, with membership ascending from a dozen to over 50 members, but it demanded a lot of hard work and communication. And that is where the *Philajournal* played a crucial role in communicating with the stamp collectors' base all over the region and reached by the *Philajournal*. We dedicated a lot of time to producing articles and ads which, in each issue of the *Philajournal*, would present, step by step, the initiatives that our club had taken for a proper relaunch. It is difficult to tell how many new members were acquired through the *Philajournal*. Still, considering that we now have members from all over the GTA, we can say that several new members were acquired through the *Philajournal* publicity.

Next year, we will be forced to develop innovative strategies to attract new members, which could be costly and challenging to implement.

As you can understand, losing *Philajournal* will not only mean losing a publication that we liked to read, but it will also mean losing a tool that has helped our club thrive and rebirth after a long period of deterioration.

On a more personal note, I will also miss *Philajournal* for what it has meant to me as a writer of some of the magazine's articles. I have written around 50 articles for the journal in about ten years. It all started with my desire to share with others some features of my stamp collection and write an odd article about some unusual pieces from my collection.



Suddenly, I got a *PhilaJournal Writers Prize* 2014 trophy for the best article of the year, thanks to the generosity of the late Michael Madesker, who donated two of these trophies to the *Philajournal*. It was a turning point; I felt I had to return the favour to *Philajournal* by committing to an article in most of its issues. So, gradually, my collection of articles grew significantly.

Before the website is dismantled, I hope to copy all the issues in which one of my articles is included and keep them as a memory of my work with the *Philajournal* editors over the years.


I cannot close the article without

thanking Tom Malicki for being the dedicated Editor of the magazine in these last few years. I will not go through *Philajournal's* achievements over the years, which included receiving prizes from abroad; Tom, I can only say "thank you" from all of us. We appreciate your volunteering so many hours to deliver an outstanding magazine for a few years. You know that I and many others would like the magazine to continue. Until now, I have been unable to come up with any positive idea to keep the *Philajournal* alive, but if I do, you will be the first to know. And if any of my readers have innovative ideas, please call me.

[Ed.: Unfortunately, the award process was not recorded, and it "fell through the cracks," never to be repeated.]






H.L. Woodman – Cachet Maker

"Woody" was the founding President of the Valley Stamp Club in Nova Scotia. As an amateur artist, he started drawing cachets for new Canadian stamps. As a scout leader, he wrote the Stamp Corner column for the *Canadian Boy,* a scouting magazine. So, it was only natural that he developed many cachets on the scouting theme and other topics.



This cover was created to recognize Boy Scout Week in February 1949. He often selected a cancel related to the topic. In this case, he sent the cover out from his Kentville, NS, home to Scout Lake, Saskatchewan, for cancellation on February 21, 1949.





1957 was the 50th Anniversary of Scouting, with a Jubilee Jamboree held in England. Woody designed a cover for SOSSI on a yellow envelope.



It has the three stamps issued for the Jamboree and a special Jamboree First Day cancel from 1 August 1957 from Sutton, Coldfield, WKS, where the

Jamboree was held. Along the bottom, it has "H.L. Woodman—Canada—485." This number refers to Woody's SOSSI membership number.

Glossaries of Philatelic Terms

Here, we compare the features of seven glossaries of philatelic terms readily available on free websites, as listed at the end. The glossaries are compared in Table. Counts are given for three representative letters to show each glossary's approximate size and scope. For example, the table shows that the Stamp Smarter glossary has 67 entries under the letter P.

The top group is my favourite since colour illustrations clarify a term's meaning. The top three each have their advantages: Stamp Smarter defines the most terms, Wikipedia gives the most detail in each definition, and the Adminware glossary features Canadian illustrations.

The bottom group contains text-only definitions; the outstanding site is "AskPhil." [Ed.: Warning – the website is non-operational; do not attempt to access "askphil.org" directly. Instead, use the web.archive.org link at the bottom of this article. Their archive snapshots of the contents vary for all the letters.] For the letter S, it has about 850 entries in many languages. Most are things like *Saargebeit* (overprint for Saar), *Saint Christophe* (French for St. Kitts), and *SAR* (Syrian Arab Republic). [Ed.: to search for a word, go to the page of the letter your word starts with, use a keyboard shortcut **Ctrl F>**, and type the word in a search box at the upper right of the screen].

The entries for the letter S were examined more closely. Of all six smaller glossaries, 91 different terms are defined under the letter S. The AskPhil glossary has 67, more than Adminware, which came second at 42. At least six glossaries contained entries for *selvedge* (or *selvage*), *se-tenant*, *specimen*, *strip*, and *surcharge*. *Scoreline*, *show cover*, *stamp catalogue*, and *superb* are examples of rare terms with only one definition.

Surprisingly, however, the essential terms *short perf, slogan, stamp collecting, stamp-on-stamp*, and *sweatbox* are each defined in only two of the seven glossaries.

The Warwick & Warwick glossary has a few terms with a distinctly British character. One example is the definition for *Regional issues:* "…issued by Royal Mail for use in Scotland, Wales or Northern Ireland. Separate issues were also made for Guernsey and Jersey to 1969 and until 1973 for the Isle of Man." Another one is *Tongs:* "The American philatelic term for metal tweezers which are used to handle stamps safely and easily."

This January 2022 PowerPoint uses a second title, "Medical Groundbreakers: Concept to Design."

Jean Wang is the only philatelist currently on the Canada Post Stamp Advisory Committee, and this set of five stamps was proposed by Jean Wang and produced by Canada Post. The video shows the many steps in the design process, the role of the chosen printer in all the redesigns, and the interaction between the Canada Post manager for this issue and the Stamp Advisory Committee. You do not need to be a member of the American Topical Association to watch this video. Enjoy.


Unusual Stamps, one last time

Between the Spring 2006 and Summer 2021 issues of *PhilaJournal*, I wrote 37 articles on Unusual Stamps. The ideas came from various sources. Some were items I owned, readers of PhilaJournal suggested some and the rest were Googled. Although I have not written any article on this topic for over three years, I thought I would take one more stab at it for this final issue.

So, back to Google, I went, and among other things that fit the bill, I found two issues that I will use. Both are items from Austria, which has issued several unusual stamps. These are also proper for the upcoming cold season.

On November 12, 2021, Austria issued a €4.30 (euro) self-adhesive postage stamp shaped like a mitten. Although the stamp's size makes

it too small to wear and warm the fingers, it is made from a cotton and polyester blend. The ink for the design and lettering was applied using heat and pressure. Since the materials used to produce these stamps shrink with heat, the substrate was preheated to 220 degrees(°C) before printing.



1830 "Cash Letter" from Perth to Toronto

Here is an outer wrapper (partial scan) for the "Cash Letter" sent by the License Inspector, District of Bathurst, Anthony Leslie, to H.M. Receiver General John H Dunn of Toronto.

John Henry Dunn (1792 – April 21, 1854) was a public official and businessman in Upper Canada. Born on Saint Helena to English parents, he came to Upper Canada as a young man to take up the position of Receiver General for Upper Canada, which he held from 1820 to 1841. Upon the creation of the Province of Canada in 1841, he was elected to the






Legislative Assembly of the Province of Canada, representing Toronto from 1841 to 1844. He also served nearly three years as Receiver General of the new province. He resigned as the Receiver General in 1843.

To learn more about this topic, check out the 16-page exhibit "Canada—1st Period Money Letters," which also covers different postage rates. It is from the Canadian Philatelic Society of Great Britain (CPS of GB).

The wrapper is tied with a "Perth" black double-split ring postmark. The postal employee inserted a manuscript date of "Jan.7, 1830," as this was required before the date and time were made part of the postmarks. The postage was "2N9 (2 Shillings 9 Pence)" for Single Sheet Rate 11d cy = 2/9d cy. Straight-line postmarks, prevalent in postal use in Canada

between 1824 and 1829, were slowly replaced with these postmarks.

One of my other collecting interests is watermarked paper. This letter has a distinct "CARRON" watermark, attributed to Thomas Burns at the <u>Carron Grove Paper Mill</u> in Great Britain.

Philatelic Priorities... Not So New

This might come as a shock to some of you. Can you think of something just as important in this hobby, not being a stamp, that could be of more value? Not being too far from the truth, I could assume most of today's collectors are what we could categorize as seasoned philatelists. You've been doing this hobby for some years, accumulated a lot of material, and likely have a favourite stamp or cover. You might also have parted from a fair amount of funds to acquire this item. Maybe you consider yourself a general collector, keeping anything that looks good (and this is great), or you could be a more specialized philatelist, narrowing your interest to one or two countries, a specific stamp issue, or even a topic. I met a collector who only collects "Hard Hats" on stamps. What a challenge!

Over the years, experience has taught us that there is one thing most of us do not have or wish we had, especially in a time of need. The answer is a library of philatelic literature. How often have you wished for access to an up-to-date set of catalogues or reference material to assist you in plating your Penny Blacks? Or trying to determine the registered domestic letter rate from Toronto to Rat Portage in 1880. How do you prioritize what philatelic literature best suits your collecting needs?

During my high school years, I was astonished to see that our school library contained many philatelic books: Boggs, Jarrett, Admiral Specialized and a good selection to satisfy a general worldwide collector. There are fewer public libraries today, and I find shelves nowhere near the material quality one could see in their former years. Fortunately, my local library in the City of Kawartha Lakes maintains three complete sets of Scott Catalogues. Even better, one may sign them out instead of using them internally for reference.

Observing many auction sites over the past year, I have noticed an increasing amount of quality literature up for sale, and the prices realized have been astonishingly high. This shows that there are still many true philatelists out there and that to get the right piece of literature you are searching for, a price is paid for its possession.

I highly recommend to everyone, however vast or minuscule your interest, that if you cannot find the research material you need, please get in touch with the Vincent Graves Greene Philatelic Research Foundation, located at 10 Summerhill Avenue in Toronto? Call 416-921-2073 or visit www.greenefoundation.ca. You will be amazed at how they can enrich your philatelic experience.

Going beyond your collection, aside from a sound library source, there's one more priceless resource we tend to overlook: other people. Finding a network of individuals who share similar interests to yours is irreplaceable. Canada is very fortunate to have a wide array of knowledgeable, experienced, and approachable collectors who are more than willing to give their time to help others. I'm sure you're probably saying, "Ya, but where do I find them?"



Get out to one of the many local, regional or national stamp shows. Ask around and let it be known you're searching for answers. I did this recently at the <u>BNAPEX 2024</u> in Kingston, Ontario. It was the British North America Philatelic Society (<u>BNAPS</u>) convention, exhibition, and bourse held from 23 to 25 August 2024. I was searching for answers to my questions on exhibiting tips and research leads. I wasn't prepared enough for the overwhelming responses I received from numerous individuals. Henceforth, I made many new acquaintances who continue to this day, helping me build on my philatelic ideas and knowledge. Pictures are from BNAPEX in Kingstone.



This hobby has a lot more going for it other than that tiny piece of paper we stick in a book. It's about building upon knowledge, creating friendships, and not being afraid to explore new things. This hobby has no end!

We have learned that the GTAPA era is ending as an Alliance of several stamp clubs and its award-winning *PhilaJournal*. To GTAPA and everyone who has ever played a part in its existence, I would like to say "Thank you!" Thank you for the many friendships created, the knowledge learned, and the many individuals who gave their time to make the "Alliance" successful.

Continuous improvements in NYPS online auctions

Our monthly online auctions continue to be very successful. New potential buyers are interested, and our sellers offer good, diversified material.

However, this has caused an issue, as the live auctions have become too long and can last two hours or more. We have, therefore, decided to implement a few new changes gradually.

- 1. Limit our live online auction lots to 250.
- 2. Introduced a second auction reserved only for Canadian stamps and covers. This auction occurs every three months.
- 3. Introduced a new section identified as a "silent auction." After we reach 250 lots for live online Zoom sale, we close that catalogue and open a second catalogue where the sellers load an equivalent number of silent auction lots. These lots are not auctioned, but the buyers send in proxies (via email), which are processed after the end of the Zoom auction. The next day, we send a report to sellers and buyers with all the lots sold in the live and silent auction.

This change allows us to manage up to 500 lots per auction, expand our range of sellers, and offer more to better satisfy our members' interests.

Let's Talk About Squared Circle Postmarks - Part 4.

(A worldwide review of this type of postmark – a four-part article in *PhilaJournal* #87 to #90)

San Marino: Not to confuse with the Italian squared circle postmark of the town of San Marino in the Vicenza province. San Marino has not introduced the squared circle postmarks, but there have been cases where the correspondence has been cancelled in transit or for the first time in Italian towns near the border. In the attached picture, the card has been cancelled in San Marino on the right with a regular circular postmark (not shown), but it was stamped upon arrival in Rimini. The postmark has been placed on top of the Minerva image and to the right side. The following picture shows a stamp that had not been cancelled in San Marino but only in transit with an Italian squared circle postmark.





Shanghai (China): This postmark is used only in Shanghai for registered mail. It is rare, and information on it is pretty scarce. →

Singapore: I am unaware of any British square circle postmarks used in Singapore. However, as mentioned in the Dutch Indies section, the Dutch post office in Singapore used a squared circle

postmark.

Four different ones are on this card.









Somalia - Italian (Brava, Giuba, Mogadiscio (shown above) plus Benadir and Merca (not shown)): Used briefly between 1903 and 1906 in the 5 locations listed. They are catalogued in Gaggero as very rare (on letter) with a maximum of 10 points. In addition, there is another postmark (not shown) titled *Direttore dei servizi postali Mogadiscio* in purple, with no date. Rare.



Spain (Madrid): Used only in Madrid around 1900, I am only aware of postmarks used between 1892 and 1909. I have also seen a copy of a half postmark (see picture), but until now, I have yet to find out if it is a variant or simply the effect of a malfunction.

South Africa - Orange Free State: In Orange Free State, modified squared circle postmarks (octagonal) have been used with the province name shortened to OVS and later to ORC (Orange River Colony). During the Anglo-Boer war, some postmarks were used in locations different from those initially planned. The square circle postmarks were used in Kuruman and Rustenburg. They are extremely rare. There are forgeries of this type of postmark.



South Africa – Transvaal: The first one was used at the Johannesburg Stock Exchange in 1892 with the Z.A.R. inscription at the bottom.

They were used in some post offices with different dimensions and designs. In some cases, the Z.A.R. inscription was removed from the foot and continued to be used in the early 1900's. Here is the list of the known postmarks: Amsterdam, Boksburg, Elandshoek, Ermelo, Hoenertsburg, Heidelberg, Johannesburg, Johannesburg, Johannesburg Beurs, Kaapsehoop, Lichtenburg,



Lydenburg, Middelburg, M. Wesselstroem, Ottoshoop, Pretoria, Rustenburg, Smitsdorp, Standerton, Utrecht, Carolina, Wolmaranstad

Sudan: During the war against the Mahdi forces, the British troops set up camps around Wadi Halfa and the Nile. Of the three known Military Post Offices, only one (office number 11—Suakin) used the squared circle postmark on Indian stamps to stamp the correspondence mailed by the British and Indian troops.









Suriname: In this other Dutch colony, they introduced the squared circle postmarks, which were never introduced in Holland. They have been used extensively, but unfortunately, no publication lists the exact locations where these postmarks have been used. The official information at the moment identifies only the offices of Paramaribo (4 types), Sarama, Nickerie (3 types), Coronie (2 types) and Beneden Commewijne. There are undoubtedly other ones, particularly for the smallest locations, which are rare items. I am also adding a picture of a Para postmark (apparently) used on the Para River.

Swaziland: Only three offices used these postmarks: Embadaan, Darkton, and Bremersdorp (it was Manzini), identifying the country as Swaziel or Z.A.R. They also exist in blue. →



Tunisia (Italian Offices. Tunisi, La Goletta and Susa): Postmark used in Tunis between 1894 and 1895. It was used also in La Goletta in 1893-96 and Susa in 1897. Rare. From 8

points (Tunisi) to 10 points (the other two) on the catalogue "Il Nuovo Gaggero."

Turkey (Smirne, Italian office): From 1908 to 1909, the postmark was used only in the Smirne (now Izmir) post office. →

Zanzibar: Postmarks were used on Indian stamps (on international correspondence in arrival, forwarded through Aden) around 1890 and on Zanzibar stamps from 1898 to 1930. There is a Zanzibar postmark plus four local postmarks of Chwaka, Mkoan, and Mkokotonie Weti, with the inscriptions of Zanzibar or Pemba at the bottom. The Zanzibar postmark also exists of the Indian type, while the others are of the British kind.
